A By-Law to appoint a Building Inspector for the Township of North Swillimbury.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Swillimbury

- (1) That Carl Morton be appointed Building Inspector for the Township of North Swillimbury.
- (2) That he is hereby authorized to issue building permits under the terms of By-Law No. 946 of the said municipality.
- (3). That the fee charged for such building permits shall be One Dollar per permit
- (4). That one copy of each building permit shall be filed with the Clerk of the municipality
- (5) That for his services as such Building Inspector he shall be paid the sum of One Dollar for each permit issued

By Law No 1050

BY-LAW No. 1050

A By-law to authorize the borrowing of \$ 20,000

Whereas the Council of the Township of North Gwillimbury (hereinafter called the "Municipality") deems it necessary to borrow the sum of \$ 20,000 to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Municipality for the year;

NOTE.—Refer to the estimates for the current year if adopted; if not, to those of last year.

And Whereas the total amount of the estimated revenues of the Municipality as set forth in the estimates adopted for the year 1942, not including revenues derivable or derived from arrears of taxes, borrowings and issues of debentures, is \$ 63,500

(Delete this paragraph if not applicable).

And Whereas the total amount heretofore authorized to be borrowed this year for the purposes mentioned in subsection (1) of section 339 of The Municipal Act is \$ [handwritten amount], of which the Municipality has already borrowed a total of \$ [handwritten amount]

Therefore the Council of the Township of North Gwillimbury hereby enacts as follows:

- 1. The Head and the Treasurer are hereby authorized on behalf of the Municipality to borrow from time to time by way of promissory note from THE CANADIAN BANK OF COMMERCE a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$ 20,000 to meet until the taxes are collected the current expenditures of the Municipality for the year, including the amounts required for the purposes mentioned in subsection (1) of section 339 of the Municipal Act, and to give on behalf of the Municipality to the Bank a promissory note or notes sealed with the Corporate Seal and signed by the Head and Treasurer for the moneys so borrowed, with interest, which may be paid in advance or otherwise, at a rate not exceeding five per centum per annum.
2. All sums borrowed pursuant to the authority of this by-law, as well as all other sums borrowed in this year and in previous years from the said Bank for any or all of the purposes mentioned in the said section 339, shall, with interest thereon, be a charge upon the whole of the revenues of the Municipality for the current year and for all preceding years as and when such revenues are received.
3. The Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to apply in payment of all sums borrowed as aforesaid, together with interest thereon, all of the moneys hereafter collected or received either on account or realized in respect of taxes levied for the current year and preceding years or from any other source which may lawfully be applied for such purpose.

MUNICIPAL BORROWING BY-LAW FOR  
ORDINARY EXPENDITURE—ONTARIO }

BY-LAW No. 1051

TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO MEET CURRENT  
EXPENDITURES FOR THE YEAR

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of  
the Township of North Wellington to borrow an  
amount not at any time to exceed the sum of Five Thousand dollars  
to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Corporation  
for the year, including the amounts for sinking fund, principal and interest falling due  
within the year upon the debts of the Corporation, school purposes, special rates pur-  
poses and for meeting the requirements of any Board, Commission or body and other  
purposes for which the Corporation is required by law to provide.

AND WHEREAS the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and  
outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to  
be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Section  
339 of the Municipal Act, Chapter 266, Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1937.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED as a By-law by the said Council as follows:

1. That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized  
to borrow from The Bank of Nova Scotia an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of  
Five Thousand dollars  
until such time as the taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.
2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time  
as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and  
Treasurer and the said Bank.
3. That as security for the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-law the  
Head and Treasurer are hereby authorized to give to the said Bank the promissory notes, and/or  
other forms of agreement of the Corporation signed by the Head and Treasurer and sealed with the  
seal of the Corporation as may be required by the said Bank.
4. That all the revenues of the said Corporation of whatsoever nature and kind be and the  
same are hereby charged to and in favour of the said Bank for and with the payment of any sum  
borrowed under this By-law and the interest thereon as hereinbefore provided.
5. That the Head and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement  
or agreements with the said Bank sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Cor-  
poration by the Head and Treasurer providing for the borrowing of the sum hereby authorized and  
the repayment thereof on or before the last business day of the current year and containing such  
other terms relating to such borrowing, repayment and the charge hereby created as may be required  
by the said Bank.

## By-Law No 1052

A By-Law to appoint a Treasurer for the Township of North Swillimbury.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Swillimbury

## By-Law No. 1053

A. By-Law to provide for the total 1943 expenditures on roads in the Township of North Swillimbury in the County of York.

Whereas the Highway Improvement Act, Chapter 56, R. S. O. 1937 and amendments requires that the total expenditure on township roads and bridges be provided for annually by township by-law

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the said Township enact as follows:

- (1) The sum of \$14,000.00 is hereby appropriated from monies raised by levy and government subsidy for total expenditure upon maintenance of the roads in the said township during the year 1943 as follows:

Maintenance and Repair	\$	12920.00
Total Estimated Expenditure	\$	14000.00

- (2) The said monies shall be expended under the direction of the duly appointed township road superintendent and on work performed in accordance with the latest regulations respecting township roads issued by the Department of Highways of Ontario.

- (3) The clerk shall transmit a copy of this by-law to the Municipal Roads Branch, Department of Highways, for approval on or before February 28<sup>th</sup> of the present year.

## By-Law No 1055

A By-Law to appoint an officer to act as Clerk, Treasurer and Tax Collector in the Township of North Swillimbury.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Swillimbury:

(1) That Arnd Pell be and is hereby appointed to act as Clerk, Treasurer and Tax Collector for the Township of North Swillimbury for the year 1943 and during the pleasure of the Council.

(2) That for his services for said offices of Clerk, Treasurer and Tax Collector he shall receive the sum of \$1200<sup>00</sup> Dollars per year, payable by monthly instalments of One Hundred Dollars.

(3) That all By-Laws or parts of By-Laws pertaining to the appointment of Clerk, Treasurer or Tax Collector and contrary to the terms of this By-Law are hereby repealed.

## By-Law No. 1056

A By-Law to assess for County purposes, Township purposes, School purposes, and the special taxes as decided by the statutes

Whereas the Municipal Act requires Municipal Councils to assess for and collect all taxes above mentioned during the current year.

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury hereby enacts as follows.

That there shall be levied and collected from all the rateable property in the Township of North Gwillimbury for the year 1943 as follows:

That is to say for County purposes the sum of \$14,694.<sup>87</sup> being at the rate of  $6\frac{3}{10}$  mills on the dollar.

For Township purposes the sum of \$3617.<sup>22</sup> being at the rate of  $1\frac{4}{10}$  mills on the dollar.

For Roads and Bridges the sum of \$10,399.<sup>42</sup> being at the rate of  $4\frac{4}{10}$  mills on the dollar

Special levy for direct relief, charity and hospitalization for the sum of \$2712.<sup>00</sup> being at the rate of  $1\frac{3}{10}$  mills on the dollar.

For the General School Rate the sum of \$4747.<sup>20</sup> being at the rate of  $2\frac{1}{10}$  mills on the dollar.

For the trustee levy in the different school sections as near as may be to the following amounts.

D.D. #1. \$1089.<sup>00</sup> being at the rate of 3 mills on the dollar.

D.D. #2. \$1925.<sup>21</sup> being at the rate of  $4\frac{9}{10}$  mills on the dollar.

and for debentures the sum of \$1296.<sup>27</sup> being at the rate of  $3\frac{3}{10}$  mills on the dollar.

D.D. #3 \$444.<sup>60</sup> being at the rate of  $\frac{9}{10}$  mills on the dollar.

D.D. #4 672.<sup>04</sup> being at the rate of  $3\frac{4}{10}$  mills on the dollar.

D.D. #5 801.<sup>22</sup> being at the rate of  $5\frac{9}{10}$  mills on the dollar.

D.D. #6 625.<sup>80</sup> being at the rate of 1 mill on the dollar.

D.D. #7 454.<sup>00</sup> being at the rate of 5 mills on the dollar.

D.D. Union Brown Hill \$55.<sup>77</sup> being at the rate of  $7\frac{1}{10}$  mills on the dollar.

Special levy for the collection and disposal of garbage in specified areas for the sum of \$2150.<sup>00</sup> being at the rate of  $1\frac{9}{10}$  mills on the dollar.

Special levy for the street lights in the village of Heswick and Plan 130. being at the rate of  $4\frac{3}{10}$  mills on the dollar for Heswick village and 1 mill on the dollar for plan 130

Special levy for whatever sum is necessary to cover the cost of wood cutting on private properties as carried out during the year 1942 under the direction of the Wood Inspectors

A tax for such sums as may be necessary to meet arrears due to the Hydro Electric Power Commission to be levied against such properties as may be concerned

Special levy for the care of Bowling Green on Plan 180 for the sum of \$30.<sup>00</sup>

Its General Tax Rate has been reduced 1 mill by reason of the Provincial Subsidy to Municipalities
