A By-Law to appoint certain officers for the Village of Sutton for the year 1916

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton.

That S. Sennett be appointed Assessor

That Jas H. Tielson be appointed Collector

That R. L. Norman and W. J. Merchant be appointed Auditors

That H. Cameron and A. McIlard be appointed Fence Viewers

That W. E. Sheppard and Ezra Grant be appointed Pound Keepers

That W. E. Sheppard be appointed Constable
Treasurer and Sanitary Inspector

That J. F. Lavery and R. E. J. Noble be appointed a Board of Health

That C. J. Noble M.D. be appointed Medical Officer of Health.

That each officer shall receive for the due performance of his office in addition to certain fees provided for by statute the following sums, that is to say.

4. That such Licensee shall not permit any playing at any of such tables from 11 O'clock, Saturday evening until 8 O'clock following next Monday morning; and on all other days of the week, after 11 P.M. until 8 O'clock following morning; whether for Gain or otherwise;

5. That it shall not be lawful for such Licensee to allow any in such Rooms where such Tables are located, without permission of the Parent ^{or Guardian} or parents of such child.

6. That it shall be lawful for the Chief Constable or other Peace Officer to enter in to such licensees Billiard Rooms at all reasonable times to inspect such premises, and see that the Provisions of this By-law is carried out.

7. That any licensee under this By-law shall be liable for any contravention of this By-law, whether by himself ~~and~~ employee or servant of his.

8. That any licensee under this By-law shall be liable to a fine of \$ 2500 a first offence and the sum of \$ 5000 for any offence of contravention of this By-law;

9. This Bylaw shall come into force immediately after the passing thereof.

to authorize and Provide for licensing and regulating Billiard Pool and Bagatelle tables in the Village of Sutton:

WHEREAS under the Provisions of Section 420. of The Municipal Act Chapter 192. R. S. O. 1914; Power is given Municipal Councils of villages, to pass By-laws licensing, regulating and governing persons, who for hire or gain, which directly or indirectly keep, or have in their possession, or on their premises, any Billiard Pool or Bagatelle Table, whether used or not, in a house of public entertainment or ~~any~~ Resort; for limiting the number of licenses to be granted; and the number of such Tables to be granted; and for Revoking and License Granted;

And Whereas it is deemed expedient by the Council of the Village of Sutton, to exercise the authority given by the said recited Act.;

Be it Therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton:-

1. That it shall not be lawful for any person or persons ~~directly or indirectly~~ to have in his or their possession, or on his or their premises for hire or gain, any billiard, Pool or bagatelle Table, ~~or keep or have a billiard, Pool or bagatelle Table~~, in a house of Public entertainment; or resort, whether such Table ~~or tables~~ are used or not; Without having first obtained a License therefor, as provided by this By-law;

2. That all applications for licenses under this By-law shall be by petition in writing to the Municipal Council of this Corporation; And on the prayer of such Petition being granted and the payment to the Treasurer of this Municipality of the following license fee, That is to say; For one Table \$ 15⁰⁰ and for each additional table in one room the sum of \$ 10⁰⁰, the said Applicant, or applicants shall be entitled to a License for one year from that date. Such License to be endorsed by the head of the Council of this Corporation, and attested by the said Treasurer;

That it shall not be lawful for the Licensee aforesaid to ~~engage in~~ any gambling, in the Room or rooms where such licenses be ~~obtained~~ on pain of forfeiture of such License on conviction.

That any person or persons, of any breach of this BY-LAW shall
be liable to a fine of not less than \$ _____, and not more than
Twenty dollars; in the discretion of the Convicting Justice or
Justices; and in default of payment forthwith, or at such time as
the Said Justices or Justice may permit, shall be imprisoned in -
the Common Gaol of the County of York at Toronto for not ~~less~~ ^{more} that
twenty days, unless the said fine or penalty be sooner paid;

That all the provisions of The Summary Conviction Act of Ontario
shall be applicable to this By-law;

By Law No 262

A By Law to provide for levying County, School Debenture, Library and Village rates for the Village of Sutton for the year 1916. Be it enacted by the Corporation of the Village of Sutton

That the following rates be levied and collected upon all the rateable property of the said Village for the year 1916

For all County Rates including the Provincial War Tax a rate of 7 mills in the dollar.

For Union S.S. No 1 Sutton & Georgina a rate of $6\frac{4}{10}$ mills in the dollar.

For Public School Debenture a rate of $7\frac{1}{10}$ mills in the dollar.

For Town Hall Debenture a rate of $\frac{6}{10}$ mill on the dollar.

For Public Library a rate of $3\frac{1}{10}$ mills in the dollar.

For Village General Purposes a rate of $5\frac{5}{10}$ in the dollar.

That the rates imposed by this By-Law shall be paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation in Bankable funds on or before the 15th day of December 1916 by the collector in so far as the Law will enable him as to ~~do~~ do passed in open Council this first day of September 1916
