By. Law No. 810.

A By. Law appointing a road superintendent for the Township of North Gwillimbury, in the County of York.

Whereas it is desirable that the laying out and supervision of all work and expenditure upon improvement and maintenance of roads within the exclusive jurisdiction of this Township, should be under the supervision of a road superintendent; acting under the direction of the Council,

And whereas it is the desire of this Council to take advantage of the Highway Improvement Act; and to receive the Government grant as provided in sections 43 and 45 of the said Act.

Be it therefore enacted by The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury and it is hereby enacted,

I That Carson Pollock, Keswick, is appointed Road superintendent in the said Township, to act as aforesaid in accordance with the provisions of the said section 45 of the said Act from the first day of January 1929 and during the pleasure of the said Council,

2 That the said Superintendent shall be paid at the rate of \$4.50 per day for such time as he may be employed.

3 That it shall be the duty of the superintendent to lay out and supervise all work and expenditure on roads within the exclusive jurisdiction of the Township Council, and to conform to such general regulations as the department of Public Highways may prescribe,

4 That all By. Laws or parts thereof and all or any resolutions of said Council contrary thereto or inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed,

5 That a certified copy of this By. Law be forwarded without delay to the deputy Minister, department of Public Highways, Toronto.

By-Law No. 811.

A By-Law to provide for expenditure on roads in
The Township of North Guillemburg during 1929.

Whereas the regulations of the department of public
Highways of Ontario require that the expenditures on Township
Roads under the Highway improvement Act and amendments
thereto shall be provided for annually by Townships By-Law.

Therefore the Council of the Municipal Corporation of
North Guillemburg enacts as follows.

1 The sum of \$16,300.00 is hereby appropriated from monies
raised by Levies for expenditure upon construction and
maintenance on roads in said Township during the
year 1929 as follows,

Road Construction	\$5000.00
Bridge	2000.00
Machinery	1500.00
Superintendence	800.00
Maintenance & repair	7000.00
Total,	16,300.00.

2 The said monies shall be expended under the
direction of the duly appointed road superintendent.

3 All work on which the said monies shall be expended
shall be performed in accordance with the last revised
regulations respecting Township roads issued by the
Department of public Highways of Ontario,

4 That the Clerk shall transmit a certified copy of
this By-Law to the deputy Minister, Department of
Public Highways Ontario, within thirty days after
the passing thereof.

By Law No. 812.

To authorize the borrowing of money to meet current ordinary expenditure for the year, whereas it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Township of North Guilford to borrow the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars. to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation and the same required to be raised in the current year for High and public school purposes until the Taxes are collected,

And whereas the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under the section 319. of The consolidated Municipal Act, 1922, being 12.13, George V. Chapter 72 (Ontario) and amending Acts,

Be it therefore enacted as a By. Law by the said Council as follows,

- I That the Head and the Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from the Bank of Nova Scotia on the note of the Corporation on by way of overdraft, or otherwise the sum of \$10,000.00 until such time as the Taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance,
- 2 That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and the Treasurer and the Bank,
- 3 That the Head and Treasurer may draw, make and deliver promissory notes, bills or other securities and documents as may be agreed on, to secure the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By. Law.
- 4 That the Head and the Treasurer may enter into an agreement with the said Bank, sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and the Treasurer, providing for the borrowing of the said sum by the said Corporation, and the repayment of the same on or before the last business day of the current year together with all other terms relating to such borrowing and repayment, as the Head and Treasurer may deem necessary.

And whereas the amount (if any) heretofore borrowed and outstanding for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed 90 per cent of the ordinary expenditure of the said Municipality for the next preceding year together with the amount required to be raised for High and public school purposes for the current year,

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of North Gwillimbury as follows,

1 That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized in the manner and subject to the conditions herein mentioned to borrow from the Canadian Bank of Commerce the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars, required to meet the current ordinary expenditures of the Corporation and the sums required to be raised for High and public school purposes for the current year until the Taxes are collected,

2 That a promissory note or notes sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the Corporation by the Head and Treasurer thereof for the amount of said loan and interest thereon at six per cent per annum and repayable on demand be duly executed and given to the said Bank as security for the repayment of the amount borrowed with interest thereon as aforesaid,

A By-Law of the Township of North Swillimbury for prohibiting the throwing placing or depositing on any Highway in this Municipality of any Rubbish, dirt, filth, paper & etc. in the said Municipality.

Whereas the Councils of the different Municipalities are empowered by the Revised Statutes of Ontario 1927, Chapter 233, Section 502 Sub-Sec. 4, to pass By-Laws preventing the placing or depositing of any Rubbish and etc. on any Highway in the Municipality.

That all persons are hereby prohibited from throwing or depositing on any Highway or bridge of dirt, filth, glass, paper, or other rubbish or refuse or the carcass of any animal in this Municipality.

III. That all By-Laws or parts of By-Laws inconsistent with this By-Law be and are hereby repealed.

BY-LAW NO. **823**
—OF—
THE TOWNSHIP OF
NORTH GWILLIMBURY

For the closing up of a portion of Osbourn Street and the given road extending from Osbourn Street Easterly (to what is known as Kay's Corner) Northerly from this corner to A. C. Mathew's property and Easterly therefrom to connect with what is known as the Varney Road, and is hereinafter more particularly described, and for laying out and establishing a highway from the corner of Osbourn and Coxwell streets, North and Easterly, parallel with the right of way of the Toronto Transportation Railway to a point connecting with what is known as the Varney road, and to be known as Osbourn Ave., and is hereinafter more particularly described, and authorizing the Reeve and Clerk to sign a conveyance to A. C. Mathews and Mrs. Wilmot Mathews, and to attach the notarial seal to the said conveyance.

WHEREAS the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury deems it expedient and in the interest of the Township to close up that portion of Osbourn street and the allowance for road known as the Given road, and to open up a road running parallel with the Toronto Transportation right of way and to convey to A. C. Mathews and Mrs. Wilmot Mathews the stopped up highway in consideration of the transfer to the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury of the New Highway to be established, and to be known as Osbourn Ave.;

AND WHEREAS notice of the passing of this By-Law has been published in the Newmarket Era, a paper published in the Town of Newmarket, in the County of York, on the 8th, 15th, 22nd and 29th days of November, 1929;

AND WHEREAS notice of the passing of the said By-Law has been posted up for at least one month in six of the most public places in the immediate neighborhood of the Highway to be closed and diverted;

THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows:—

1. Description of Road to be closed:

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the Township of North Gwillimbury, in the County of York, being composed of part of lot number 23 in the second concession of the said township and which said parcel is more particularly described as follows:

COMMENCING at a point in the westerly limit of Osbourn Avenue where it is intersected by the northerly limit of Coxwell Street; Thence easterly along the line of the northerly limit of Coxwell Street, forty-two feet five inches (42' 5") to an iron pipe; Thence North 35 degrees 13 minutes East thirty feet seven inches (30' 7") to a stake in the easterly limit of Osbourn Avenue; Thence northerly along the easterly limit of Osbourn Avenue one hundred and twenty-nine feet (129') to the southerly limit of a Given Road running easterly; Thence North 74 degrees 31 minutes East along the southerly limit of said Given Road one hundred and fifty-six feet (156') to an iron pipe; Thence North 35 degrees 13 minutes East fifty-two feet nine inches (52' 9") to an iron pipe in the northerly limit of said Given Road; Thence South 74 degrees 31 minutes

West along the northerly limit of said Given Road twelve feet five inches (12' 5") to the easterly limit of a Given Road running northerly; Thence North 23 minutes 30 seconds West along the easterly limit of said Given Road five hundred and thirty-six feet five inches (536' 5") to an angle in said road; Thence North 42 degrees 2 minutes 30 seconds East along the south-easterly limit of said Given Road two hundred and sixty-six feet six and three quarter inches (266' 6 3/4") to an angle in said road; Thence North 74 degrees East along the southerly limit of said Given Road six hundred and fifty-one feet eight inches (651' 8") to a stake at a distance of ninety-nine feet (99') measured north-westerly at right angles from the centre line of the Toronto Transportation Commission right of way; Thence North 54 degrees East ninety-seven feet ten inches (97' 10") to the intersection with the northerly limit of said Given Road and the westerly limit of the Varney Road; Thence South 74 degrees West along the northerly limit of said Given Road seven hundred and fifty-one feet (751') more or less to an angle in the northerly limit of said Given Road; Thence South 42 degrees 2 minutes 30 seconds West along the north-westerly limit of said Given Road two hundred and eighty-eight feet (288') more or less to an angle in said Given Road; Thence South 28 minutes 30 seconds East along the westerly limit of said Given Road five hundred and sixty feet (560') more or less to the northerly limit of a Given Road running westerly; Thence South 74 degrees 31 minutes West along the northerly limit of said Given Road two hundred and sixteen feet two inches (216' 2") to the westerly limit of said Osbourn Avenue; Thence southerly along the westerly limit of said Osbourn Avenue one hundred and eighty feet six inches (180' 6") to the place of beginning.
