UPON THE APPLICATION of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton, for an Order annexing to the said Village of Sutton the land described in the Petition of A.D. Saunders and others to the Ontario Railway and Municipal Board, and the Board having appointed Wednesday, the Second day of April, 1924, for the hearing of such application, and public notice of such Appointment having been duly given as directed by the Board, and the said application having been heard on the second day of April, 1924, by the Vice-Chairman of the Board duly authorized thereto under section 9, Chapter 186, R.S.O., in the Presence of Counsel for the Corporation of the Village of Sutton and for the Township of North Gwillimbury, and A.B. Saunders and S. Sellers two of the owners of the lands proposed to be annexed, and the Board having considered the application and the plan, showing the lands to be annexed, and having heard read the said petition and the resolution of the Council of the Village of Sutton in support of same, and the notice of such Petition and resolution given by the said Council to the Council of the Corporation of the Township of North Gwillimbury, and the other material filed, and upon hearing what was alleged by Counsel aforesaid and the owners of the lands described in said Petition, and upon consideration of the Vice-Chairman's Report on such Hearing duly adopted as the Order of the Board, THE BOARD ORDERS AND PROCLAIMS that the lands and premises in the Township of North Gwillimbury in the County of York mentioned in said petition and being described as

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises, being composed of Part of Lot No. 19 in the 9th. concession of the Township of North Gwillimbury, and tract being more particularly described as follows:

COMMENCING at the intersection of the existing boundary between lots numbers 18 and 19 in the said Concession, with the northerly limit of the Lakeshore Road, being the present southerly limit of the westerly part of the Village of Sutton: Thence SOUTHERLY along the said limit between lots numbers 18 and 19, six hundred and twenty-seven feet (627ft.) more or less to the northerly limit of the lands of the Hydro Electric Railway Commission (formerly the lands of the Toronto and York Radial Railway Company) THENCE EASTERLY along the last mentioned northerly limit Thirteen hundred and sixty-five feet (1365 ft.) more or less, to the limit between lots numbers 19 and 20 in the said Concession, being to a present limit of the said Village of Sutton; THENCE Northerly along the last mentioned limit, Four hundred and fifty-four feet (454ft.) more or less, to the northerly limit of the Lakeshore Road aforesaid; THENCE WESTERLY and following the last mentioned limit, being along the first mentioned present limit of the Village of Sutton to the point of commencement, be and the same are hereby annexed to the Village of Sutton, subject to the following terms and conditions, namely:

1. THAT the said annexation shall take effect from and after the First day of January A.D. 1924
2. THAT from and after the First day of January 1924, the said lands may be assessed in the usual way as part of the said Village of Sutton.

BY-Law No. 307

A By-Law for Licensing Transient Traders.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of The Corporation of the Village of Sutton

1 That Transient Traders as defined by Subsections 6.37 of Section 420 Chapter 122, 12-13 Geo.V 1922 shall be required to procure a License from the Treasurer of this Corporation before offering goods, wares or merchandise for sale in said Village.

2 That the fee payable for such License shall be \$100⁰⁰

3 That anyone contravening the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to a fine of not less than \$25⁰⁰ more than \$50⁰⁰ to be recovered and enforced under The Ontario Summary Conviction Act,.

4 That all By-Laws or parts of By-Laws inconsistent with this By-Law be and the same are hereby repealed.

A By-Law to provide for levying County, School, Debenture and General Village Rates for the Village of Sutton for the year 1924.
 BE IT ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Village of SUTTON

1. ~~THAT~~ That the following rates be levied and collected upon all the rateable property within the Village of Sutton for the year 1924 for the purposes hereinafter set forth.
2. For County General Purposes a rate of Mills in the Dollar.
3. For Village General Purposes a rate of Mills in the Dollar.
4. For Fire Appliance Debenture a rate of Mills in the Dollar.
a Public Library Rate a rate of 2/10 Mills in the Dollar
5. For Hydro-Electric Debentures a rate of Mills in the Dollar.
6. For School Purposes a rate of Mills in the Dollar.
- b 7. That an additional charge of five per cent shall be added to and
8. collected on all taxes imposed by this By-Law which shall not have been paid to the Collector of said Village of Sutton before the day of December 1924.
9. That the rates imposed by this By-Law shall be paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation in Bankable Funds on or before the day December 1924 by the Collector in so far as the law will enable him so to do.
