By: Law No. 732.

Whereas it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillemburg to borrow the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation and the sums required to be raised in the current year for High and public Schools purposes until the Taxes are collected,

And whereas the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under section 319 of Chapter 192 of the R. S. of Ontario

Be it Therefore enacted as a By: Law, by the said Council as follows.

I That the Head and the Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from the Bank of Nova Scotia on the note of the Corporation or by way of overdraft, or otherwise, the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, (\$5000.00) until such time as the Taxes levied or to be levied, shall be collected and applied to repay such advance,

2 That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed upon between the Head and the Treasurer and the Bank,

3 That the Head and the Treasurer may draw make and deliver promissory notes, Bills or other securities and documents as may be agreed on to secure the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By: Law.

4 That the Head and the Treasurer may enter into an agreement with the said Bank, sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and the Treasurer, providing for the borrowing of the said sum by the Corporation, and the repayment of the same on or before the last business day of the current year, together with all other terms relating to such borrowing and repayment as the Head and Treasurer may deem necessary,

## By Law No. 733.

Whereas the Taxes levied on to be levied for the current expenditure of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury for the year 1925 have not been collected, and there is on will be payable in respect of such Taxes a sum sufficient to authorize the borrowing hereinafter provided for;

And whereas the Council of the said Corporation deems it necessary to borrow the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, to meet the now current expenditure of the said Corporation and it is expedient to authorize the borrowing of the said sum upon the credit of the Corporation,

And whereas it appears by the estimates for the current year that there will be required to pay the ordinary current expenditure of the Municipality the sum of \$50000,

And whereas the ordinary expenditure of the Corporation for the year immediately preceding was

And whereas the amount now borrowed and all other borrowings made by the Corporation this year do not amount to more than 80% of the ordinary current expenditure of the Corporation for the year immediately preceding as shown by the amount in the preceding paragraph,

And whereas no sum has been borrowed on is now outstanding in respect of any borrowing to meet the current expenditure of the Corporation for the present year except Ten Thousand Dollars,

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury as follows.

1. The Head on acting head for the time being with the Treasurer of the said Corporation is hereby authorized to borrow in one or more sums, as the same may be required, from the Standard Bank of Canada, hereinafter called the Bank an amount not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$50000 being the amount which the Council deems necessary to meet the now current expenditure of the said Corporation until such time as the Taxes levied on to be levied thereon can be collected.

2. The Head on acting head of the said Corporation with the Treasurer aforesaid shall have authority to pay or allow the said Bank interest on the said sums so borrowed at such rate or rates as may be from time to time agreed upon, which interest may be payable in advance and may be deducted from the amounts so borrowed.

3 Any promissory note or notes, covenants or agreements which may be required by the said Bank may be sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the Corporation by the Reeve and Treasurer thereof and duly executed and delivered to the said Bank which said note or notes, covenants or agreements shall obligate the Corporation to repay the said sums to be borrowed together with interest thereon as aforesaid at such times as may be agreed upon.

4 If the amounts to be paid by virtue of any such note or notes covenants or agreements, shall not have been fully paid at maturity any further note or notes covenants or agreements may be executed as aforesaid on behalf of the Corporation and delivered to the Bank by way of renewal, of the said obligations in whole or in part,

5 The Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to apply so much of the said Taxes so to be collected as may be necessary in payment of the obligations of the Corporation created as aforesaid,
