A By-Law to appoint Officers for the Village of Sutton for the year 1907

Be it enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Sutton

- 1<sup>st</sup> That J. G. Lemayn be and is hereby appointed Clerk
- 2<sup>nd</sup> That R. Stutrage be and is hereby appointed Treasurer.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> That Leo Little be and is hereby appointed Assessor
- 4<sup>th</sup> That John McDonald be and is hereby appointed Collector
- 5<sup>th</sup> That N. W. Puigle be and is hereby appointed Medical Health Officer
- 6<sup>th</sup> That Marlin McLaughlin be and is hereby appointed a member of the Board of Health
- 7<sup>th</sup> That Amos Bullard and John Cannon be and are hereby appointed Fence Viewers
- 8<sup>th</sup> That Peter Grant and A. Charpentier be and are hereby appointed Pound Keepers.
- 9<sup>th</sup> That W. E. Sheppard be and is hereby appointed Constable, Tread Office and Sanitary Inspector
- 10 That A. Crozier and Wm Fry be and are hereby appointed Auditors
- 11 That each officer shall receive for the due and proper performance of his duties as follows

The Assessor      Only Five Dollars  
 The Collector      Twenty Five Dollars  
 Each Auditor      Two Dollars & fifty Cents

12<sup>th</sup> That the Treasurer and Collector shall each severally furnish to the Council satisfactory security to the amount of \$1200 at least

13<sup>th</sup> That all By Laws and parts of By Laws inconsistent with this By Law be and the same are hereby repealed.

## By-Law No 109

A By-Law to authorize the Reeve and Treasurer of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton to borrow certain sums of money to meet the current expenditures of the Village

Whereas it is necessary to make provision by way of temporary loans to defray the ordinary expenditures of the Village

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton and it is hereby enacted by authority of the same

That the Reeve and Treasurer be empowered under the Seal of the Corporation to negotiate a loan or loans with any person or persons in such manner as may be in the interests of the Village for such sum or sums of money as may be necessary, not to exceed in the whole the sum of Seven Hundred Dollars and to be repaid on or before the fifteenth day of December 1907

By Law No 110  
 A By Law to provide for Levying  
 County, School, Debtors and  
 Village Rates for the year 1907

Be it enacted by the Municipal  
 Council of the Village of Sutton  
 that the following rates be levied  
 and collected upon all the  
 rateable property within the  
 Village of Sutton for the year  
 1907 for the purposes herein-  
 after set forth:

For County General Purposes, Debtors  
 and Industrial Home a rate of  
 $1\frac{2}{10}$  mills on the dollar

For Union School Section No 1 Sutton and  
 Georgina a rate of 6 mills on the dollar

For Town Hall Debtors a rate of  
 1 mill on the dollar

For Village General Purposes a rate of 6  
 mills on the dollar

That the rates imposed by this By-Law  
 shall be collected and paid to the Treasurer  
 of this Corporation in Bankable Funds on  
 or before the 15<sup>th</sup> day of December 1907 by the  
 Collector in so far as the law will  
 enable him so to do.

By Law No 111  
 To give consent to Susannah J. Anderson of the Township of North Guillembury in the County of York to lay out certain streets within the Corporation of the Village of Sutton less than 66 feet in width.

Whereas Susannah J. Anderson of the said Township of North Guillembury is desirous of laying out certain streets within the Corporation of the Village of Sutton less than 66 feet in width and has applied to the Municipal Council of the said Village of Sutton for leave to do so.

And whereas, under the provisions of Sub Sec 2 of Sec 630 of "The Consolidated Municipal Act 1903" no Highway or Street of a less width than 66 feet shall be laid out by any owner of land without the consent of the Council of the Municipality by a three fourths vote of the members thereof.

And whereas the said Council by a three fourths vote of the members of said Council have by resolution thereof agreed to pass this By-Law to give their assent to her application.

Be It Therefore Enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton that the said Susannah

J. Anderson be and is hereby authorized to lay out four certain streets as shown on a plan of survey made by W. E. Garrard P. L. S. for said Susannah J. Anderson being a subdivision of registered plans Nos. 66 + 69 of a portion of the said Village of Sutton and of the lands included therein which streets are known on said plan as Georgina Avenue, Sincob Avenue, Jackson's Point Avenue and Lake Street and which streets or avenues are of the following widths, viz - Georgina Avenue, Sincob Avenue, Jackson's Point Avenue each forty feet in width and Lake Street twenty feet in width

And be it further enacted that the Corporation by the passing of this By-Law does not assume said streets or any portions thereof
