- 5 That G. W. Calverwell be appointed Building Inspector.
- 6 That S. A. MacKenzie be appointed Constable Sanitary Inspector & General Village man.
- 7 That O. G. Silver & W<sup>m</sup> Coomer be appointed Pound Keepers.
- 8 That Amos Drillard & Stephen Sellers and be appointed Fence Viewers.
- 9 That R. J. Sedore be appointed Member of B. of H.
- 10 That each officer shall receive for the due performance of his Office as follows

CONSTRUCTION BY-LAW NO 315

By-law to authorize the construction of a pavement on Main Street, Sutton from the Black River Bridge south easterly to <sup>50</sup> feet beyond Middle Street in the Village of Sutton, as a local improvement under the provisions of the Local Improvement Act.

Whereas *M. E. Hamelton* and others have petitioned the Council to construct as a local improvement the work hereinafter described and the Clerk has certified that the petition is sufficient and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the petition in the manner hereinafter described.

THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton enacts as follows:-

1. That a Warrenite-bitulithic pavement be constructed 12 feet wide together with curb, gutter and storm drain on Main Street, Sutton from the Black River Bridge south easterly to <sup>50</sup> feet beyond Middle Street as a local improvement under the provisions of the Local Improvement Act.
2. That the Engineer of the Corporation do forthwith make such plans, profiles and specifications and furnish such information as may be necessary for the making of a contract for the execution of the work.
3. The work shall be carried on and executed under the superintendence and according to the directions and orders of such Engineer.
4. The Reeve and Clerk are authorized to cause a contract for the construction of the work to be made and entered into with some person or persons, firm or corporation, subject to the approval of this Council to be declared by resolution.

5. The Treasurer may (subject to the approval of the Council) agree with any bank or person for temporary advances of money to meet the cost of the work pending the completion of it.

6. The special assessment shall be paid by twenty annual instalments.

7. The debentures to be issued shall bear interest at  $5\frac{1}{2}\%$  per annum and paid within twenty years on the instalment plan, and in settling the sum to be raised annually to pay the debt the rate of interest on investments shall not be estimated at more than four per cent per annum.

8. Any person whose lot is specially assessed may commute for a payment in cash the special rates imposed thereon, by paying the portion of the cost of construction assessed upon such lot, without the interest, forthwith after the Special Assessment Roll has been certified by the Clerk, and at any time thereafter by the payment of such sum as when invested at four per cent per annum will provide an annuity sufficient to pay the special rates for the unexpired portion of the term as they fall due.
