By Law No 827.

A by Law appointing a road superintendent for the Township of North Gwillimbury in the County of York.

Whereas it is desirable that the laying out and supervision of all work and expenditure upon improvement and maintenance of roads within the exclusive jurisdiction of this township, shall be under the supervision of a road superintendent, acting under the direction of this council.

And whereas it is the desire of this Council to take advantage of the Highway Improvement Act, and to receive the Government Grant as provided in Section 43 and 45 of the said Act.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Said Township of North Gwillimbury and it is hereby enacted:

I) That John Draper of Keswick P. Q. is appointed road superintendent in the said Township to act as aforesaid in accordance with the provisions of the said section 45 of the said act from the 1st of January 1930, and during the pleasure of the said Council.

II) That the said Superintendent shall be paid at the rate of \$4.00 per day for such time as he may be employed.

III) That it shall be the duty of the superintendent to lay out and supervise all work and expenditure on roads within the exclusive jurisdiction of the Township Council and to conform to such general regulations as the Department of Public Highways may prescribe.

IV) That all By-Laws or parts thereof and all or any resolutions of said Council contrary hereto or inconsistent herewith, be the same are hereby repealed.

V) That a certified copy of this By-Law be forwarded by the Clerk without delay to the Deputy Minister, Department of Public Highways.

By Law No 830.

A By Law to authorize the Head and Treasurer of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury to borrow certain sums to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation, and the sums required to be raised in the current year for High and Public School purposes.

whereas the Council of the said Municipality deems the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars necessary to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation and the sums required to be raised in the current year for High and Public School purposes until the taxes are collected, and it is expedient, subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, to authorize the Head and Treasurer to borrow the said sum;

And whereas the ordinary expenditure of the said Municipality for the next preceding year amounted to Fifty-five thousand Dollars;

And whereas the amount (if any) heretofore borrowed and outstanding for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed 90 per cent of the ordinary expenditure of the said municipality for the next preceding year together with the amount required to be raised for High and Public School purposes for the current year;

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury

as follows:-

1st. That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized, in the manner and subject to the conditions herein mentioned, to borrow from the Canadian Bank of Commerce the sum of Ten Thousand dollars required to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation and the sums required to be raised for High and Public School purposes for the current year, until the taxes are ~~paid~~ collected.

2nd. That a promissory note or notes, sealed with the Corporation seal and signed on behalf of the Corporation by the Head and Treasurer thereof, for the amount of the said loan and interest thereon at the rate of 6 per cent per annum, and payable on demand, be duly executed and given to the said Bank as security for the repayment of the amount borrowed with interest thereon as aforesaid.

By-Law No. 831.

To Authorize the Borrowing of Money to Meet Current Ordinary Expenditure for the Year.

Whereas it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury to borrow the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation and the sums required to be raised in the current year for High and Public School purposes until the taxes are collected.

And Whereas the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Section 319 of the Consolidated Municipal Act, 1922, being 12-13 George V, Chapter 72 (Ontario) and Amending Acts.

Be it therefore Enacted as a By-Law by the said Council as follows:

1. That the Head and the Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from the Bank of Nova Scotia on the note of the Corporation, or by way of overdraft, or otherwise, the sum of Ten Thousand dollars \$10,000.00 until such time as the taxes levied, or to be levied, shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.
2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and the Treasurer and the Bank.
3. That the Head and the Treasurer may draw, make and deliver promissory notes, Bills or other securities and documents as may be agreed on, to secure the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-Law.
4. That the Head and the Treasurer may enter into an agreement with the said Bank, sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and the Treasurer, providing for the borrowing of the said sum by the said Corporation, and the repayment of the same on or before the last business day of the current year, together with all other terms relating to such borrowing and repayment as the said Head and Treasurer may deem necessary.

3. All work on which the said monies shall be expended shall be performed in accordance with the last revised regulations respecting township roads issued by the Department of Public Highways of Ontario.
4. The Clerk shall transmit a certified copy of this by Law to the Deputy Minister, Department of Public Highways of Ontario, within thirty days of the passing thereof.

Whereas the Council of the said Corporation deems the sum of Five Thousand Dollars necessary to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation and the sums required to be raised in the current year for High and public school purposes until the Taxes are collected, and it is expedient, subject to the conditions hereinafter contained to authorize the Head and Treasurer to borrow the said sum.

And whereas the amount required to be raised by the said Municipality for High and public school purposes for the current year is the sum of Five Thousand Dollars.

And whereas the amount (if any) heretofore borrowed and outstanding for the purpose aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed 90 per cent of the ordinary expenditure of the said Municipality for the next preceding year together with the amount required to be raised for High and public school purposes for the current year.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury as follows:

I. By Law No. 840.

By Law to provide for the borrowing of the sum of Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7000.00) by the issue and sale of Debentures for the purpose of enlarging the public school building in school section No. 6. of the said Township,

Whereas on or about the seventh day of October 1930. The school Board of School Section No. 6. of the Township of North Gwillimbury in the County of York, appealed to this Council to borrow the sum of Seven Thousand Dollars. (\$7000.00) by the issue and sale of Debentures for that amount for the purpose of enlarging the school building in the said section,

And whereas the proposal for the loan has been submitted to and sanctioned at a special meeting of the ratepayers of the said section called for that purpose,

And whereas this Council deems it expedient to grant the said application,

And whereas for the purpose aforesaid it is necessary to borrow, on the credit of this corporation, the said sum of Seven Thousand Dollars. (\$7000.<sup>00</sup>) and to issue debentures of this Corporation forwith bearing interest at the rate of Five and one half per cent per annum, which is the amount of the debt intended to be created by this By-Law,

And whereas the amount of the whole ratable property of the Municipality according to the last revised assessment Roll thereof being the Roll for 1930. is the sum of \$1835800.<sup>00</sup>

And whereas the present debenture debt of the said Corporation is \$32994.<sup>15</sup> and no part of the principal or interest is in arrears.

And whereas it is expedient to make the principal of the said debt repayable in seven annual instalments of such amounts that with the interest in respect of the debt payable annually, the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in each year shall be as nearly as possible the same.

And whereas it will be necessary to raise in each year during the period of seven years in which an instalment becomes due, the sum of \$1231.<sup>75</sup> to pay it when due as it becomes due,

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows,

That for the purpose aforesaid there shall be borrowed the sum of Seven Thousand Dollars by debentures issued by the said Township of North Gwillimbury thereon in sums of not less than One Hundred Dollars each, bearing interest at the rate of Five and one half per cent per annum, payable annually, which shall have Coupons attached thereto for payment of interest;

## Continuation of By-Law No. 840.

The debentures shall<sup>all</sup> bear the same date and shall be issued at one time and within two years after the passing of this By-Law, and may bear any date within such two years, and shall be payable in seven annual instalments of principal and interest during the period of seven years next after the date thereof, and the respective amounts of principal and interest payable in each year shall be as follows,

The debentures as to both principal and interest shall be expressed in Canadian Currency and shall be payable at the Canadian Bank of Commerce, Keswick, Ont.,

The Reeve of the Corporation shall sign and issue the said debentures and shall cause the same to be signed by the Treasurer of this Corporation, and the debentures shall be sealed with the seal of the Corporation,

The Coupons attached to the said debentures shall be signed by the Treasurer of the Corporation and his signature to them may be written, stamped, lithographed or engraved.

In each year during the seven years, the currency of the debentures in which an instalment is due of principal and interest becomes due the sum of \$1231.75 shall be raised annually by a special rate sufficient therefor over and above all other rates, upon the taxable property of public school supporters of the said school section Number 6 at the same time and in the same manner as other rates,

The debentures may contain any clause providing for the registration thereof authorized by statute relating to Municipal debentures in force at the time of the issue thereof,

This By-Law shall take effect on the day of the final passing thereof.

By Law No. 841.

A By-Law to authorize the purchase of the right of way of the Toronto Transportation Commission running through the Township of North Gwillimbury from the southerly limit of Lot Number 11 in the Third concession of the said Township to the easterly limit of Lot 20 in the Ninth Concession of the said Township, and the Gravel pit comprised of about four acres on Lot 23 in the second concession of the said Township, for the sum of Three Thousand Dollars, (\$3000<sup>00</sup>), being an extension of the Lake shore Road, as a local improvement under the provisions of the local improvement Act,

Whereas,

and others have petitioned the Council to purchase, as a local improvement, the land hereinafter described, for the purpose of opening and extending the Lake shore Road, and the Clerk has certified that the petition is sufficient, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the petitioners and in the manner hereinafter described

And whereas by revised statutes of Ontario 1924, chapter 235 and amending Acts, power is conferred on the Council of the Municipality to pass a By-Law, on petition of Ratepayers that such work be undertaken as a local improvement under the provisions of the local improvement Act,

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows:

And whereas the amount (if any) heretofore borrowed and outstanding for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed 90. per cent. of the ordinary expenditure of the said Municipality for the next preceding year together with the amount required to be raised for High and public school purposes for the current year.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of North Gwillimbury as follows,

That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized in the manner and subject to the conditions herein mentioned, to borrow from the Canadian Bank of Commerce the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars required to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation, and the sums required to be raised for High and public school purposes for the current year until the Taxes are collected.

That a promissory note or notes sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the Corporation by the Head and Treasurer thereof, for the amount of the said loan and interest thereon at the rate of six per cent per annum and repayable on demand be duly executed and given to the said Bank as security for the repayment of the amount borrowed with interest thereon as aforesaid.

## By-Law No. 844.

Whereas it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury to borrow the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation and the sums required to be raised in the current year for High and public school purposes until the Taxes are collected,

And the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid, and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under section 334 of the Revised Statutes of Ontario 1924.

1. That the Head and the Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from the Bank of Nova Scotia on the note of the Corporation or by way of overdraft or otherwise the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars, until such time as the Taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.

2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and the Treasurer and the Bank,

3. That the Head and the Treasurer may draw, make and deliver promissory notes bills or other securities and documents as may be agreed on, to secure the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-Law,

4. That the Head and the Treasurer may enter into an agreement with the said Bank sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and the Treasurer, providing for the borrowing of the said sum by the said Corporation, and the repayment of the same on or before the last business day of the current year, together with all other terms relating to such borrowing and repayment as the said Head and Treasurer may deem necessary,
