Resolved for Appointing Officers for the Municipality of the Village of Sutton for the year 1912. and for fixing the Salaries of the same.

A. By Ord. to Appoint a Clerk, a Treasurer, an Assessor, a Collector, an Auditor, an Inspector, three Free Viewers, a Village Constable one Member of the Board of Health a Medical Health Officer, a Sanitary Inspector and a Court Officer for the year 1912.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton, and it is hereby enacted by authority of the same.

1st That James R. Dorman be and he is hereby appointed Clerk

2nd That Richard Shurtz be and he is hereby appointed Treasurer

3rd That George Smith be and he is hereby appointed Assessor

4th That Robert Bural be and he is hereby appointed Collector

5th That A. Leroyer and William Fry be and they are hereby appointed Auditors.

6th That Peter Frank and Simpson Homer be and they are hereby appointed Poundkeepers.

7th That C. P. Pouch, A. McKeard and Peter Frank be and they are hereby appointed Sewer Viewers.

8th That Robert Donnell be and he is hereby appointed a member of the Board of Health for a period of (3) three years, who with those members whose term of office has not expired together with the Deane and Clerk, shall constitute the Local Board of Health for the current year (1902), with Dr. A. B. Greenwood as Medical Health Officer and W. E. Sheppard as Sanitary Inspector.

9th That D. E. Sheppard be and he is hereby appointed Village Constable and Beach Officer.

10th That the following Officers shall receive payment for the due and proper performance of the duties of their several offices as follows.

By Law. 6: 86.

1. Law authorizing the taking of the Census of the Village of Sutton in the County of York and to appoint an Enumerator or Enumerators for that purpose.

2. It is enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton and it is hereby enacted by authority of the Council, under the Municipal Act R.S.O. Chap. 223. Sect 530. Sub. Sect 1

1st That when application has been made to the Council asking that a Census of the inhabitants of the said Village of Sutton be taken. Therefore be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton That such Census be immediately commenced and carried out, and returns made of the same not later than the second day of September 1902

2^d That John Mead and Richard Park be and they are hereby appointed Enumerators for the taking of the said Census

Ord. Law. No. 87.

At By Law to provide for the levying of County, School, and Village rates for the Village of Sutton for the year 1902.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton, and it is hereby enacted by authority of the same

1st That the following rates be levied, and collected upon all the rateable property within the Village of Sutton for the year 1902 for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

2nd For the County General purposes a rate of $1\frac{2}{10}$ Mills in the Dollar.
For the County Special Debenture Debt a rate of $1\frac{1}{10}$ Mills in the Dollar
and for the Industrial Home a rate of $3\frac{1}{10}$ Mills in the Dollar

3rd For Union School Section No. 1, Sutton and Georgian as per School Boards request a rate of $5\frac{7}{10}$ Mills in the Dollar.

4th For the Village purposes a rate of
47/10 Mills on the Dollar.

5th That the rate imposed by this By Law
shall be collected and paid to the
Treasurer of this Corporation in
Bankable funds on or before the
15th day of December 1902 by the
Collector of Taxes for the said
Village of Sutton, in so far as the
law enables him so to do
