- 7th That Hector Cameron and A. Millard be appointed Fence Viewers
- 8th That A. Millard be appointed a Member of the Board of Health.

By Law no 238

A By Law to provide for putting oil on certain streets and parts thereof in the Village of Sutton

Whereas certain ratepayers being at least of those in the area affected and representing at least one half of the assessed value have petitioned The Council to have High Street from the Town Line to the Georgia Line and the Town Line from the Metropolitan Station to Wm McKays house treated with oil to keep down the dust
Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of Sutton

- 1 That the portion of the village of Sutton as above stated be set apart as an area to be sprinkled with oil.
- 2 That the cost thereof be defrayed as follows that is to say one third thereof by the village of Sutton and the remaining two thirds by a rate levied on the assessed value of the property within the above designated area said rate to be collected at the same time and in the same manner as the other rates are levied and collected in the said Village

By-Law No 239

A By-Law to provide for levying County School, Debenture and Village Rates for the year 1912

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton that the following rates be levied and collected upon all the rateable property in the Village of Sutton for the year 1912

For all County rates a rate of $1\frac{9}{10}$ mills in the dollar

For Union School Section No 1 Sutton and Georgina a rate of $7\frac{3}{10}$ mills in the dollar

For School Debenture a rate of $9\frac{1}{10}$ mills in the dollar ~~##~~

For Town Hall Debenture a rate of $7\frac{1}{10}$ Mills in the dollar

For Public Library Purposes a rate of $4\frac{1}{10}$ Mills in the dollar.

For Street Paving on that portion of the Village as specified in By-Law No 238 a rate of $1\frac{3}{10}$ Mills in the dollar

For Village General Purpose rates a rate of $5\frac{1}{10}$ Mills in the dollar

That the rates imposed by this
By-law shall be collected and paid
to the Treasurer of this Corporation
in Bankable Funds on or before the
15th day of December 1912 by the
Collector in so far as the law will
enable him so to do.

By Law 240 Repealed

A By-Law to provide for the closing of certain shops in the Village of Sutton

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton that from and after date fixed in Section 2 of this By-Law all shops in the said Village dealing in Dry Goods, Clothing, Groceries, Hardware, Boots & shoes and all Baker-Shops and Butcher Shops shall be closed from and after seven o'clock in the afternoon until five o'clock on the following morning on each Monday, Wednesday and Friday from the first day of November until the thirtieth day of April in each year (save and except the week preceeding the 25th day of December)

That this By-Law shall come into force and take effect on the fourth day of November 1912

That any person or persons convicted of a breach of this By-Law before any Justice or Justices of the Peace having jurisdiction shall incur a penalty of not less than Two Dollars or more than Twenty Dollars and costs of prosecution and conviction and in default of payment a distress warrant shall issue against the goods and chattels of the person convicted and in default of sufficient distress being found to satisfy such fine and costs the

York for any term not exceeding
twenty days with or without
hard labour in the discretion of
the convicting justice or justices
unless such fine and costs and
