3 That a promissory note or notes covenant or agreement, sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the Corporation by the Reeve and Treasurer be duly executed and given to the said Bank as aforesaid as security for the repayment of the amount borrowed, with interest thereon as aforesaid,

4 That the Standard Bank of Canada be and is hereby appointed Banker of the said Corporation and is hereby authorized to pay and honor all cheques and orders for the payment of money made, signed or drawn in the name of the said Corporation by the Reeve and Treasurer, and further to accept for deposit to the credit of the Corporation all cheques, drafts, notes, bills and other negotiable instruments endorsed in the name of the said Corporation by Reeve and Treasurer,

## By-Law, No. 756.

Whereas it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillemburg to borrow the sum of Five Thousand dollars to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation for the year until the Taxes are paid,

And whereas the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and outstanding (if any) for the purpose aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under section 319. The Consolidated Municipal Act, 1922. being 12-13 George V. Chap. 72. Ontario, and Amending Acts,

Be it therefore enacted as a By-Law, by the said Council as follows.

- I. That the Head and the Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from the Bank of Nova Scotia on the note of the Corporation, or by way of overdraft, or otherwise the sum of Five Thousand Dollars. (\$5000.00) until such time as the Taxes levied or to be levied, shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.
- 2 That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed upon between the Head and the Treasurer and the Bank.
- 3 That the Head and the Treasurer may draw make and deliver promissory notes, bills or other securities and documents as may be agreed on, to secure the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-Law.
- 4 That the Head and the Treasurer may enter into an agreement with the said Bank, sealed with the corporate seal, and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and the Treasurer, providing for the borrowing of the said sum by the Corporation, and the repayment of the same on or before the last business day of the current year, together with all other terms relating to such borrowing and repayment as the said Head and Treasurer deem necessary,

## By-Law. No. 757.

A. By-Law regulating in all registered surveys in The portion of the Township of North Swillimbury, where in the discretion of the local Board of Health it may be deemed expedient,

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of The Township of North Swillimbury enacts as follows,

That every householder in a registered survey, or in any other portion of the Township the local Board of Health may deem expedient, shall provide a suitable box or barrel ~~or box~~ for Garbage, the weight of each barrel or box not to exceed in weight Seventy Five Pounds, and Cans, Bottles, & etc. be placed in separate receptacles from other Garbage, and all receptacles shall be tightly covered and shall at the time appointed be placed on the line of public street or alley for collection,

The Council of the Corporation shall enter into a contract with some person or persons, to collect the Garbage, the said parties to dispose of the Garbage to the satisfaction of the local board of Health, and collected twice every week, on the days and times as directed by the Council,

Any person or persons who refuses or contravenes any section of this By-Law, shall be liable on convictions before a justice of the peace or magistrate to a fine of not less than Five Dollars.

That all tenders for the collecting and disposal of Garbage shall be at the discretion of the Council of the Township, and tenders may be called for such sections of the Township as the Council may deem necessary.

All other By-Laws of the Township any way conflicting with this By-Law be and are hereby repealed.

The Special Tax for oiling the roads from Keswick to the 4<sup>th</sup> Concession the sum of \$1940.40 being at the rate of 5 mills on the Dollar.

For oiling roads from the 4<sup>th</sup> Con to Jacksons Point the sum of \$664.<sup>89</sup> being at the rate of 3<sup>7</sup>/<sub>10</sub> mills on the Dollar.

For street lighting in Keswick the sum of \$142.<sup>00</sup> being at the rate of 2 mills on the Dollar.
