

By-Law No. ¹³¹

A By-Law to provide for the establishment of a Public Library in the Village of Sutton,

Whereas a majority of the directors of the Public Library Board have petitioned the Council of the Village of Sutton, praying for the establishment of a Public Library under the Public Libraries Act.

1.—Be it therefore enacted by the said municipal Council of the said Village of Sutton that in case the assent of the electors is given to this By-Law a Public Library be established in this Municipality in accordance with the provisions of the Public Libraries Act.

2.—And be it further enacted the votes of the electors be taken on this By-Law on Monday, the second day of January 1911 commencing at nine o'clock in the morning and continuing until five o'clock in the afternoon at the undermentioned place.

3.—That on the Tenth day of December A.D. 1910, at the Clerk's office in the Village of Sutton, at the hour of eight o'clock in the afternoon the reeve shall appoint in writing, signed by himself two persons to attend at the final summing up of the votes by the clerk, and one person to attend at the polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of promoting the passing of this by-law, and a like number on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of opposing the passing of this by-law.

4.—That the Clerk of the said Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton shall attend at the Council Chamber at the hour of 12 o'clock noon on the fourth day of January A.D. 1911, to sum up the number of votes given for against this By-law.

That A. Millard and N. Cameron be appointed Fence Viewers -

That W. Holborn be appointed a member of the Board of Health.

That D. C. Noble be appointed Medical Health Officer

That W. E. Sheppard be appointed Constable, Trench Officer and Sanitary Inspector

BY-LAW No..

A By-Law to provide for levying County, School, Debenture and
Village Rates for the Year 1911.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of
Sutton.

That the following rates be levied and collected on all
the rateable property within the Village of Sutton for the
year 1911.

For County General Purposes, Debenture and Industrial Home
a rate of 2 Mills in the Dollar.

For Union School Section No. 1 Sutton and Georgina a rate
of 4.5 Mills in the Dollar.

For Public Library a rate of $\frac{4}{10}$ Mills in the Dollar.

For Town Hall Debenture a rate of $\frac{7}{10}$ Mills in the
Dollar.

For Village General Purposes a rate of $\frac{5.5}{10}$ Mills in the Dollar.

That the rates imposed by this By-Law shall be collected and
paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation in Bankable Funds on
or before the 15th. day of December 1911 by the Collector in so
far as the law will enable him so to do.

By Law No 234

To raise the sum of three thousand dollars for certain additions and improvements to the Public School Sutton.

Whereas the Public School Board has requested the Municipal Council of Sutton to pass a By-Law providing for the issue of debentures to raise the sum of three thousand dollars for the purpose of adding to and improving the Sutton Public School

And whereas to raise the said sum the said Municipal Council deems it advisable to extend payment for the same over a period of ten years by the issue of debentures bearing interest at $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent per annum extending over a period of ten years as aforesaid repayable by annual installments of both Principal and Interest such installments to be so arranged that the aggregate of Principal and Interest payable in any one year shall be equal to what is payable for Principal and Interest in each of the other years during the said term.

And whereas the total amount to be raised annually by special tax sufficient therefor on all the rateable property of the School Section will be the sum of three hundred and seventy nine dollars and fourteen cents each year during the said period of ten years.

And whereas the amount of the whole rateable property liable for taxation for such purposes is, according to the last revised Assessment Rolls for 1911, \$400,825⁰⁰,

And whereas the existing debt of the Village of Sutton at the present time is \$2,210⁴⁰/_{xx} of which no amount of either Principal or Interest is overdue.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton as follows

1. That the Reeve is hereby authorized and required to issue Debentures of the said Corporation to the amount of three thousand dollars which shall be marked and known as "School Debentures" and shall be issued in sums of not less than one hundred dollars each and shall be sealed with the Corporate Seal of the said Village of Sutton and signed by the Reeve and Treasurer thereof and shall be payable within ten years from the date hereinafter mentioned for this By-Law to come into effect at the office of the Treasurer of the said Village with interest at 4½ per cent per annum as follows that is to say - the said Principal Sum in ten annual installments and the Interest at the rate aforesaid annually during the said term the aggregate amount of such installments of Principal and Interest shall be the sum of \$379¹⁴/_{xx} in each year.
2. For the purpose of paying the said sum of three thousand dollars and to cover

Interest on the said amount as aforesaid the sum of Three Hundred and Seventy Nine Dollars and Fourteen Cents shall be levied by a special ~~the~~ rate over and above all other rates in the same manner and at the same time as other taxes are levied, upon the whole rateable property liable to be rated therefor in each year for the period of ten years from the date hereinafter mentioned for this By-Law to take effect during which the said Debentures have to run.

- 3 That this By-Law shall come into force and take effect on the 15th day of December A.D. 1911
