A By-Law to appoint a Clerk & Treasurer, an Assessor, two Auditors, a Poundkeeper, three Fence Viewers, a Board of Health, a Medical Health Officer, a Village Constable and a Sanitary Inspector for the Village of Sutton for the current year

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same

1<sup>st</sup> That Peter McCollan be and is hereby appointed Clerk and Treasurer

2<sup>nd</sup> That George Cuttle be and is hereby appointed Assessor

3<sup>rd</sup> That Wm Fry and John R Bouchier be and are hereby appointed Auditors

4<sup>th</sup> That R. H. Berry be and is hereby appointed Poundkeeper

5<sup>th</sup> That Simpson Horner, R. Burch and Amos Millard be and are hereby appointed Fence Viewers

6<sup>th</sup> That Arthur Anderson, R. Nicol Richard Dalton and The Reeve and Clerk be and are hereby appointed and constituted the Local Board of Health with J. B. Bentley M.D. as Medical Health Officer and Emerson Earl as Sanitary Inspector

7<sup>th</sup> That Emerson Earl be and is hereby appointed Village Constable

8<sup>th</sup> That the following Officers shall receive for the due performance of the duties of said Offices as follows

The Clerk & Treasurer	\$ 60.00
The Assessor	\$ 15.00
The Auditors each	\$ 2.00

9<sup>th</sup> That the Treasurer furnish to this Council satisfactory security to the amount of \$ 2000<sup>00</sup>

10<sup>th</sup> And that all other By-Laws or parts of By-Laws inconsistent with this By-Law be and the same are hereby repealed

## By-Law No 40

A By-Law to authorize the Reeve and Treasurer of the Village of Sutton to borrow certain <sup>sums</sup> to meet the current expenditures of the Village.

Whereas it is necessary to make provision by way of temporary loans to defray the ordinary expenditures of the Village.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same

That the Reeve and Treasurer be empowered under the seal of the Corporation to negotiate a loan or loans with any person or persons in such manner as may be in the interest of the Village for such sum or sums as may be necessary not to exceed in the whole the sum of four hundred dollars, and to be repaid on or before the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December 1895

 A By-Law to provide for the payment of a  
 License by Travelling Shows Circus Companies  
 Merry-go-rounds &c.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal  
 Council of the Corporation of the Village  
 of Sutton and it is hereby enacted by  
 the authority of the same

1<sup>st</sup>

That before showing or erecting  
 their tents within the limits of the said  
 Village of Sutton every Show Company or  
 Circus Company must obtain a License  
 from the Treasurer of the said Village  
 of Sutton for which License they shall  
 pay for the first day of show the  
 sum of ten dollars and for the second  
 and each succeeding day the sum of  
 five dollars

2<sup>nd</sup>

That for the privilege of running  
 a merry-go-round or other similar  
 amusement the Company or owner  
 of such merry-go-round or other  
 similar amusement shall pay to  
 the Treasurer of this Corporation  
 for the first day the sum of four  
 dollars and for the second and  
 each succeeding day the sum of  
 two dollars

3<sup>rd</sup>

Any person or persons ne-  
 glecting or refusing to comply with  
 the provisions of this By-Law shall  
 incur a fine or penalty not  
 exceeding ten dollars to be recovered  
 for the use of the municipality by  
 summary proceedings before a

Justice of the Peace upon complaint  
of the Treasurer of the Municipality or any  
ratepayer thereof

4<sup>th</sup>

That every fine or penalty imposed  
by this By-Law may be recovered and  
enforced with costs by summary con-  
viction before any Justice of the Peace of  
the County of York, and in default of  
payment - the offender, or offenders may  
be committed to the Common Gaol  
of the County, there to be imprisoned for  
any time in the discretion of the convicting  
and committing Justice not exceeding  
Ten days, unless the fine or penalty  
and costs including the cost of com-  
mittal be sooner paid

## By-Law No 45-

A By-Law to provide for the Levying of County, School, R. Road and Village rates for the Corporation of the Village of Sutton for the year 1895 A. D.

Be it-Therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton and it-is hereby enacted by the authority of the same

That the following rates be levied and collected upon all the rateable property of the said Village of Sutton for the year A. D. 1895 for the purposes hereinafter set forth viz:

- 1<sup>st</sup> For County General Purpose and Industrial Home a rate of  $1\frac{5}{10}$  mills on the \$
- 2<sup>nd</sup> For Township R. Road Debentures a rate of 2 mills on the \$
- 3<sup>rd</sup> For Village Purposes a rate of  $4\frac{8}{10}$  mills on the \$
- 4<sup>th</sup> For Union School Section No 1 of Sutton and Georgina as per School Boards request a rate of  $5\frac{5}{10}$  mills on the \$
- 5<sup>th</sup> For Debentures for School House a rate of  $1\frac{7}{10}$  mills on the \$
- 6<sup>th</sup> For School Section No 3 of North Gwillimbury a rate of  $2\frac{3}{4}$  mills on the \$

7<sup>th</sup> For School Section No 7 of North Swillimbury  
a rate of 2 mills on the \$

8<sup>th</sup> That the foregoing school rates are to be  
levied each upon their respective portions  
of the property of the said Village of Sutton

9<sup>th</sup> That the rates imposed by this By-Law  
shall be collected and paid to the  
Treasurer of this Corporation in Bank-  
able Funds on or before the Fifteenth  
December A. D. 1895 by the Collector of rates  
for the said Village of Sutton in so far  
as the law will enable him so to do

The whole amount of Taxes to be collected and paid over by the fifteenth day of December next
