## Bylaw No 882

To authorize the borrowing of money to meet current expenditures for the year

Whereas it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilford to borrow an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of \$15,000<sup>00</sup> Fifteen Thousand Dollars to meet until the taxes are collected the current expenditures of the Corporation for the year including the amounts for sinking fund principal and interest falling due within the year upon the debts of the corporation school purposes special rates purposes and for meeting the requirements of any board, Commission or body and other purposes for which the corporation is required by law to provide and whereas the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Section 334 of the Municipal Act Chap 233 Revised Statutes of Ontario 1927 as amended by the Municipal Amendment Act 1932 (22 George VI Chapter 29 Section 2

Be it therefore enacted as a By-law by the said Council as follows:

That the Head and Treasurer of the said be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from the Bank of Nova Scotia an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars \$15,000<sup>00</sup> dollars until such times as the taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to pay such advance

2 That the said sum shall be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and Treasurer and the said bank

3 That as security for the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-law the Head and Treasurer are hereby authorized to give to the said Bank the promissory notes and

A By-law to authorize the Head and Treasurer of the Corporation of the Township of North Gullimbury to borrow certain sums to meet the current expenditures of the Corporation

Whereas the Council of the said municipality deems the sum of \$20,000 Twenty Thousand Dollars necessary to meet until the taxes are collected the current expenditures of the Corporation for the present year and it is expedient subject to the conditions hereinafter contained to authorize the Head and Treasurer to borrow the said sum \* which is in addition to the sum of \$23,250<sup>00</sup> heretofore borrowed in the current year for the purposes aforesaid

And whereas the revenues of the Corporation for the next preceding year exclusive of money borrowed and of proceeds derived from the sale of debentures in that year were as follows

- (a) From taxes levied in that year 1933
- (b) From arrears of taxes being taxes levied previous to that year
- (c) From other sources

Be it therefore enacted by the Corporation of the Township of North Gullimbury as follows:-

1<sup>st</sup> That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized in the manner and subject to the conditions herein mentioned to borrow from The Canadian Bank of Commerce the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars required to meet until the taxes are collected the current expenditures of the Corporation for the year

2<sup>nd</sup> That a promissory note or notes sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the Corporation by the Head and Treasurer thereof for the amount (and interest thereon) that may be borrowed pursuant to the authority of this By-Law be given to the said Bank as security for the repayment of the amount borrowed with interest thereon

## By-Law No 887

A By-Law to provide for expenditure on roads in the Township of North Gwillimbury during the year 1933.

Whereas the regulations of the Dept of Highways of Ontario require that the expenditure on Township roads under the Highway Improvement Act and amendments thereto shall be provided for annually by township by-law.

Therefore the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows:

(1) The sum of \$14,000 is hereby appropriated from monies raised by taxes for expenditure upon construction and maintenance on the roads in the said township during the year 1933 as follows:

Road Construction	4,000 <sup>00</sup>
Bridge Construction	2,000 <sup>00</sup>
Machinery	1,000 <sup>00</sup>
Superintendence	1,000
Maintenance & Repair	6,000
Total estimated expenditure	\$14,000 <sup>00</sup>

(2) The monies shall be expended under the direction of the duly appointed Township Road Superintendent

(3) All work on which the said monies shall be expended shall be performed in accordance with the last revised regulations respecting Township roads issued by the Dept of Highways of Ontario.

(4) The Clerk shall transmit a certified copy of this By-Law to the Deputy Minister Dept. of Highways within thirty days after the passing thereof.

By-Law No 888

A By-Law to amend all other By-Laws pertaining to Transient Traders

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of North Swillimbury That Transient Traders as defined by Subsection 6 and 7 of Section 420 and 13 Geo. V 1922.

Shall be required to procure from the Treas. of the Corporation before offering goods, wares or merchandise for sale in the said Municipality a License.

That the Fee payable for such License shall be \$50.<sup>00</sup> Fifty Dollars.

That anyone contravening the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to a fine of not less than \$50.<sup>00</sup> Fifty Dollars, and not more than \$100.<sup>00</sup> One Hundred Dollars to be recovered and enforced under the Ontario Summary Convictions Act

That this By-Law shall take effect at the passing thereof.

## By-Law No 889

Being a By-Law for licensing regulating and governing transient traders and other persons whose names have not been entered on the assessment roll in respect of income or business assessment for the then current year

Whereas it is necessary to pass a By-law for licensing regulating and governing transient traders and other persons whose names have not been entered on the assessment roll in respect of income or business assessment for the then current year,

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows:

- 1) Every person who carries on any trades, occupations, callings or businesses named in the next succeeding section of this By-Law shall procure a license so to do and every person so licensed shall be subject to the provisions of this By-Law.
- 2) There shall be taken out by every transient trader or other person whose name has not been entered on the assessment roll or is entered on it for the first time in respect of income or business assessment and who offers goods wares or merchandise for sale by auction conducted by himself or by a licensed auctioneer or otherwise or who offers them for sale in any other manner; But this paragraph shall not apply to the sale of a stock of a bankrupt or insolvent within the meaning of any Bankruptcy or Insolvency Act in force in Ontario which is being sold or disposed of within the Township of the bankrupt or insolvent carried on business in the Township at the time of his becoming bankrupt or insolvent so long as no goods wares or merchandise are added to such stock, nor shall this paragraph apply to the sale of a business to a bona fide purchaser who continues the same, a license authorizing them to carry on their several trades callings or businesses in the Township for which said license the person obtaining the same shall pay at the time of taking out such license a fee of One Hundred Dollars \$100<sup>00</sup>.
- 3) In the case of applications for transient traders license the applicant shall as a part of his application for such license furnish a statement in writing containing the full description of the

good wares or merchandise which he proposes to sell or offer for sale under such license.

(4) Every transient trader who carries on business without a license as hereinbefore provided shall incur a penalty equal to the license fee which he should have paid and in addition thereto a sum of not less than ten dollars (~~\$10.00~~) and not more than Two Hundred Dollars (~~\$200.00~~)

(5) The licensee shall at all times whilst carrying on his business have his license with him which shall be furnished by the Chief Constable and shall upon demand exhibit it to any municipal or peace officer and if he fails to do so shall unless the same is accounted for satisfactorily incur a penalty of not less than \$1.00 or more than \$5.00.

All other By-Laws of the Township passed heretofore regulating and licensing transient traders and other persons whose names have not been entered on the assessment roll in respect of income or business assessment for the then current year are hereby repealed.

That this By-Law shall take effect at the passing thereof.

Special tax on Keswick street lights being at the rate of 2 mills on the \$

Special tax on Plan 130 for lights being at the rate of 15/10 mills on the \$
