Appointing Officers for the Municipality of the Village of Sutton for the year 1903

A By Law to appoint a Clerk, a Treasurer, a Collector, an Assessor, two Auditors, two Poundkeepers, three Fence Viewers, a Village Constable, one member of the Board of Health, a Medical Health Officer, a Sanitary Inspector and a Street Officer for the year 1903

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same

- 1st That J. G. Lemayne be and is hereby appointed Clerk
- 2 That Richard Sturbridge be and is hereby appointed Treasurer -
- 3 That Richard Burch be and is hereby appointed Collector.
- 4 That George Cuttle be and is hereby appointed Assessor
- 5 That A. Crozier and Wm Fry be and are hereby appointed Auditors -
- 6 That Simpson Horner and Peter Grant be and are hereby appointed Pound Keepers.

- 7 That Amos Millard be and is hereby appointed a member of the Board of Health for a period of three (3) years and that W. Greenwood be and is hereby appointed Medical Health Officer and that W. E. Sheppard be and is hereby appointed Sanitary Inspector.
- 8 That W. E. Sheppard be and is hereby appointed Insect Officer
- 9 That W. E. Sheppard be and is hereby appointed Village Constable.
- 10 That the following officers shall receive payment for the due and proper performance of their several offices as follows

By Law No 91

To provide a Polling Place and appoint a Deputy Returning Officer for the voting for issuing debentures for the purpose of building a Town Hall

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton

Whereas it is necessary to secure the assent of the majority of the Electors under the Municipal Act

That on Monday April 25th 1903 at the hour of 9 o'clock in the forenoon the Poll will be open to take the votes of the qualified Electors of the said Municipality on said By Law and the Poll will close at 5 o'clock in the afternoon of the same day -

The place for taking said vote and the Deputy Returning Officer respectively shall be Sheppard's Hall and F. G. Henneage

BY-LAW NO 22

To raise the sum of \$3,000.00 to be expended in erecting a Town Hall and Council Chamber for the Village of Sutton.

Whereas the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton deems it advisable to erect a Town Hall and Council Chamber for the use of said Village and to borrow for said purpose upon the credit of the Municipality the sum of Three Thousand Dollars.

And whereas to raise the said sum the said Council deems it advisable to extend payment for the same over a period of twenty years by the issue of Debentures, bearing interest at four per cent. per annum, extending over a period of twenty years as aforesaid, repayable by annual instalments of both Principal and Interest, such instalments to so be arranged that the aggregate amount of Principal and Interest payable in any one year shall be equal to what is payable for Principal and Interest in each of the other years during the said term.

And whereas the total amount to be raised annually by special rate sufficient therefor on all the rateable property of the municipality for paying the said Debt and Interest will be the sum of Two Hundred and Twenty Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$220.74) each year during the said period of twenty years.

And whereas the amount of the whole rateable property (liable to taxation for such purposes) according to the last revised Assessment Roll being for the year 1902 is the sum of One Hundred and Forty-One Thousand Seven Hundred and Twenty-Five Dollars (\$141,725.00)

And whereas no Debenture Debt exists,

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton as follows:

1. That the Reeve is hereby authorized and required to issue Debentures of the said Corporation to the amount of Three Thousand Dollars, which shall be marked, and known as "The Town Hall Debentures" and shall be in sums of not less than One Hundred Dollars each and shall be sealed with the Corporate Seal of the said Corporation and signed by the Reeve and Treasurer thereof and shall be payable within twenty years from the date herein-after mentioned for this By-Law to come into effect, at the Metropolitan Bank in the said Village of Sutton, with interest at four per centum per annum as follows, that is to say, the said Principal sum in twenty annual instalments and the interest at the rate aforesaid annually during said term, the aggregate amount of such instalments of Principal and annual payment of interest shall be the sum of \$220.74 in each year.

2. For the purpose of paying the said sum of Three Thousand Dollars and to cover interest on the said amount as aforesaid the sum of \$220.74 shall be levied by a special rate over and above all other rates in the same manner and at the same time as other taxes are levied upon the whole rateable property of the said Village liable to be rated therefor in each year for the period of twenty years from the date herein-after mentioned for this By-Law to take effect, during which the said Debentures have to run.

3. This By-Law shall come into force and take effect on the 23rd day of July, 1903, if previously assented by the Electors of this Corporation legally qualified to vote thereon.

4. This By-Law shall be submitted for the assent of the Electors of said Village under the provisions of the Municipal Act, and on Monday, the 20th day of April, A.D. 1903, at the hour of 9 o'clock in the forenoon, the poll will be opened to take the votes of the qualified Electors of the said Municipality on said By-Law and the poll will close at 5 o'clock in the afternoon on same day.

5. The place for taking said vote and the Deputy Returning Officer of said Village shall be respectively as follows:

Sheppard's Hall and F. G. Tremayne, D.R.O.

6. That on Wednesday, the 1st day of April, A.D. 1903, at the hour of eight o'clock in the afternoon, at the Council Chamber of the said Village, the Reeve shall appoint in writing the persons to attend at the polling place and at the final summing of the votes on behalf of the persons interested in and promoting or opposing respectively the passing of this By-Law.

7. That the Clerk of the said Municipality shall attend at the Council Chamber in the said Village at 12 o'clock, noon, on Wednesday, the 22nd day of April, A.D. 1903, to sum up the votes given for and against this By-Law.

NOTICE.

Is hereby given that the foregoing is a true copy of a proposed By-Law which has been taken into consideration and which will be finally passed by the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton, in the event of the assent of the Electors being obtained thereto, after one month from the first publication in the Newmarket Express-Herald, the date of which first publication was on the 27th day of March, 1903, and that at the hour, day and place therein fixed for taking the votes of the Electors the poll will be held.

By Law No 93

A By Law to provide for the levying of County School and Village Rates for the Village of Sutton for the year 1903

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton and it is hereby enacted by authority of the same -

- 1 That the following rates be levied and collected upon all the rateable property within the Village of Sutton for the year 1903 for the purpose hereinafter set forth
- 2 For the County General Purposes a rate of $1\frac{1}{10}$ mill in the dollar
For the County Special Debt a rate of $2\frac{1}{10}$ mill in the dollar and for the Industrial Home a rate of $2\frac{1}{10}$ mill in the dollar
- 3 For Union School Section No 1 Sutton and Georgia as per School Boards request a rate of $4\frac{7}{10}$ mills in the dollar
- 4 For Village Purposes a rate of $4\frac{7}{10}$ mills in the dollar
- 5 That the rates imposed by this By-Law shall be collected and paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation in Receivable Funds on or before the 15th day of December 1903 by the Collector of Rates for the said Village of Sutton in so far as the law enables him so to do
