By Law No.

121

A By Law to authorize the Reeve and Treasurer of the Village of Sutton to borrow certain sums of money to meet the current expenditures of the Village.

Whereas it is necessary to make provisions by way of temporary loans to defray the ordinary expenditures of the Village.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton.

That the Reeve and Treasurer be empowered under the seal of the Corporation to negotiate a loan or loans with any person or persons in such manner as may be in the interests of the Village for such sum of money as may be necessary (not to exceed in the whole the sum of Eight Hundred Dollars,) the said loan to be repaid on or before the fifteenth day of December 1909.

A By-Law to provide for Levying  
County, School, Debenlure and  
Village rates for the year 1909

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council  
of the Village of Sutton

That the following rates be levied  
and collected upon all the ~~rateable~~  
property in the Village of Sutton  
for the year 1909

For County General Purposes, Debenlure and Industrial  
Home a rate of 1.6 mills in the dollar

For Union School S.S. no 1 Sutton and Georgia a  
rate of 4.8 mills in the dollar

For Town Hall Debenlure a rate of .9 mills in the  
dollar -

For Village General Purposes a rate of 5.5 mills  
in the dollar -

That the rates imposed by this By-Law shall  
be collected and paid to the Treasurer of  
this Corporation in Bankable funds on or before  
the 15<sup>th</sup> day of December 1909 by the  
Collector in so far as the law will  
enable him so to do
