8<sup>th</sup> That Amos Wilson be and is hereby appointed a member of the Board of Health for a period of Three (3) years. Who with the members whose several terms of membership have yet unexpired, together with the Reeve and Clerk shall constitute the Local Board of Health for the current year, with C. J. Noble S<sup>r</sup> and as Health Officer and W. Brink as Sanitary Inspector

9<sup>th</sup> That William J. Brooks be and is hereby appointed Manu. Officer and Village Constable

10<sup>th</sup> That the following officers shall receive for the due performance of the duties of the said offices as follows

The Clerk, Thirty Dollars (\$30.00)  
 The Treasurer, Twelve Dollars (\$12.00)  
 The Assessor, Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00)  
 The Collector, Twenty Dollars (\$20.00)  
 The Auditors Each Two Dollars (\$2.00)  
 The Manu. Officer Five Dollars (\$5.00)

11<sup>th</sup> That the Treasurer and Collector furnish to this Council Satisfactory Security to the amount of Two Thousand ~~and~~ (\$2000.00) Dollars Each

12<sup>th</sup> And That all other By Laws a part of By Laws in consistent with this By Law be and are hereby repealed

By Law - 59

A By-Law to Authorize the Reeve and Treasurer of the Village of Sutton to borrow certain Sums of Money to Meet the Current Expenditure of the Village

Whence it is necessary to make provision by way of temporary loans to defray the necessary Expenditures of the Village

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton and it is hereby enacted by the Authority of the Same

1<sup>st</sup> That the Reeve and Treasurer be empowered under the Seal of the Corporation to negotiate a loan or loans with any person or persons in such amount as may be in the best interest of the Corporation for such sum or sums of money as may be deemed best to exceed in the whole the sum of Four Hundred (\$400.00) Dollars

2<sup>nd</sup> That the said Loan or Loans shall be repaid on or before December Fifteenth of the Current Year

## By-Law No 61

A By-Law to provide for the Levying of County School, School Debiture and Village rate for the corporation of the Village of Sutton for the year 1897

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton and it is hereby enacted by the Authority of the Same

- 1<sup>st</sup> That the following rates be levied and collected upon all the rateable property within the Village for the year 1897 for the purposes hereinafter set forth
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> for County purposes and Industrial Home a rate of 15/100 Mills on the Dollar
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> for Village purposes a rate of 6 Mills on the Dollar
  - 4<sup>th</sup> for Union School Section No 1 Sutton and Georgia as per School Boards request a rate of 5 Mills on the Dollar.
  - 5<sup>th</sup> for Village share of School Debiture a rate of 1 1/2 Mills on the Dollar

 of this Corporation in bankable funds  
 on or before the fifteenth day of December

A By-Law to amend By-Law No 43

Whereas it has become expedient to amend  
By-Law No 43 of the Village of Sutton

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council

amended by inserting after the word "pounded"  
in the sixth line the words "a distress warrant"  
shall issue against the goods and chattels of  
the party or parties so offending and in  
default of sufficient distress"
