2 Any dog found at large and un-
muzzled shall be impounded
and if not redeemed by the owner as
improved within forty eight hours shall
be destroyed

3 The owner of any dog found at large
and unmuzzled shall be liable on
summary conviction to a fine of
not less than \$2⁰⁰ or more than
\$200⁰⁰ with costs

By-Law No. 15 ¹²⁵

A BY-LAW to authorize the Sutton and North Gwillimbury Co-Operative Telephone Company, Limited, to erect and maintain poles and wires on certain ~~streets~~ public streets of the municipality of the village of Sutton West in the County of York.

The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the village of Sutton West enacts as follows.-

1- THAT THE Sutton and North Gwillimbury Co-Operative Telephone Company, Limited, have the right to use any street of this municipality subject to the approval of the Road and Bridge Committee for the purpose of erecting poles and wires thereon and for maintaining the same, and for the conduct of a telephone business.

2- THE LOCATION of the poles upon the highway and the quality, size and length of the poles and the construction work shall be under the approval of the Road and Bridge Committee, and said work shall not interfere with the traffic in any street or with the business of any private citizen.

3- THE SAID COMPANY shall not have the exclusive right for said franchise and shall make good any damage that may occur to any person travelling on the highway during the construction and operation of the said telephone line and the said company shall be liable to the parties aggrieved for any damage to persons or property.

By-Law No 126

A By-Law to prohibit spitting in Public Places in the Village of Sutton

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton

That all spitting on sidewalks and pavements and in the passage ways stairways and entrances to buildings used by the public and in rooms, halls buildings and places to which the public resort is ~~usually~~ prohibited.

That any person or persons who shall contravene any of the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to a fine of not less than Two Dollars and costs or more than Ten Dollars and costs for each offence.

Every such penalty may be recovered by any person before any one or more of the Justices of the Peace or a Police Magistrate having jurisdiction in the Municipality and shall be levied by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the offender together with the costs of such distress and sale by warrant levied under the hands and seal of the Convicting Justice or Justices or Police Magistrate before whom the same was recovered and in default of sufficient distress the said Justice Justices or Police Magistrate may commit the offender to the County

A By Law to authorize the Head and Treasurer
of the Corporation of the Village of Saulton
to borrow certain sums to meet the now current
expenditure

By-Law 127 Repealed

A By-Law to prohibit Horses, Buggies and other vehicles from being driven or allowed to be on or over the sidewalks, boulevards and pathways of the Village of Sutton.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton

That all carriages, wagons, bicycles, sleighs, automobiles or other vehicles and conveyances of any description are prohibited from being upon or being used, drawn or propelled along or upon any sidewalk, pathway or footpath used by or set apart for the use of pedestrians and forming part of any street, avenue or other means of public communication in the Village of Sutton.

That any person contravening any of the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable on conviction to a fine of not less than two dollars or more than ten dollars together with costs of conviction to be recovered before any Justice or Justices of the Peace or Police Magistrate having jurisdiction in this Municipality and shall be levied by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the offender together with the costs of such distress and sale by warrant issued under the hands and seals of the convicting Justice or Justices of the Peace or Police Magistrate before whom the same was recovered and in default of sufficient distress the said Justice, Justices or Police Magistrate may commit the offender to the Common Gaol of the County for any term not exceeding twenty days with or without hard labour unless the amount imposed and costs be sooner paid -

A By-Law to provide for Levying County, School
Debtenture and Village Rates for the year
1910.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of

upon all the rateable property within the

For County General Purposes, Debtenture and Industrial
Home a rate of $1\frac{4}{10}$ mills in the dollar

For Union School Section No 1 Sutton & Georgia a rate of
 $4\frac{5}{10}$ mills in the dollar

For Town Hall Debtenture a rate of $\frac{8}{10}$ of a mill in the dollar

For Village General Purposes a rate of $5\frac{5}{10}$ mills in
the dollar.

That the rates imposed by this By-Law shall be
collected and paid to the Treasurer of this
Corporation in Bankable Funds on or before
the 15th day of December 1910 by the Collector
in so far as the law will enable him so to
do.

By-Law 130

A By-Law to impose a license on Box Ball or Bowling Alleys -

Whereas by Section 583 Chapter 19 Edw VII authority is given to Councils of Villages to pass By-Laws licensing Bowling Alleys and other places of amusement and for fixing the sum of money to be paid for such license

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton as follows

- 1 That on and after the passing of this By-Law it shall be unlawful for anyone to open or operate a Box Ball Alley or Bowling Alley within the limits of the said Village without first obtaining from the Treasurer of the Village a license therefor.
- 2 That the fee for such license shall be for one year Fifty Dollars for the first Alley and Fifteen Dollars for each additional Alley
- 3 That anyone violating the provisions of this By-Law shall upon conviction before any Justice or Justices of the Peace having jurisdiction be liable to a fine not exceeding Ten Dollars and ~~costs~~ or less than Five Dollars and costs of prosecution and in default of payment within the time limited by the convicting Justice or Justices a distress Warrant shall issue for the sale of the offenders goods and chattels and in default of sufficient distress being found to satisfy such fine and costs the offender shall be committed to the Common Gaol of the County for any term not exceeding twenty days with or without

hard labour in the discretion of the con-
victing justice or justices unless
such fine and costs and cost of
commitment be sooner paid.

H Each license issued under
authority of this By-Law shall be signed
by the Reeve and Treasurer and shall
continue in force for one year from
the date thereof.
