

By Law No 1059

A By-Law to authorize the borrowing of \$20,000.

Whereas the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Guilford (hereinafter called the "Municipality") deems it necessary to borrow the sum of 20,000 to meet until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Municipality for the year:

And whereas the total amount of the estimated revenues of the Municipality as set forth in the estimates adopted for the year 1944, not including revenues derivable or derived from various taxes, borrowings and issues of debentures is \$46,000.

Therefore the Council of the Township of North Guilford hereby enacts as follows:

- (1) The Head and the Treasurer are hereby authorized on behalf of the Municipality to borrow from time to time by way of promissory note from the Canadian Bank of Commerce a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$20,000 to meet until the taxes are collected the current expenditures of the Municipality for the year, including the amounts required for the purposes mentioned in subsection (1) of section 398 of the Municipal Act, and to give on behalf of the Municipality to the Bank a promissory note or notes secured with the Corporate Seal and signed by the Head and Treasurer for the money so borrowed, with interest, which may be paid in advance or otherwise, at a rate not exceeding 5% per centum per annum.
- (2) All sums borrowed pursuant to the authority of this by-law, as well as all other sums borrowed in this year and in previous years from the said Bank for any one of the purposes mentioned in the said section 398, shall, with interest thereon, be a charge upon the whole of the revenues of the Municipality for the current year and for all succeeding years as and when such revenues are received.
- (3) The Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to apply in payment of all sums borrowed as aforesaid, together with interest thereon, all of the money hereafter collected or received either on account or realized in respect of taxes levied for the current year and succeeding years or from any other source which may lawfully be applied for such purposes.

MUNICIPAL BORROWING BY-LAW FOR
ORDINARY EXPENDITURE—ONTARIO }

BY-LAW No. 1060

TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO MEET CURRENT
EXPENDITURES FOR THE YEAR

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of
the Township of North Williamsburg to borrow an
amount not at any time to exceed the sum of

Five thousand dollars
to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Corporation
for the year, including the amounts for sinking fund, principal and interest falling due
within the year upon the debts of the Corporation, school purposes, special rates pur-
poses and for meeting the requirements of any Board, Commission or body and other
purposes for which the Corporation is required by law to provide.

AND WHEREAS the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and
outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to
be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Section
339 of the Municipal Act, Chapter 266, Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1937.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED as a By-law by the said Council as follows:

1. That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized
to borrow from The Bank of Nova Scotia an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of
Five thousand dollars
until such time as the taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.

2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time
as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and
Treasurer and the said Bank.

3. That as security for the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-law the
Head and Treasurer are hereby authorized to give to the said Bank the promissory notes, and/or
other forms of agreement of the Corporation signed by the Head and Treasurer and sealed with the
seal of the Corporation as may be required by the said Bank.

4. That all the revenues of the said Corporation of whatsoever nature and kind be and the
same are hereby charged to and in favour of the said Bank for and with the payment of any sum
borrowed under this By-law and the interest thereon as hereinbefore provided.

5. That the Head and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement
or agreements with the said Bank sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Cor-
poration by the Head and Treasurer providing for the borrowing of the sum hereby authorized and
the repayment thereof on or before the last business day of the current year and containing such
other terms relating to such borrowing, repayment and the charge hereby created as may be required
by the said Bank.

BY-LAW NO. 1061

A BY-LAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE TOTAL 1944 EXPENDITURE ON ROADS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF North Williamburg IN THE COUNTY OF York

WHEREAS The Highway Improvement Act, Chapter 56, R.S.O., 1937 and amendments requires that the total expenditure on township roads and bridges be provided for annually by township by-law.

THEREFORE the council of the corporation of the said township enacts as follows:

(1) The sum of \$ 15,000 is hereby appropriated from monies raised by levy and government subsidy for total expenditure upon maintenance of the roads in the said township during the year 1944 as follows:

(3) The clerk shall transmit a copy of this by-law to the Municipal Roads Branch, Department of Highways, for approval on or before February 28th of the present year.

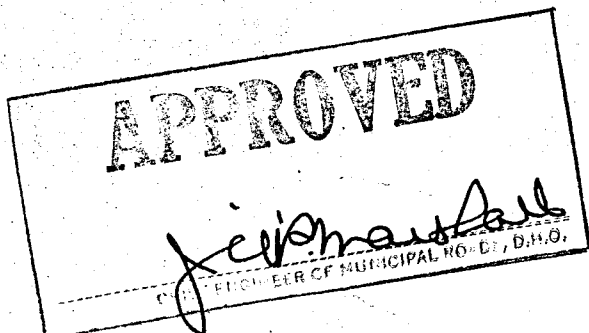

By Law No 1062

A By-Law to assess for County purposes, Township purposes, School purposes and the special taxes as directed by the Statute:

Whereas the Municipal Act requires Municipal Councils to assess and collect all the taxes above mentioned during the current year:

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury hereby enacts as follows.

That there be levied upon and collected from all the rateable property in the Township of North Gwillimbury for the year 1944 as follows:

That is to say for County purposes the sum of \$15,746.¹⁵ being at the rate of 6 ⁹/₁₀ mills on the dollar.

For township purposes the sum of \$2,282.05 being at the rate of 1 mill on the dollar.

For Roads and Bridges the sum of \$8,443.59 being at the rate of 3 ⁷/₁₀ mills on the dollar.

Special levy for Direct Relief, Charity and Hospitalization the sum of \$2,966.67 being at the rate of 1 ³/₁₀ mills on the dollar.

For the General School Rate the sum of \$4,792.30 being at the rate of 2 ¹/₁₀ mills on the dollar.

A total rate for the above mentioned purposes of 15 mills on the dollar for the trustee levies in the different school sections as near as may be to the following amounts.

P. D. No. 1. \$1,288.70 being at the rate of 3 ⁵/₁₀ mills on the dollar.

P. D. No 2 \$2,530.56 being at the rate of 6 ⁴/₁₀ mills on the dollar.

and for debt service the sum of \$1,304.82 being at the rate of 3 ³/₁₀ mills on the dollar.

P. D. No. 3. \$803.84 being at the rate of 1 ⁴/₁₀ mills on the dollar.

P. D. No 4 \$425.60 being at the rate of 2 ⁸/₁₀ mills on the dollar.

P. D. No 5. \$803.40 being at the rate of 6 ⁰/₁₀ mills on the dollar.

P. D. No 6 \$2,291.40 being at the rate of 3 ⁴/₁₀ mills on the dollar.

P. D. No 7 \$497.44 being at the rate of 5 ⁸/₁₀ mills on the dollar.

P. D. Union

Brownhill \$48.30 being at the rate of 10 mills on the dollar.

Special levy for the collection and disposal of garbage in abraded areas for the sum of \$2,538.93 being at the rate of 2 ³/₁₀ mills on the dollar.

Special levy for the street lights in the village of Keswick and Plan 130 being at the rate of 4 ⁵/₁₀ mills on the dollar for Keswick village and 1 mill on the dollar for Plan 130.

Special levy for whatever sum is necessary to cover the cost of wood cutting on private properties as carried out during the year 1943 under the direction of the Wood Inspector.

As to any such sums as may be necessary to meet arrears due to the Hydro Electric Power Commission to be levied against such properties as may be concerned.

The General Tax Rate has been reduced one mill by reason of the Provincial Subsidy to Municipalities and such rate for the year 1944 has been further reduced by an extra one mill for the purpose of reducing its taxation level for
