BY-LAW No. 294 A

A By-Law for Licensing and regulating the granting of Licenses to Vendors of milk for human consumption in the Municipality of SUTTON.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton

1 That no one shall supply or furnish milk for human consumption in the said Village without first obtaining a license authorizing him so to do.

2 That no such license shall be granted until it has been certified by the Inspector appointed by this By-Law that the requirements as set forth in Sections 5.6.7.8&9. Chapter 221 R.S.O. have been complied with.

3 That the fee for such license shall be *one* dollars per year.

4 That any such license may be either suspended or cancelled on the Inspector reporting that any of the requirements of said Sections 5.6.7.8.&9. are being neglected or contravened.

5 That *J. F. Savary*, be appointed Inspector.

6 That anyone violating the provisions of this By-Law or the forenamed sections of Chapter 221 R.S.O. shall incur a penalty of not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$50.00 recoverable under The Ontario Summary Conviction Act.

MUNICIPAL BORROWING BY-LAW
ORDINARY EXPENDITURE—ONTARIO

BY-LAW No. 294

TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO MEET CURRENT
ORDINARY EXPENDITURE FOR THE YEAR.

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of
the Village of Sutton to borrow the
sum of Forty Five Hundred dollars to meet the current
ordinary expenditure of the Corporation for the year until the taxes are paid.

AND WHEREAS the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and
outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized
to be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under
Section 319 of Chapter 192 of the Revised Statutes of Ontario.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED as a By-law by the said Council as follows:

1. That the Head and the Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from The Bank of Nova Scotia on the note of the Corporation, or by way of overdraft, or otherwise, the sum of Forty Five Hundred dollars (\$ 4500⁰⁰) until such time as the taxes levied, or to be levied, shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.
2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and the Treasurer and the Bank.
3. That the Head and the Treasurer may draw, make and deliver promissory notes, bills or other securities and documents as may be agreed on, to secure the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-law.
4. That the Head and the Treasurer may enter into an agreement with the said Bank, sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and the Treasurer, providing for the borrowing of the said sum by the said Corporation, and the repayment of the same on or before the last business day of the current year, together with all other terms relating to such borrowing and repayment as the said Head and Treasurer may deem necessary.

By Law No. 295.

To issue Debentures to the amount of Thirty-Five Hundred Dollars (\$3500) for the purpose of purchasing Fire Fighting appliances for the Corporation of the Village of Sutton.

Whereas the Municipal Council of the village of Sutton deems it advisable to procure Fire Fighting appliance for the use of the said village and to borrow for the said purpose upon the credit of the Municipality the sum of Thirty-five Hundred Dollars. (3500) and whereas to raise the said sum, the Council deems it advisable to extend payment for the same over a period of ten years by the issue of Debentures bearing interest at the rate of six per cent (6%) per annum extending over a period of ten years as aforesaid.

And whereas the amount of the whole rateable property (liable to taxation for such purpose) according to the last revised assessment roll being for the year 1922 is the sum of Four Hundred and Sixty-nine Thousand Dollars (\$469,000) and whereas the Debenture Debt of the said village of Sutton is Four Hundred and Sixteen Dollars and Thirty-four cents (\$416.34) of which no part principal or interest is in arrears.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton as follows:—

(1) That the Reeve is hereby authorized and required to issue Debentures of the said Corporation to the amount of Thirty-five Hundred Dollars (\$3500) which shall be marked and known as "Fire Fighting Appliances" and shall be in sums of not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100) each and shall be sealed with the Corporate Seal and signed by the Reeve and Treasurer thereof and shall be payable within ten years from the date herein after named for this By-Law to come into effect at the Bank of Nova Scotia in the said Village of Sutton with interest at six per cent per annum as follows, that is to say the said principal sum in Ten Annual installments of Three Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$350) and the interest at the rate aforesaid annually on the unpaid principal sum during the said term.

(2) For the purpose of paying the said sum of Three Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$350) and to cover interest on the said amount as aforesaid a special rate over and above all other rates to be collected in the same manner and at the same time shall be levied as other taxes are levied and collected upon the whole rateable property of the said village liable to be rated therefore in each year for the period of ten years from the date herein after mentioned for this By-Law to take effect.

(3) This By-Law shall come into force and take effect of the first day of December, A. D., 1922.

A By Law to forbid the erection of wooden buildings in certain Areas in the Village of Sutton

Be it enacted

- 1 That the erection of wooden buildings or of wooden additions or alterations to those already erected be prohibited within the Areas defined in Section 2 of this By Law
- 2 That the portions of the Village of Sutton affected by this By Law shall be as follows
 Block 73 the whole Block
 Lot 6 in Block 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ acre in N.W. Corner
 Lots 6, 7, 8 & 9 in Block 7
 Block 9 the whole Block
 Lots 1, 2, 3, 4 & 5 in Block 10
 Lot 1 in Block 11
 Lots 3, 4, 5 & 9 in Block 8
- 3 That no building, alteration or additions shall be begun until a permit be obtained from the Inspector appointed by for this purpose and the plans for the same submitted to him
- 4 That any building or erection constructed altered or repaired or placed in contravention of the By-Law shall be pulled down or removed at the expense of the owner
