246

A By-Law to license and regulate ~~the~~ Victualling and houses where fruit, fish, oysters, clams or vittuals are to be sold to be eaten therein under the provisions of Sub-section 4 Section 417 Chapter 192 R. S. O.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton.

I. That eating houses as defined in said Chapter 192 R. S. O. in the Village of Sutton shall procure a License from the Treasurer of the Village of Sutton.

Amended June 4th 1918 (vide folio 231) as follows "That any one violating the provisions of this By-Law shall upon conviction before any Justice or Justices of the Peace having jurisdiction be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty five dollars or less than five dollars and costs of prosecution and in default of payment within the time limited by the convicting Justice or Justices a distress warrant shall issue for the sale of the offenders goods and chattels and in default of sufficient distress being found to satisfy such fine and costs the offender shall be committed to the Common Jail of the County for any term not exceeding twenty days with or without hard labour in the discretion of the convicting Justice or Justices unless such fine and costs and cost of commitment be sooner paid

BY-LAW No. 247

A By-law to authorize the Head and Treasurer of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton to borrow certain sums to meet the now current expenditure.

WHEREAS the taxes levied for the current expenditure of the said Corporation for the year have not yet been fully collected, there being uncollected of such taxes a sum not less than the sum hereby authorized to be borrowed ;

AND WHEREAS the sum of One Thousand Dollars will be required to meet the current expenses of the said Corporation during the current year before the taxes levied therefor are collected, and it is expedient, subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, to authorize the Head and Treasurer to borrow the said sum ;

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton as follows :—

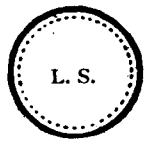
1st. That the Head, with the Treasurer of the said Corporation, be, and they are hereby authorized, under the seal of the Corporation, but only in the manner and subject to the conditions below mentioned, to borrow from **The Metropolitan Bank** the sum of One Thousand Dollars required to meet the now current expenditure of said Corporation ; provided always that the amount so borrowed and outstanding shall not at any time exceed the amount which may be legally borrowed, under the Consolidated Municipal Act, to meet the now current expenditure of said Corporation.

2nd. That the Head, with the Treasurer aforesaid, be, and they are hereby authorized to pay or allow the said Bank interest on the said sum so borrowed at the rate of Six per cent. per annum.

3rd. That ^{{ promissory note repayable on or before the last business day of the current year,} ~~{ an agreement in the form now approved by Council and initialed by the Clerk,~~ sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the Corporation by the Reeve and Treasurer be duly executed and given to the said Bank as aforesaid as security for the repayment of the amount borrowed with interest thereon as aforesaid.

BY-LAW No. 248

A By-Law to provide for levying County, School, Debenture and Village Rates for The Corporation of the Village of Sutton for the Year 1914

Be it enacted by The Corporation of the Village of Sutton.

That the following rates be levied and collected upon all the rateable property in the Village of Sutton for the year 1914

1. For all County Rates a rate of $1\frac{3}{10}$ Mills in the Dollar.
2. For Union School Section Sutton and Georgina a rate of $6\frac{4}{10}$ Mills in the Dollar.
3. For School Debenture a rate of $7\frac{1}{10}$ Mills in the Dollar.
4. For Town Hall Debenture a rate of $6\frac{1}{10}$ Mills in the Dollar.
5. For Public Library a rate of $3\frac{1}{10}$ Mills in the Dollar.
6. For Village General Purposes a rate of $5\frac{7}{10}$ Mills in the Dollar.

7. That the rates imposed by this By-Law shall be collected and paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation in Bankable Funds on or before the fourteenth day of December 1914 by the Collector in so far as the law will enable him so to do/
