 Entitled a By Law to provide for the Corporation's
 consent to the Bell Telephone Company of Canada
 constructing its lines upon the Highways, Streets Bridges
 and other public places of the Corporation and to
 authorize the Road Superintendent to supervise and
 approve the construction of such lines,
 Whereas the Bell Telephone Company of Canada is empowered
 by its special act of incorporation, 43 Victoria, Chapter 67
 Dom, to construct and maintain its line or lines
 of telephone along the sides of and across or under any
 public Highways, streets, bridges, water courses, or other
 such places, or across or under any navigable waters
 either wholly in Canada or dividing Canada from any
 other country subject to the terms therein set forth, and
 whereas sub-section 2, of Section 373 of The Railway Act
 R.S.C. 1927, Chapter 170, provides that no telephone line
 within the legislative authority of the Parliament of Canada
 shall, except as therein provided, be constructed upon, along
 or across any highway, square or public place without the
 legal consent of the municipality having jurisdiction over
 such highway, square or public place, and,
 Whereas the Bell Telephone Company of Canada has carried on
 its business in the Municipality for a number of years
 and has established its lines of telephone upon the public
 Highways, streets, bridges and other public places within
 the said Township and continues so to do, and will from
 time to time hereafter require to construct additional lines
 upon the public Highways, streets, bridges and other such
 places within the said Township for the purpose of its
 business,

- Be it therefore enacted by The Municipal Council of The Corporation of The Township of North Guilford as follows,
- I That pursuant to the provisions of section 373(2) of the railway Act R.S.C. 1927, chapter 170, the said Corporation hereby consents to the construction by The Bell Telephone Company of Canada of all lines of telephone and telephone plant heretofore constructed upon, along, across or under the highways, squares, bridges and public places within the said Township over which the said Corporation has jurisdiction in the location and in the manner in which the same has been constructed,
 - 2 That pursuant to the provisions of Section 373(2) of the railway Act R.S.C. 1927, chapter 170, the said Corporation hereby consents to the construction by The Bell Telephone Company of Canada from time to time hereafter of all such line or lines of telephone as it requires for the purpose of its business upon, along, across or under any or all of the highways, squares, bridges or public places within the said Township under the jurisdiction of this Corporation, provided however, that the construction of all such lines and plant by the Bell Telephone Company of Canada shall be done in accordance with the said Company's standards of construction from time to time in force and effect, and provided further that the location of all such telephone lines and plant hereafter constructed, or of existing lines which may be hereafter be relocated, and the opening up of streets, squares, bridges or other such places for the erection of poles or the carrying of wires underground, shall be subject to the supervision of the road superintendent of the Corporation from time to time being whose written approval of locations of lines and whose certificates as to supervision shall be valid and binding upon the Corporation,
 - 3 Upon obtaining the consent of the abutting landowners, the Company may, with the approval and under the supervision of the said road superintendent trim all trees growing or standing upon the highways of the Corporation so as to keep its lines and wires free from interference therewith,
 - 4, The Clerk of the said Corporation is hereby authorized and directed to certify from time to time under the Seal of the Corporation to the Bell Telephone Company of Canada the appointment of the Corporation's Road Superintendent authorized to act under this By-Law.

and be it further enacted that in the event of the Road Superintendent or other properly qualified body or person deeming it necessary to request the company to move, alter or re-arrange its line or lines of telephone and/or other plant for the purpose of widening, improving or relocating a highway of the Corporation, or for any other purpose, the Road Superintendent may give to the said Company an order to do such work as he deems necessary, and he may enter into an agreement with the said Company for the payment of the whole or any portion of the cost of the said work by the Corporation, and any such agreement entered into by the said Road Superintendent shall be valid and fully binding upon the said Corporation, provided that the amount of the cost to be borne by the Corporation under the terms of the said agreement shall not exceed the sum of \$2000.

Whereas the Council of the Township of North Gwillimbury (hereinafter called the "Municipality") deems it necessary to borrow the sum of \$ 25000.00 to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Municipality for the year;

And Whereas the total amount of the estimated revenues of the Municipality as set forth in the estimates adopted for the year 1937, not including revenues derivable or derived from arrears of taxes, borrowings and issues of debentures is \$ 51000.00

And Whereas the total amount heretofore authorized to be borrowed this year for the purposes mentioned in subsection (1) of section 334 of The Municipal Act is \$, of which the Municipality has already borrowed a total of \$

Therefore the Council of the Township of North Gwillimbury hereby enacts as follows:

- 1. The Head and the Treasurer are hereby authorized on behalf of the Municipality to borrow from time to time by way of promissory note from THE CANADIAN BANK OF COMMERCE a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$ 25000.00 to meet until the taxes are collected the current expenditures of the Municipality for the year, including the amounts required for the purposes mentioned in subsection (1) of the said section 334, and to give on behalf of the Municipality to the Bank a promissory note or notes sealed with the Corporate Seal and signed by the Head and Treasurer for the moneys so borrowed, with interest, which may be paid in advance or otherwise, at a rate not exceeding 5 1/2 per centum per annum.
2. All sums borrowed pursuant to the authority of this by-law as well as all other sums borrowed in this year and in previous years from the said Bank for any or all of the purposes mentioned in the said section 334, shall, with interest thereon, be a charge upon the whole of the revenues of the Municipality for the current year and for all preceding years as and when such revenues are received.
3. The Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to apply in payment of all sums borrowed as aforesaid, together with interest thereon, all of the moneys hereafter collected or received either on account or realized in respect of taxes levied for the current year and preceding years or from any other source which may lawfully be applied for such purpose.

FOR ORDINARY EXPENDITURE—ONTARIO }

BY-LAW No. 961

TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO MEET CURRENT
EXPENDITURES FOR THE YEAR

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of
the Township of North Gwillimburgh borrow an
amount not at any time to exceed the sum of

Ten thousand dollars

to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Corporation
for the year, including the amounts for sinking fund, principal and interest falling due
within the year upon the debts of the Corporation, school purposes, special rates pur-
poses and for meeting the requirements of any Board, Commission or body and other
purposes for which the Corporation is required by law to provide.

AND WHEREAS the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and
outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to
be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Section
334 of the Municipal Act, Chapter 233, Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1927 as amended
by the Municipal Amendment Act, ~~1932 (22 George V. Chapter 29, Section 12.)~~

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED as a By-law by the said Council as follows:

1. That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized
to borrow from The Bank of Nova Scotia an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of
dollars
until such time as the taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.

2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time
as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and
Treasurer and the said Bank.

3. That as security for the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-law the
Head and Treasurer are hereby authorized to give to the said Bank the promissory notes, and/or
other forms of agreement of the Corporation signed by the Head and Treasurer and sealed with the

4. That all the revenues of the said Corporation of whatsoever nature and kind be and the
same are hereby charged to and in favour of the said Bank for and with the payment of any sum
borrowed under this By-law and the interest thereon as hereinbefore provided.

5. That the Head and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement
or agreements with the said Bank sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Cor-
poration by the Head and Treasurer providing for the borrowing of the sum hereby authorized and
the repayment thereof on or before the last business day of the current year and containing such
other terms relating to such borrowing, repayment and the charge hereby created as may be required
by the said Bank.

A By. Law to restrict the speed of vehicles on certain roads in the Township of North Swillimbury
Whereas subsection 2a of section 23 of the Highway Traffic Act as amended by section 3 of section 2 of the Highway Traffic Act 1937, provides that The Council of any Township may by reason of density of population or number and proximity of buildings therein or in any part thereof by By. Law approved by the department prohibit a motor vehicle from being operated at a greater rate of speed than thirty miles per hour in the Township or in such part or parts thereof or on such highways therein as the By. Law may define

And whereas it is deemed expedient by reason of the density of population and number and proximity of buildings adjacent thereto that speed of vehicles on certain roads in the Township of North Swillimbury be restricted.

Now Therefore The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Swillimbury enacts as follows.

I

No vehicle shall be driven upon the following designated highway in the Township of North Swillimbury at a greater rate of speed than thirty miles per hour that is the road known as the Lakeshore Road in the Township of North Swillimbury running along or near the shore of Lake Simcoe from Keswick to Jackson's Point.

Every person who violates any of the provisions of this By. Law shall incur the penalties provided in subsection 3 of section 23. of the Highway Traffic Act.

The provisions of this By. Law shall not become effective until signs have been erected in compliance with the regulations of the Department of Highways

subject to the provisions of the preceding paragraph this By. Law shall take effect upon from and after receiving the approval of the Department of Highways

By-Law to prohibit the parking of motor cars and vehicles on certain portions of the Lakeshore Road in the Township of North Gwillimbury,

Whereas by the Municipal Act of Ontario, revised statutes of Ontario 1924, Chapter 233, and amendments thereto Councils of all Municipalities are empowered to pass By-Laws, for the regulating of traffic within the Municipality, subject to the approval of the Department of Highways for the province of Ontario,

And whereas it is desirable to regulate the parking of Motor cars and vehicles on certain parts of the highway known as the Lakeshore road in the Township of North Gwillimbury in the County of York,

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York enacts as follows,

I No person shall park a motor car or vehicle on those parts of the Highway known as the Lakeshore road in the Township of North Gwillimbury, in the County of York, within the following areas, (1) from the centre of lot 14, Concession 2, to the northerly limit of lot 14, Concession 2. (2) from the west limit of the Highway bridge on lot 7, Concession 9, easterly a distance of Eighteen Hundred feet (1800') at any time during day or night. None of the provisions of this section shall come into effect until suitable signs have been erected clearly indicating the parking restrictions,

any person violating any of the provisions of this By-Law shall be subject to a penalty of not more than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for the first offence and to not more than Twenty Five Dollars (\$25.00) for every subsequent offence exclusive of costs, and all such penalties shall be recoverable under the Ontario summary Convictions Act.

Nothing in this By-Law shall in any way diminish the Restrictions as established by any other By-Law of the said Township, which may affect any portion of the Highways herein described,

Any By-Law or parts of By-Law inconsistent with this By-Law are hereby repealed,

A By-Law to fix the place of holding the nomination to compose the Council for 1938, also the place of holding the election in the several polling sub-divisions and appointing Deputy Returning Officers and Poll Clerks whereas the Municipal Act requires Councils to fix the place of holding the nomination and election in the different municipalities,

By Law No. 973,

A. By. to amend By. Law No. 946 of The Corporation of the Township of North Swillimbury
 Whereas The Municipal Council of The Corporation of the Township of North Swillimbury deem it necessary and expedient to amend By. Law No. 946 passed on the second day of June 1936,

Therefore The Municipal Council of The Corporation of the Township of North Swillimbury enacts as follows,
 U. That section 57, subsection (B) of By. Law Number 946, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following words, except for summer cottages and in these cases the foundation may be of flat stones or cement blocks of sufficient strength and size to carry the load of the building, and the stones or cement blocks may be laid on top of the ground so that section, B, shall read as follows,

The foundations for frame buildings shall be Cedar posts seven inches or larger, cement piers twelve inches by twelve inches, or brick piers fourteen inches by fourteen inches spaced not more than eight feet on centres and at least three and one half feet deep below the grade line of earth, except for summer cottages and in these cases the foundation may be of flat stones sufficient strength and size to carry the load of the building and the stones or cement blocks may be laid on top of the ground.
