DEBENTURE BY-LAW

BY-LAW NO. . . . 322.

By-law to provide for borrowing \$10,800.00 upon debentures to pay for the construction of a bitulithic pavement on High Street from the Black River to 50 feet East of the East Street Line of Middle Street.

Whereas, pursuant to Construction By-law No ³¹⁵ passed on the ^{14th} day of ^{May} 1925 a bitulithic pavement has been constructed on High Street from the Black River to 50 feet East of the East Street Line of Middle Street as a local improvement under the provisions of The Local Improvement Act.

^{# 4320.00} AND WHEREAS the total cost of the work is \$10,800.00 of which ~~\$3600.00~~ is the Corporation's portion of the cost, and ~~\$7200.00~~ is the owners' portion of the cost, for which a Special Assessment Roll has been duly made and certified.

AND WHEREAS the estimated lifetime of the work is Twenty-five years.

AND WHEREAS it is necessary to borrow the said sum of \$10,800.00 on the credit of the Corporation and to issue debentures therefor bearing interest at the rate of 5½ per cent, per annum, which is the amount of the debt intended to be created by this by-law;

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make the principal of the said debt repayable in yearly sums during the period of Twenty years, of such amounts respectively that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in any year shall be equal as nearly as may be to the amount so payable for principal and interest in each of the other years;

AND WHEREAS it will be necessary to raise annually the sum of \$903.74 during the period of Twenty years to pay the said yearly sums of principal and interest as they become due, of which ~~\$301.25~~ is required to pay the Corporation's portion of the cost and the interest thereon, and ~~\$602.49~~ is required to pay the owners' portion of the cost and the interest thereon.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole rateable property of the Municipality, according to the last revised assessment roll is \$569,736.88

AND WHEREAS the amount of the existing debenture debt of the Corporation (exclusive of local improvement debts, secured by special rates or assessments) is \$26,000.00 and no part of the principal or interest is in arrear.

Below is the principal and interest payable every year for 20 years to retire the street paving debenture of \$10,000.00 By-Law number 322 calls for \$10,800.00 but \$10,000.00 only were sold so that the payments recited in by-Law 322 for \$10,800.00 *and* not the payments which the Village meets each year, as they are figured as on \$10,800.00

the Village of Sutton enacts as follows:-

1. That for the purpose aforesaid there shall be borrowed on the credit of the Corporation at large the sum of Ten Thousand and Eight Hundred Dollars (\$10,800.00) and debentures shall be issued therefor in sums of not less than \$100 each, bearing interest at the rate of 5½ per cent, per annum, and having coupons attached thereto for the payment of the interest.

2. The debentures shall all bear the same date and shall be issued within two years after the day on which this By-law is passed, and may bear any date within such two years, and shall be payable in twenty annual instalments during the twenty years next after the time when the same are issued, and the respective amounts of principal and interest payable in each of such years shall be as follows:-

3. The debentures as to both principal and interest may be expressed in Canadian currency or in Sterling money of Great Britain, at the rate of one pound sterling for each four dollars and eighty-six and two-thirds cents, and may be payable at any place or places in Canada or Great Britain.

4. The Reeve of the Corporation shall sign and issue the debentures and interest coupons, and the same shall also be signed by the Treasurer of the Corporation, and the debentures shall be sealed with the seal of the Corporation.

5. During ^{Twenty} years, the currency of the debentures, the sum of \$903.74 shall be raised annually for the payment of the debt and interest as follows:-

The sum of ~~\$501.25~~ ^{# 361.50} shall be raised annually for the payment of the Corporation's portion of the cost and the interest thereon, and shall be levied and raised annually by a special rate sufficient therefor, over and above all other rates, on all the rateable property in the municipality, at the same time and in the same manner as other rates.

For the payment of the owners' portion of the cost and the interest thereon, the special assessment set forth in the said special Assessment Roll is hereby imposed upon the lands liable therefor as therein set forth; which said special assessment with a sum sufficient to cover interest thereon at the rate aforesaid shall be payable in twenty equal annual instalments of ~~\$602.49~~ ^{572.72} each and for that purpose an equal annual special rate of ~~3 1/2~~ ^{3 1/2} cents per foot frontage is hereby imposed upon each lot entered in the said special Assessment Roll, according to the assessed frontage thereof, over and above all other rates and taxes, which said special rate shall be collected annually by the collector of taxes for the Corporation, at the same time and in the same manner as other rates.

6. The debentures may contain any clause providing for the registration thereof, authorized by any statute relating to Municipal debentures in force at the time of the issue thereof.

7. The amount of the loan authorized by this by-law may be consolidated with the amount of any loans authorized by other local improvement by-laws, by including the same with such other loans in a consolidating by-law authorizing the borrowing of the aggregate thereof as one loan, and the issue of debentures for such loan in one consecutive issue, pursuant to the provisions of the statute in that behalf.

8. This by-law shall take effect on the day of the final passing thereof.
