

## By-Law No 1021

A By-Law to provide for the total 1941 expenditure on roads in the Township of North Gwillimbury in the County of York.

Whereas the Highway Improvement Act, Chapter 56, R.S.O. 1937 and amendments requires that the total expenditure on township roads and bridges be provided for annually by township by-law.

Therefore the Council of the said Township enacts as follows:

(1) The sum of \$14,000<sup>00</sup> is hereby appropriated from monies raised by levy, debentures and government subsidy for total expenditure upon construction and maintenance of the roads in the said township during the year 1941 as follows:

Road Construction	\$ 1500 <sup>00</sup>
Bridge Construction	\$ 1000 <sup>00</sup>
Machinery	\$ 1500 <sup>00</sup>
Superintendent	\$ 1000 <sup>00</sup>
Maintenance & Repair	\$ 9000 <sup>00</sup>
Total Estimated Expenditure	\$ 14000 <sup>00</sup>

(2) The said monies shall be expended under the direction of the duly appointed township road superintendent and on work performed in accordance with the latest regulations respecting township roads issued by the Department of Highways of Ontario.

(3) The clerk shall transmit a copy of this by-law to the Municipal Roads Branch, Department of Highways, for approval on or before February 28<sup>th</sup> of the present year.

MUNICIPAL BORROWING BY-LAW FOR  
ORDINARY EXPENDITURE—ONTARIO }

BY-LAW No. 1022

TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO MEET CURRENT  
EXPENDITURES FOR THE YEAR

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury to borrow an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of

Ten Thousand dollars to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Corporation for the year, including the amounts for sinking fund, principal and interest falling due within the year upon the debts of the Corporation, school purposes, special rates purposes and for meeting the requirements of any Board, Commission or body and other purposes for which the Corporation is required by law to provide.

AND WHEREAS the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Section 339 of the Municipal Act, Chapter 266, Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1937.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED as a By-law by the said Council as follows:

1. That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from The Bank of Nova Scotia an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of Ten Thousand dollars until such time as the taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.
2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and Treasurer and the said Bank.
3. That as security for the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-law the Head and Treasurer are hereby authorized to give to the said Bank the promissory notes, and/or other forms of agreement of the Corporation signed by the Head and Treasurer and sealed with the seal of the Corporation as may be required by the said Bank.
4. That all the revenues of the said Corporation of whatsoever nature and kind be and the same are hereby charged to and in favour of the said Bank for and with the payment of any sum borrowed under this By-law and the interest thereon as hereinbefore provided.
5. That the Head and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement or agreements with the said Bank sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and Treasurer providing for the borrowing of the sum hereby authorized and the repayment thereof on or before the last business day of the current year and containing such other terms relating to such borrowing, repayment and the charge hereby created as may be required by the said Bank.

**A By-law** to authorize the borrowing of \$

Whereas the Council of the Township of North Gwillimbury (hereinafter called the "Municipality") deems it necessary to borrow the sum of \$ 30,000.00 to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Municipality for the year;

NOTE.—Refer to the estimates for the current year if adopted; if not, to those of last year.

And Whereas the total amount of the estimated revenues of the Municipality as set forth in the estimates adopted for the year 1940, not including revenues derivable or derived from arrears of taxes, borrowings and issues of debentures, is \$ 63,790.00

~~And Whereas the total amount heretofore authorized to be borrowed this year for the purposes mentioned in subsection (1) of section 339 of The Municipal Act is \$ / / / / / of which the Municipality has already borrowed a total of \$ / / / / /~~

Therefore the Council of the Township of North Gwillimbury hereby enacts as follows:

1. The Head and the Treasurer are hereby authorized on behalf of the Municipality to borrow from time to time by way of promissory note from THE CANADIAN BANK OF COMMERCE a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$ 30,000.00 to meet until the taxes are collected the current expenditures of the Municipality for the year, including the amounts required for the purposes mentioned in subsection (1) of section 339 of the Municipal Act, and to give on behalf of the Municipality to the Bank a promissory note or notes sealed with the Corporate Seal and signed by the Head and Treasurer for the moneys so borrowed, with interest, which may be paid in advance or otherwise, at a rate not exceeding five per centum per annum.
2. All sums borrowed pursuant to the authority of this by-law, as well as all other sums borrowed in this year and in previous years from the said Bank for any or all of the purposes mentioned in the said section 339, shall, with interest thereon, be a charge upon the whole of the revenues of the Municipality for the current year and for all preceding years as and when such revenues are received.
3. The Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to apply in payment of all sums borrowed as aforesaid, together with interest thereon, all of the moneys hereafter collected or received either on account or realized in respect of taxes levied for the current year and preceding years or from any other source which may lawfully be applied for such purpose.

A By-Law to appoint a Board of Management for the Community Hall at Belhaven.

Whereas the Statutes provide that the Municipal Council shall appoint a Board for the management and control of the Community Hall.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Cowichimburg

That the Reeve and Deputy Reeve be and their successors in office shall be and comprise the representation from the Township Council on the Community Hall Board.

That Miss Christina Young be appointed to represent the Anglican Church and the A. O. B. A.

That Mr G. E. Bains be appointed to represent the Masonic Order

That Mr George Rangridge be appointed to represent the Orange Lodge.

That Mrs Chesley Cryanman be appointed to represent other interests

And the above named persons shall constitute a Board to manage and control the affairs of the Community Hall at Belhaven under the provisions of the Community Halls Act

## By-Law No 1030

A By-Law to assess for County purposes, Township purposes, School purposes and the special taxes as directed by statute:

Whereas the Municipal Act requires Municipal Councils to assess and collect for all Taxes above mentioned during the current year:

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury hereby enacts as follows:

That there be levied and collected from all the rateable property in the Township of North Gwillimbury for the year 1941 as follows:

That is to say for County purposes the sum of \$15,951.<sup>60</sup> being at the rate of 7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>10</sub> mills on the dollar.

For Township purposes the sum of \$3,544.<sup>00</sup> being at the rate of 1<sup>4</sup>/<sub>10</sub> mills on the dollar.

For Roads and Bridges the sum of \$10,412.<sup>85</sup> being at the rate of 4<sup>7</sup>/<sub>10</sub> mills on the dollar; This to include payment of debentures for 1941 on the Lake Shore road.

Special levy for Direct Relief, Charity and Hospitalizations for the sum of \$2,685.<sup>60</sup> being at the rate of 1<sup>2</sup>/<sub>10</sub> mills on the dollar.

For the General School Rate the sum of \$5,095.<sup>00</sup> being at the rate of 2<sup>2</sup>/<sub>10</sub> mills on the dollar:

For the Trustee Levy in the different school sections as near as may be to the following amounts

Special levy for care of Bowling Green on Plan No 180. for the sum of \$31.<sup>00</sup>

Special levy for Oil on Township Roads as near as may be to the sum of \$1198.<sup>40</sup> being at the rate of 4 mills on the dollar, and for oil distributed on private Roads or for other special purposes the sum of \$360.<sup>34</sup> cost levied direct on the properties concerned according to the amount of oil distributed, for each property.

Special levy for the collection and disposal of garbage in specified areas as near as may be to the sum of \$1,966.<sup>08</sup> being at the rate of 1<sup>4</sup>/<sub>10</sub> mills on the dollar.

## By Law No 1030 (contd)

Special levy for whatever sum is necessary to cover the cost of Weed Cutting on private properties as carried out under the direction of the Weed Inspector

A Tax on all dogs owned in the Municipality.

Special levy for Street Rights in the Village of Keswick as near as may be to the sum of \$358<sup>29</sup> being at the rate of 4 7/10 mills on the dollar

Special levy for Street Rights in registered plan No 130 as near as may be to the sum of \$35<sup>30</sup> being at the rate of 1 mill on the dollar

A Tax for such sums as may be necessary to meet arrears due to the Hydro Electric Power Commission to be levied against such properties as may be concerned.

The General Tax Rate has been reduced one mill by reason of the Provincial Subsidy to Municipalities.

## By-Law No 1033

By-Law to adopt the Assessment already made and revised in the year 1941

Whereas the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury is authorized, by the provisions of Section 59, Sub Section 1, of The Assessment Act, R. S. O. 1937, Chapter 272, to pass a By-Law for taking the Assessment between the first day of April and the Thirtieth day of September, instead of between the Fifteenth day of February and the Thirtieth day of April in the same year.

And Whereas by sub section 3, of Section 59 aforesaid, it is provided that in any year if the Assessment has been made between the Fifteenth day of February and the Thirtieth day of April, the Council may, instead of making a second Assessment in the same year, pass a By-Law to adopt the Assessment Roll previously made and revised in the said year.

And Whereas the Assessment for the Township of North Gwillimbury for the year 1941 was made between the Fifteenth day of February and the Thirtieth day of April, 1941, and has been duly revised

Now therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury enacts as follows:

(1) The Assessment roll for the Township of North Gwillimbury made between the Fifteenth day of February, 1941 and the Thirtieth day of April, 1941, and which has been duly revised before the first day of July, 1941, shall be, and the same is hereby adopted as the second assessment for the year 1941.

(2) The said Assessment Roll so adopted shall be the assessment in which the rate of taxes for the year 1942 shall be levied.
