

By Law No. 81.

A. By Law for appointing Officers for the Municipality of the Village of Sutton for the year 1901, and for fixing the salaries of the same.

A. By Law to appoint a Clerk, a Treasurer, an Assessor, a Collector, two Auditors, two Janitors, three Fence Viewers, a Village Constable, one Member of the Board of Health, a Medical Health Officer, a Sanitary Inspector, and a Mount Officer for the Village of Sutton for the current year 1901.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton and it is hereby enacted by authority of the same.

1<sup>st</sup> That Edw. Darnwood, he and he is hereby appointed Clerk.

2<sup>nd</sup> That Richard Clutidge, he and he is hereby appointed Treasurer.

3<sup>rd</sup> That George Kettle, he and he is hereby appointed Assessor.

4<sup>th</sup> That Archer Durell, he and he is hereby appointed Collector.

9<sup>th</sup> That Mr. E. Sheppard be and he is  
 hereby appointed Quaint Officer and  
 Police Constable.

10<sup>th</sup> That the following Officers shall receive  
 payment for the due and proper  
 performance of the duties of their  
 several Offices as follows.

10<sup>th</sup> By The Clerk. Forty Dollars  
 The Treasurer Fifteen Dollars  
 " Assessor. Fifteen Dollars  
 " Collector Twenty Dollars  
 Each Auditor Two Dollars

 Village Constable  $\frac{3}{4}$  Five Dollars  
 above and above the fees provided by  
 the Statutes for certain services.

11. That the Treasurer and Collector  
 shall each separately furnish to the  
 Council satisfactory security to the  
 amount of two thousand dollars

 By Laws inconsistent with this  
 By Law be and the same are  
 hereby repealed.

A. By Law to provide for the levying of County, School and Village Rates for the year 1901.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton, and it is hereby enacted by Authority of the same

1<sup>st</sup> That the following rates be levied, and collected, upon all the taxable property within the Village of Sutton for the year 1901. for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

2<sup>d</sup> For the County General purposes, a rate of  $14\frac{1}{10}$  Mills in the Dollar, and for the Industrial Home, a rate of  $2\frac{1}{10}$  Mills in the Dollar.

3 For the Village purposes a rate of  $3\frac{2}{10}$  Mills in the Dollar

4 For Union School Section No. 1 Sutton and Georgia as per School Boards request a rate of  $5\frac{2}{10}$  Mills in the Dollar.
