A By-Law to appoint Officers for
the Village of Sutton for the
year 1913

Be it enacted by the Corporation
of the Village of Sutton

That H. Penagnibé appointed
Clerk

That Richard Sturbridge be
appointed Treasurer.

That George Cuttle be appointed
Assessor.

That James Gélou be appointed
Collector

That A. Crozier and Luke M. Switzer
be appointed Assessors

That Mrs Millard and Hector Cameron
be appointed Juries Viewers

That Robert Downell be appointed a
member of the Board of Health.

That Dr. Noble be appointed Medical
Officer of Health

That C. E. Sheppard be appointed Constable
Sanitary Inspector and Health Officer

That each Officer shall receive for the due and proper performance of his duties over and above certain fees provided by the Statutes as follows

The Clerk	One Hundred Dollars
" Treasurer	Thirty Five "
" Assessor	Forty Five "
" Collector	Thirty Five "
" Medical Health Officer	Fifteen "
Each Auditor	Two ⁵⁰ / ₁₀₀ "
The Constable	
" Sanitary Inspector	
" Druggist Officer	Thirty Dollars

That the Treasurer and Collector shall furnish to the Council satisfactory security to the amount of \$2000⁰⁰

That all By-Laws and parts of By-Laws inconsistent with this By-Law be repealed.

By Law no 242

A By-Law to provide for levying County, School
Debt, Library and Village Rates for the
year 1913.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the
Village of Sutton

That the following rates be levied and collected
upon all the rateable property in the village
of Sutton for the year 1913.

$\frac{17}{10}$ For all County rates a rate of $\frac{17}{10}$ Mills in the dollar
For Union School Section Sutton and Georgia a
rate of 7 mills in the dollar

$\frac{9}{10}$ For School Debt a rate of $\frac{9}{10}$ of mill in the dollar

$\frac{7}{10}$ For Town Hall debt a rate of $\frac{7}{10}$ of mill in the dollar

$\frac{3}{10}$ For Public Library a rate of $\frac{3}{10}$ of mill in the dollar

$5\frac{5}{10}$ For Village General Purposes a rate of $5\frac{5}{10}$ Mills in the dollar

$\frac{15}{10}$ For Street Paving on that portion of the village affected
a rate of $\frac{15}{10}$ Mills in the dollar

$\frac{17.6}{1.5}$
 $\frac{16.1}{}$ That the rates imposed by this By-Law shall
be collected and paid to the Treasurer of this
Corporation in Bankable Funds on or before
the fourteenth day of December by the
Collector in so far as the law will enable him
so to do.
