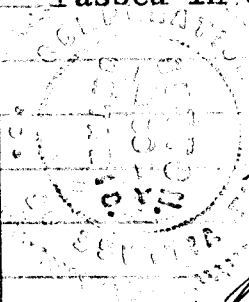

ORDINARY EXPENDITURE—ONTARIO

BY-LAW No. 349

TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO MEET CURRENT
ORDINARY EXPENDITURE FOR THE YEAR.

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of
the Village of Sutton to borrow the
sum of Eight Thousand dollars to meet the current
ordinary expenditure of the Corporation and the sums required to be raised in the
current year for High and Public School purposes until the taxes are collected.

AND WHEREAS the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and
outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized
to be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under
Section 319 of ~~Chapter 192 of the Revised Statutes of Ontario~~ the Consolidated Muni-
cipal Act, 1922, being 12-13 George V., Chapter 72 (Ontario) and Amending Acts.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED as a By-law by the said Council as follows:

- 1. That the Head and the Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from The Bank of Nova Scotia on the note of the Corporation, or by way of overdraft, or otherwise, the sum of Eight Thousand dollars (\$ 8000.00) until such time as the taxes levied, or to be levied, shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.
- 2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and the Treasurer and the Bank.
- 3. That the Head and the Treasurer may draw, make and deliver promissory notes, bills or other securities and documents as may be agreed on, to secure the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-law.
- 4. That the Head and the Treasurer may enter into an agreement with the said Bank, sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and the Treasurer, providing for the borrowing of the said sum by the said Corporation, and the repayment of the same on or before the last business day of the current year, together with all other terms relating to such borrowing and repayment as the said Head and Treasurer may deem necessary.

Being a By-Law to authorize the borrowing of Forty seven thousand dollars for the purposes of ^{Continuation School for} Union School Section Number 1 Sutton and Georgina, pending the issue of debentures.

Whereas the Board of Trustees of Union School Section No.1 has requested this Council to issue debentures of the Corporation for Forty seven thousand dollars for the purchasing of a school site, building a school thereon, the purchase of furniture, furnishings, school apparatus and other equipment for such school, and this Council has consented to issue such debentures.

and Whereas it is expedient to borrow the said sum of Forty seven thousand dollars from the Bank of Nova Scotia, pending the issue of debentures for the purpose aforesaid.

Now therefore be it and it is hereby enacted

1. That the Reeve and Treasurer are hereby Authorized and required to borrow from the Bank of Nova Scotia the sum of Forty seven thousand dollars at such a rate of interest and repayable at such time as may be agreed upon between the Reeve and Treasurer and the said Bank, pending the issue of such debentures, and to give the said promissory note or notes of the Corporation under its seal to the said Bank for securing said amount of Forty seven thousand dollars.

2. The Reeve and Treasurer are hereby authorized upon obtaining such loan to pay such proportion thereof to the Trustees of the said School Section as may by the Treasurer be deemed expedient.

A By-Law to provide for borrowing Forty seven thousand dollars (\$47000.00) upon debentures to pay for the purchase of a School site, building a School thereon known as Union School Section Number 1 Sutton and Georgina Continuation School. The purchase of furniture furnishings school apparatus and other equipment for said school.

Whereas the total cost of the site and building fully completed and furnished is (\$47,000.00) Forty seven thousand dollars of which the County of York guarantee one half the cost.

and Whereas it is necessary to borrow the said sum of Forty seven thousand (\$47,000.00) on the credit of the Corporation and to issue debentures therefor bearing interest at the rate of 5% per annum which is the amount of the debt intended to be created by this By-Law.

and Whereas it is expedient to make the principal of the said debt repayable in yearly sums during the period of Thirty years, of such amounts respectively that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in any year shall be equal as nearly as may be, to the amount so payable for principal and interest in each of the other years.

AND WHEREAS it will be necessary to raise annually the sum of \$3057.35 during the period of Thirty years to pay the said yearly sums of principal and interest as they become due of which \$1528.67 is required to pay the Corporation's portion of the cost and the interest thereon, and \$1528.68 is required to pay the County of York's portion of the cost and interest thereon.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole rateable property of the Municipality according to the last revised assessment roll being for the year 1929, is \$616,160.55

AND WHEREAS the amount of the existing debenture debt of the Corporation is \$38,349.66 of which no part of the principal or interest is in arrear.

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton enacts as follows:-

1. That for the purpose aforesaid there shall be borrowed on the credit of the Corporation at large the sum of (\$47,000.00)

Forty seven thousand dollars, and debentures shall be issued therefor in sums of not less than *Five hundred dollars* each bearing interest at the rate of five percent per annum and having coupons attached thereto for the payment of the interest.

2. The debentures shall all bear the same date and shall be issued within 2 years after the day on which this By-Law is passed, and may bear any date within such 2 years, and shall be payable in thirty years next after the time when the same are issued and the respective amounts of principal and interest payable in each of such years shall be as follows:-

3. The Reeve of the Corporation shall sign and issue the debentures and interest coupons, and the same shall also be signed by the Treasurer of the Corporation and the debentures shall be sealed with the seal of the Corporation. The debentures shall be payable at the Bank of Nova Scotia Sutton.

4. During thirty years the currency of the Debentures the sum of Three thousand and fifty seven dollars and thirty five cents (\$3057.35) shall be raised annually for the payment of the debt and interest as follows:-

The sum of \$1528.67 shall be raised annually for the payment of the Corporation's portion of the cost and the interest thereon and shall be levied and raised annually by a special rate sufficient therefor over and above all other rates on all the rateable property in the Municipality at the same time and in the same manner as other rates.

The sum of \$1528.68 shall be raised annually for the payment of the County of York's portion of the cost and interest thereon in the usual manner by the County of York

5. The debentures may contain any clause providing for the registration thereof authorized by any statute relating to Municipal Debentures in force at the time of issue thereof.

6. This By-Law shall take effect on the day of the final passing thereof.
