MUNICIPAL BORROWING BY-LAW  
FOR ORDINARY EXPENDITURE—ONTARIO }

BY-LAW No. 412

TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO MEET CURRENT  
EXPENDITURES FOR THE YEAR

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of  
the Village of Dutton to borrow an  
amount not at any time to exceed the sum of Ten thousand dollars  
to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Corporation  
for the year, including the amounts for sinking fund, principal and interest falling due  
within the year upon the debts of the Corporation, school purposes, special rates pur-  
poses and for meeting the requirements of any Board, Commission or body and other  
purposes for which the Corporation is required by law to provide.

AND WHEREAS the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and  
outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to  
be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Section  
334 of the Municipal Act, Chapter 233, Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1927 as amended  
by the Municipal Amendment Act, ~~1932 (22 George V, Chapter 29, Section 12.)~~ 1933

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED as a By-law by the said Council as follows:

1. That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from The Bank of Nova Scotia an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of Ten thousand dollars until such time as the taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.
2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and Treasurer and the said Bank.
3. That as security for the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-law the Head and Treasurer are hereby authorized to give to the said Bank the promissory notes, and/or other forms of agreement of the Corporation signed by the Head and Treasurer and sealed with the seal of the Corporation as may be required by the said Bank.
4. That the Head and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement or agreements with the said Bank sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and Treasurer providing for the borrowing of the sum hereby authorized and the repayment thereof on or before the last business day of the current year and containing such other terms relating to such borrowing, repayment and the charge hereby created as may be required by the said Bank.

A By-Law to license all Public Halls and all places of  
amusement, and for revoking any license granted.

Whereas pursuant to Chapter 233 section 429 Paragraph 2 of the  
Revised Statutes of Ontario 1927 and amendments thereto power is  
given to this Municipality to regulate and License Public Halls  
and all places of amusement.

THEREFORE be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village  
of Sutton as follows:

1. Said Municipality is hereby empowered to regulate and to license  
all Dance Halls erected or operating within the limits ~~of the~~  
of, the said Municipality.
2. Before any Dance Hall shall commence operations or shall continue  
to operate it shall apply to said Municipality for a license  
permitting it to do so.
3. The fee for said license shall be the sum of \$2.00 which fee  
shall be paid before said license shall be granted and until  
said license is granted, said Dance Hall shall not commence operations  
or shall not continue to operate.
4. That it shall be unlawful for any Dance Hall to operate at  
any time excepting between the hour of seven P.M. and the hour  
of midnight following thereafter, unless permission in writing  
is first obtained from said Municipality or its duly authorized  
Officer or Officers.
5. That it shall be unlawful for any band, orchestra, or any member  
or members thereof to play or practise upon any musical instrument  
on or about the premises of said Dance Hall excepting between the  
hours of eleven and twelve oclock in the forenoon of any day,  
without permission in writing first being obtained from said  
Municipality or its duly authorized Officer or Officers.
6. Any license granted under this By-Law may be revoked or  
cancelled by said Municipality at any time for any reason or  
cause whatsoever.
7. Any person who contravenes the provisions of this By-Law shall  
be forthwith liable to a fine not exceeding ~~to~~ \$50.00  
recoverable under the Summary Convictions Act of Ontario.
8. That all By-Laws ~~and~~ parts of By-Laws inconsistent with this  
By-Law be and are hereby repealed.
