By Law No. 849.

A By. Law to authorize the Head and Treasurer of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury to borrow certain sums to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the corporation and the sums required to be raised in the current year for High and public school purposes.

Whereas the Council of the said Municipality deems the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars, necessary to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the corporation and the sums required to be raised in the current year for High and public school purposes until the Taxes are collected, and it is expedient, subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, to authorize the Head and Treasurer to borrow the said sum.

And whereas the ordinary expenditure of the said Municipality for the next preceding year amounted to Fifty Five Thousand Dollars.

And whereas the amount (if any) heretofore borrowed and outstanding, for the purpose aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed 90 percent of the ordinary expenditure of the said Municipality for the next preceding year together with the amount required to be raised for High and public school purposes for the current year.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury as follows.

That the Head and the Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized in the manner and subject to the conditions herein mentioned, to borrow from the Canadian Bank of Commerce the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars, required to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the corporation, and the sums required to be raised for High and public school purposes for the current year until the Taxes are collected.

That a promissory note or notes sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the Corporation by the Head and Treasurer thereof, for the amount of the said loan with interest thereon at the rate of 6 per cent per annum and repayable on demand be duly executed and given to the said Bank as security for the repayment of the amount borrowed with interest thereon as aforesaid.

By. Law No. 850

To authorize the borrowing of money to meet current ordinary expenditure for the year.

Whereas it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury to borrow the sum of Ten Thousand dollars to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation and the sums required to be raised in the current year for High and public school purposes until the Taxes are collected,

And whereas the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under section 334 of the Municipal Act being Chapter 233 of the Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1927.

I That the Head and the Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from the Bank of Nova Scotia on the note of the Corporation, or by way of over-draft, or otherwise the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10000⁰⁰) until such time as the taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance,

II That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and the Treasurer and the Bank,

III That the Head and the Treasurer may draw make and deliver promissory notes bills or other securities and documents as may be agreed on to secure the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By. Law,

IV That the Head and the Treasurer may enter into an agreement with the said Bank, sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said corporation by the Head and the Treasurer, providing for the borrowing of the said sum by the said Corporation and the repayment of the same on or before the last business day of the current year together with all other terms relating to such borrowing and repayment as the Head and Treasurer may deem necessary.

By. Law No petition the Legislature of the province of Ontario to pass permissive or enabling legislation to permit the Council of the Township of North Gwillimbury to pass a By. Law to purchase that part of the right of way of the Toronto Transportation Commission from the southerly limit of Lot 11, in the Third concession of the said Township to its intersection with the paved highway running north from the old village of Sutton through that part of the incorporated Village of Sutton known as Jacksons Point; a distance of approximately twelve miles, subject to the rights of the Hydro Electric power Commission for the province of Ontario, and also the gravel pit comprising about four acres on Lot 23, in the second concession of the Township of North Gwillimbury and to assess the cost on the area hereinafter defined and at the time or times hereinafter mentioned,

whereas the right of way of the Toronto transportation Commission runs from the intersection of the southerly limit of lot 11 in the Third concession of the Township of North Gwillimbury northerly and easterly to the paved highway running north from the old Village of Sutton known as Jacksons Point.

And whereas the Council of the Township of North Gwillimbury deem it expedient and in the interests of the said Township to purchase the said right of way and gravel pit above referred to from the Hydro Electric power commission for the province of Ontario, or the Corporation of the city of Toronto, or from any one who is the owner of the same for the price or sum of three thousand Dollars (\$3000.00) subject to the rights of the Hydro Electric Power Commission for the province of Ontario and to pay for the same by assessing the land lying between the said right of way and the shores of Lake Simcoe from the southerly limit of lot 12, in the Third concession of the said Township to the westerly limit of that part of the Village of Sutton known as Jacksons Point; for an amount sufficient to pay the amount of the cost of the said purchase of Right of way, including the cost of the special Act of the Legislature and any other costs incidental thereto, by the levy of a special rate on all the rateable property in the said area over and above all other rates of the said Township, and sufficient to pay the whole costs in the year 1931.

And whereas a large majority of the ratepayers within the area herein defined are desirous of having the said right of way purchased and paying for the same according to their assessment and to pay for the said expenditure in the year 1931.

And whereas it is necessary to obtain permissive legislation to allow the Council of the Township of North Gwillimbury to purchase the said right of way and to charge the cost against the land herein mentioned according to the assessment of the land herein mentioned according to the assessment of the land herein and to levy a rate sufficient to pay the cost thereof.

And whereas the amount of the existing debenture debt is \$48626.05 and no part of its principal or interest is in arrears,

Therefore the Council of the corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows,

I That an application be made to the Legislature of the province of Ontario for an Act of the Legislature to enable or permit the Council of the Township of North Gwillimbury to purchase the right of way of the Toronto Transportation Commission running from the southerly limit of lot 11 in the third concession of the said Township to the intersection of the paved highway running north from the old Village of Sutton and through that part of the present incorporated Village of Sutton known as Jackson's point; subject to the rights of the Hydro Electric Power Commission for the province of Ontario and Gravel pit comprising about two acres on lot 23 in the second concession of the said Township, for the price or sum of three thousand Dollars (\$3000.00) and to charge the same together with costs of the application for the said act of the Legislature and also all incidental expenditures against the land lying between the said right of way and the shores of Lake Simcoe from the southerly limit of lot 12 in the said third concession of the said Township to the westerly limit of that part of the Village of Sutton known as Jackson's point; and that the Council be given power to assess the costs thereof against the land lying between the said right of way and the shores of lake Simcoe from the southerly limit of lot 12 in the third concession to the westerly limit of that part of the Village of Sutton known as Jackson's point by the levy of a special rate on all the rateable property in the said area over and above all other rates of said Municipality for an amount sufficient to pay for the said costs above referred to in the year 1931, and to collect the same in the taxes of 1931, the provisions of the assessment act as to the collection and recovery of taxes and the proceedings which may be taken in default thereof shall apply to all special rates to be imposed under the provisions of this Act.

II

That the solicitor be and is hereby instructed to prepare all documents necessary for the application and to file the said application, and to advertise the said application according to the requirements thereof,

A By-Law to provide for expenditure on roads in the Township of North Gwillimbury for the year 1931,

Whereas the regulations of the department of Public Highways of Ontario require that the expenditure on Township roads under the Highway Improvement Act and amendments thereto, shall be provided for annually by Township By-Law,

Therefore the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows:

That the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars is hereby appropriated from monies raised by Taxes for expenditure upon construction and maintenance on the roads in the said Township during the year 1931 as follows:

Machinery	\$ 200.00
Superintendence	\$ 800.00
Maintenance & repair	\$ 7000.00
Total.	\$ 15000.00

That the said monies shall be expended under the direction of the duly appointed Township Road Superintendent.

All work on which the said monies shall be expended shall be performed in accordance with the last revised regulations respecting township roads issued by the department of Public Highways of Ontario,

The Clerk shall transmit a certified copy of this By-Law to the Deputy Minister, Department of Public Highways of Ontario within thirty days after the passing thereof,

By-Law No. 855

Whereas it is deemed expedient for the protection of the public and for the better preservation of Highways to enact the following By-Law.

Now therefore be it and it is hereby enacted,

No person shall place any goods, ~~or~~ wares, merchandise or any article or any material upon any highway under the jurisdiction of this Council.

Any erection or things projecting into or over any highway shall be removed by the owner or occupant of the land in connection with which they exist at the request of the Council.

The prohibition contained in paragraph I hereof shall not extend to authorize crossings protected by planking two inches in width,

Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding \$20.00 upon conviction under the Ontario convictions act and in default of payment thereof and costs, to imprisonment in the Common goal of the County of York for a period not exceeding ten days.

Whereas pursuant to the Municipal Act the Council is empowered to require from persons operating Victualling houses and places for the refreshment or entertainment of the public,

And whereas it is deemed advisable that no person shall be permitted to operate a temporary refreshment booth during the summer months only, bordering on the Highways of the Township of North Gwillimbury or North Gwillimbury, until such person has procured a license to do so.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of North Gwillimbury as follows:

There shall be taken out by every person who operates a temporary refreshment booth for the summer months only bordering on the highways of the Township of North Gwillimbury, authorizing them to carry on such business at a place mentioned in said license, and such person shall pay to the Treasurer of the Township at the time of taking out such license the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) per year or summer season, the said license shall expire on the 31st day of December in any year, and a new license shall be taken out before the operation of such booth is commenced in the following year.

Each such establishment shall be carried on in a quiet and orderly manner and shall at all times be open for inspection by any Township Police Officer,

The Council may cancel or suspend ^{any license} if it deems expedient for the Municipality to do so,

Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this By-Law shall upon conviction before a Justice of the Peace of the County of York, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and in default of payment thereof with costs, to imprisonment in the County goal of the County of York for a period not exceeding Twenty one days.

This By-Law shall take effect immediately upon the passing thereof,

Whereas pursuant to the Municipal Act the Council is empowered to require from persons operating miniature golf courses situated in the Township of North Gwillimbury

And whereas it is deemed advisable that no person shall be permitted to operate a miniature golf course situated in the Township of North Gwillimbury until such person has procured a license to do so,

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury as follows:

That there shall be taken out by every person who operates a miniature golf course situated in the Township of North Gwillimbury authorizing them to carry on such business at a place mentioned in the license and such person shall pay to the Treasurer of this Municipality at the time of taking out such license the sum of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per year. The said license shall expire on the 31st day of December in each year, and a new license shall be taken out before the operation of such golf course is commenced in the following year.

Each such golf course shall be carried on in a quiet and orderly manner and be open for inspection by any Township police officer,

The Council may grant, cancel or suspend any license if it deems expedient for the Municipality to do so.

Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this By-Law shall upon conviction before a justice or justices of the peace of the County of York be liable to a fine not exceeding Twenty dollars (\$20.00) and in default of payment thereof with costs to imprisonment in the County Goal of the County of York for a period not exceeding 21 days.

This By-Law shall take effect at the passing thereof.

Op. The Township of North Gwillimbury

A By-Law to purchase the right-of-way of the Hydro-Electric Power Commission of the province of Ontario from the southerly limit of Lot 11, Third concession, Township of North Gwillimbury to the intersection of the paved highway at Sutton.

Whereas under legislation passed by the province of Ontario under Bill known as the Township of North Gwillimbury Act 1931, power was given the Township of North Gwillimbury to purchase that part of the right-of-way formerly owned by the Corporation of the City of Toronto extending from the southerly limit of Lot 11, in the Third concession of the Township of North Gwillimbury to the intersection with the paved highway running north from the old Village of Sutton through that part of the present incorporated Village of Sutton known as Jackson's point, a distance of approximately twelve miles and also the gravel pit comprising 6.3 acres in lot number 23 in the second concession of the said Township at the price or sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3000.00), subject to the rights of the Hydro-Electric power commission of Ontario to maintain and operate the transmission lines and/or lines therein and thereon,

And whereas the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury deem it expedient and in the interests of the Municipality to purchase the said right-of-way for the sum of Three Thousand Dollars, (\$3000.00) and charge the same together with the costs incidental thereto to the taking over and the purchase against the lands hereinafter described by the levy of a special rate on all the rateable property on the hereinafter described lands in the year 1931.

Therefore be it enacted as a By-Law of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury as follows:

I That the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury purchase from the Hydro-Electric power commission of Ontario that part of its right-of-way formerly owned by the Corporation of the City of Toronto, extending from the southerly limit of Lot 11, in the Third concession of the said Township to its intersection with the paved highway running north from the old Village of Sutton through that part of the present incorporated Village of Sutton known as Jackson's point a distance of approximately 12 miles also the gravel pit comprising 6.3 acres in lot number 23 in the second concession of the said Township for the price or sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3000.00) subject to the rights of the Hydro-Electric power commission of Ontario to maintain and operate the transmission line or lines and poles therein and thereon and

That the Reeve and Clerk be and they are hereby authorized

and instructed to enter into an agreement with the Hydro Electric power commission of Ontario for the said purchase and that on the transfer of the said right of way to the Township of North Gwillimbury the Reeve and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized and instructed to pay to the Hydro Electric power commission of Ontario the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3000.00)

2 That the Reeve and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized and instructed to pay to the Solicitors of the said Township the costs of the special Act of the Legislature and all other expenses in connection with or incidental to the said Act and the purchase and taking over of the said right of way

3 That the cost of the said purchase being Three Thousand Dollars (\$3000.00) together with the costs in connection with and incidental to the purchase and taking over shall be levied and collected during the year 1931, by a special rate in addition to all other rates on all the rateable property within the following area in the said Township, namely - all that area of land lying between the said right of way and the shores of lake Simcoe from the southerly limit of lot 12 in the third concession of the said Township to the westerly limit of that part of the present incorporated Village of Sutton known as Jackson's Point;

By-Law No. 864

By-Law to take over as a public Highway the land known as the right-of-way formerly owned by the Corporation of the City of Toronto, extending from the southerly limit of lot 11, in the third concession of the Township of North Gwillimbury, to the intersection with the paved highway running north from Sutton a distance of approximately twelve miles,

whereas it is expedient to lay out and establish a highway as hereinafter mentioned;

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows:

I

That a public highway shall be and is hereby established commencing at the southerly limit of lot 11 in the third concession of the Township of North Gwillimbury; thence northerly and easterly along the right-of-way of the Toronto Transportation system formerly owned by the City of Toronto, to the intersection with the paved highway running north from the old Village of Sutton through that part of the present incorporated Village of Sutton known as Jacksons Point a distance of approximately twelve miles and more particularly described in deed from the Hydro Electric power commission of Ontario to the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury dated the second day of January 1931.

A By-Law to authorize the Head and Treasurer of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury to borrow certain sums of Money to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation and the sums required to be raised in the current year for High and public school purposes,

whereas the Council of the said Municipality deems the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars necessary to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation and the sums required to be raised in the current year for high and public school purposes until the Taxes are collected, and it is expedient subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, to authorize the Head and Treasurer to borrow the said sum,

And whereas the amount required to be raised by the said Municipality for High and public school purposes for the current year is the sum of Dollars.

And whereas the amount (if any) heretofore borrowed and outstanding for the purpose aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed 90 per cent of the ordinary expenditure of the said Municipality for the next proceeding year together with the amount required to be raised for High and public school purposes for the current year.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of North Gwillimbury as follows:

I

That the Head and Treasurer of the said corporation be and they are hereby authorized, in the manner and subject to the conditions herein mentioned to borrow from the Canadian Bank of Commerce the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars, required to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the corporation and the sums required to be raised for High and public school purposes for the current year until the Taxes are collected,

That a promissory note or notes, sealed with the Corporate seal and signed on behalf of the Corporation by the Head and Treasurer thereof for the amount of the said loan and interest thereon at the rate of 6 per cent per annum and payable on demand be duly executed and given to the said Bank as security for the repayment of the amount borrowed with interest thereon as aforesaid,
