A By. Law to appoint a Clerk & Treasurer, an Assessor, a Collector, Two Auditors, and Members of Board of Health and Poundkeeper for the Village of Sutton for the current year
Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton

- 1st That Peter McClellan be and is hereby appointed Clerk and Treasurer
- 2nd That Henry Treboar be and is hereby appointed Assessor
- 3rd That John Durnell be and is hereby appointed Collector
- 4th That John R. Bouchier and Wm Fry be and are hereby appointed Auditors
- 5th That Robert Nicol, James Abbie & Henry Berry be and are hereby constituted the Board of Health with Dr J. B. Bentley as Medical Health Officer
- 6th And for the due performance of the duties of said Offices they shall receive as follows

By-Law No 20

A By-Law to authorize the Reeve and Treasurer of the Village of Sutton to borrow a certain sum to meet current expenditure of the Village

Whereas it is necessary to make provision by way of a temporary loan for the purpose of providing funds to defray the ordinary expenditure of the Village

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton

1st That the Reeve and Treasurer be and are hereby authorized under the seal of the Corporation to obtain a loan from the Bank or from any person in such a manner as may be in the interest of the Village said loan not to exceed three hundred dollars and to be repaid on or before the first day of December next

A By-Law to prohibit the running of
Bicycles on the sidewalks in the
Village of Sutton

Be it enacted by the Council of the
Corporation of the Village of Sutton
and it is hereby enacted by the
authority of the same

1st

That on and after the passing
of this By-Law all Bicycles be and
are hereby prohibited from being
run on the sidewalks in the
said Village of Sutton

2nd

That any person violating the
provisions of this By-Law shall be
liable to a fine of not less than one
dollar nor more than ten dollars
for each and every offence. Every such
penalty may be recovered by any person
before any one or more of Her Majesty's
Justices of the Peace having jurisdiction
in this Municipality; and shall be
levied by distress and sale of goods
and chattles of the offender with
the costs of suit and of such
distress and sale by warrant
under the hands and seals of the
justice or justices before whom the
said fine and costs were ordered
to be paid, and in default of
sufficient distress the said
justice or justices may

Commit the offender to the Common
Goal for the County of York at Toronto
for any time not exceeding ten days
with or without hard labor un-
less the said amount of fine and
costs are sooner paid

That the rates imposed by this By-Law shall be collected and paid over to the Treasurer of this Corporation in Bankable Funds on or before the 15th day of November 1892 by the Collector of rates for the said Village of Sutton in so far as the law will enable him so to do
