By-Law No. 870.

A By-Law to encourage the erecting of wire fence along the Highways of this Municipality

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury as follows,

That the Council to encourage the erecting of wire fence along the Highways where the Council deem the same beneficial to the public travel, and which shall be accepted by the Council as being properly erected, shall pay to the parties erecting the standard wire fence a sum not to exceed Twenty Five (25) cents per rod,

all such fences shall be of Number Nine gauge wire and nine wires high,

But the Council may in their discretion pay an amount per rod for wire fence erected along the Highways where it is not up to the standard specifications but not the full amount of a standard fence where it is not beneficial to public travel,

All By-Laws or resolutions inconsistent with this By-Law be and the same are hereby repealed,

By Law No. 871.

A. By Law to authorize the Head and Treasurer of the Corporation of the Township of North & Willimbury to borrow certain sums to meet the current ordinary expenditures of the Corporation, and the sums required to be raised in the current year for High and public school purposes,

whereas the Council of the said Municipality deems the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars necessary to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation and the sums required to be raised in the current year for high and public school purposes until the Taxes are collected, and it is expedient, subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, to authorize the Head and Treasurer to borrow the said sum,

And whereas the ordinary expenditure of the said Municipality for the next preceding year amounted to Sixty Two Thousand Dollars,

And whereas the amount (if any) hereto borrowed and outstanding for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed (90 per cent) of the ordinary expenditure of the said Municipality for the next preceding year together with the amount required to be raised for High and public school purposes for the current year

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of North & Willimbury as follows,

I That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized in the manner and subject to the conditions herein mentioned to borrow from the Canadian Bank of Commerce the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars required to be raised for high and public school purposes for the current year until the Taxes are collected,

2 That a promissory note or notes sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the Corporation by the Head and Treasurer thereof, for the amount of the said loan and interest thereon at the rate of 6 per cent per annum and payable on Demand be duly executed and given to the said bank as security for the repayment of the amount borrowed with interest thereon as aforesaid,

By-Law No. 872.

Whereas it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillemburg to borrow the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars to meet the current ordinary expenditure of the Corporation and the sums required to be raised in the current year for high and public schools purposes until the Taxes are collected

And whereas the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under section 334 of the Revised Statutes of Ontario Chap. 233, 1927

Be it therefore enacted as a By-Law by the said Council as follows:-

- I That the Head and the Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from the Bank of Nova Scotia on the note of the Corporation only way of over draft, or otherwise the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars, until such time as the Taxes levied, or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance,
- 2 That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and Treasurer and the Bank
- 3 That the Head and Treasurer may draw make and deliver promissory notes bills or other securities and documents as may be agreed on to secure the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-Law,
- 4 That the Head and the Treasurer may enter into an agreement with the said Bank, sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and the Treasurer, providing for the borrowing of the said sum by the Corporation and the repayment of the same on or before the last business day of the current year, together with all other terms relating to such borrowing and repayment as the said Treasurer and Head may deem necessary,

A By-Law to provide for expenditure on roads in the Township of North Gwillimbury during the year 1932

Whereas the regulations of the Department of Highways of Ontario require that the expenditure on township roads under the Highway Improvement Act, and amendments thereto shall be provided for annually by Township By-Law

Therefore the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows,

The sum of \$16800.00 is hereby appropriated from monies raised by Taxes for expenditure upon construction and maintenance on the roads in the said township during the year 1932 as follows,

Road construction	\$ 5000.00
Bridge	" \$ 2000.00
Machinery	\$ 3000.00
Superintendence	\$ 800.00
Maintenance and repair	\$ <u>6000.00</u>
Total	\$16800.00

The said monies shall be expended under the direction of the duly appointed road superintendent

All work on which the said monies shall be expended shall be in accordance with the last revised regulations respecting Township roads issued by the Department of Highways of Ontario,

The Clerk shall transmit a certified copy of this By-Law to the deputy minister Department of Highways within thirty days after the passing thereof,

A By Law to assess for county purposes, Township purposes, School purposes, and special taxes as the law directs, whereas power is given Municipal Councils by the Municipal Act to assess and collect for all purposes above mentioned

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guillemburg enacts as follows,

That there be levied and collected on all the rateable property on the assessment Roll for 1932 the sum of \$41403.25 being at the rate of 2 1/10 mills on the \$

That is to say for county purposes the sum of \$19835.10 being at the rate of 10 2/10 mills on the \$

For Township purposes the sum of \$5777.21, being at the rate of 3 mills on the \$

For General school purposes the sum of \$5199.49 being at the rate of 2 1/10 mills on the \$

For Roads and Bridges the sum of \$7902.95 being at the rate of 4 mills on the \$

For debentures on Community Hall and Chappelle Bridge the sum of \$2888.50, being at the rate of 15/10 mills on the \$

Special Tax for Oil on Lake shore Road the sum of \$3795.50 being at the rate of 5 mills on the \$

Special Tax on Elmhurst Beach being at the rate of 4 mills on the \$

Special Tax on Indianola Beach being at the rate of 4 mills on the \$

Special Tax on Keswick, street lights being at the rate of 2 mills on the \$

Special Tax on Keswick Beach street lights being at the rate of 2 mills on the \$

For the several school sections as near as may be the following amounts,

S. S. No. 1, \$500.00, S. S. No. 2, \$2000.00, S. S. No. 2, D lbs. \$1301.03, S. S. No. 3, \$800.00, S. S. No. 4, \$500.00, S. S. No. 5, \$200.00, S. S. No. 6, \$2000.00, S. S. No. 6 D lbs, \$1231.25, S. S. No. 7, \$100.00, Union \$58.00

By-Law No 876

A By-Law to regulate the erection of Buildings and to issue permits for the erection or alteration of the same in this Municipality

Whereas the Council deem it necessary before the erection or alteration of any building a permit shall be issued,

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows:-

That any owners or persons, agents, firms or contractors before the erection or alteration of any building in this Municipality, application shall be made to the Inspector of buildings for a permit to erect the same, the Inspector shall inspect the location where the building or buildings are to be erected, and on the Inspector approving of the location and class of building or buildings to be erected the person in charge of issuing the building permits shall grant the same.

The Fee for such permit shall be the sum of \$1.00 and Inspector's Fee's,

Any Owners, persons, agents, firms or contractors who shall build or aid in the erection of any building or part of a building or shall remove or assist in removing any building or in the alteration of any building which work has not been approved by the Inspector or which shall in any manner contravene any provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the same,

Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable on conviction of a fine not exceeding (\$ 150 Dollars) for each offense including costs recoverable under the provisions of the Ontario summary convictions Act, and in default of payment to imprisonment in the Common Jail of the County of York for a period not exceeding Twenty-one days, unless such fine and costs are sooner paid,

This By-Law shall not apply to buildings erected or to be erected on Farms or ^{farming} lands used for market garden purposes, which have not been surveyed or laid out in lots for the purposes of erecting buildings thereon,

By-Law to authorize the application to The Council of The County of York to pass a By-Law to declare that sub-section 1. of section 196. Chapter 238 of Revised Statutes of Ontario shall apply and extend to the Township of North Gwillimbury,

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows;

I That this Council place on record its request to look after the Tax Sales of the property within the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury and that an application be made to the Council of the County of York, to pass a By-Law to declare that sub-section 1. of section 196. Chapter 238, Revised Statutes of Ontario, shall thereafter apply and extend to the Township of North Gwillimbury and thereupon the powers conferred on cities and towns by section 195. or any of the sections referred to in that section, and all duties imposed by the said sections upon the Officers of the said cities and towns and the Mayors thereof shall be vested in and apply to the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury and to the Reeve or other Head thereof, in the same manner and to the same extent as in the case of the municipalities mentioned in sub-section 1.

2 That the Reeve of the Corporation make an application to the County Council of the County of York to have the said By-Law, passed at the next session of the said Council,
