MUNICIPAL BORROWING BY-LAW
FOR ORDINARY EXPENDITURE—ONTARIO }

BY-LAW No. 421

TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO MEET CURRENT
EXPENDITURES FOR THE YEAR

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of
the Village of Antler to borrow an
amount not at any time to exceed the sum of \$10,000

dollars
to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Corporation
for the year, including the amounts for sinking fund, principal and interest falling due
within the year upon the debts of the Corporation, school purposes, special rates pur-
poses and for meeting the requirements of any Board, Commission or body and other
purposes for which the Corporation is required by law to provide.

AND WHEREAS the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and
outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to
be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Section
334 of the Municipal Act, Chapter 233, Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1927 as amended
by the Municipal Amendment Act, ~~1932 (22 George V, Chapter 49, Section 12.)~~
1933.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED as a By-law by the said Council as follows:

1. That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized
to borrow from The Bank of Nova Scotia an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of
\$10,000 dollars
until such time as the taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.
2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time
as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and
Treasurer and the said Bank.
3. That as security for the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-law the
Head and Treasurer are hereby authorized to give to the said Bank the promissory notes, and/or
other forms of agreement of the Corporation signed by the Head and Treasurer and sealed with the
seal of the Corporation as may be required by the said Bank.
4. That all the revenues of the said Corporation of whatsoever nature and kind be and the
same are hereby charged to and in favour of the said Bank for and with the payment of any sum
borrowed under this By-law and the interest thereon as hereinbefore provided.
5. That the Head and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement
or agreements with the said Bank sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Cor-
poration by the Head and Treasurer providing for the borrowing of the sum hereby authorized and
the repayment thereof on or before the last business day of the current year and containing such
other terms relating to such borrowing, repayment and the charge hereby created as may be required
by the said Bank.

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By Law Number 422

A By-Law to provide for the levying and collecting of County, School, Debenture, and General Rates, for the Village of Sutton for the year 1935.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton, that the following rates be levied, and Collected as hereafter setforth upon all the rateable property within the limits of the said Corporation for the year 1935.

1. County Rate	8.3	mills in the dollar
School Rate	10.7	mills in the dollar
Fire Appliance	1.8	mills in the dollar
Public Library	.4	mills in the dollar
St. Paving	.5	mills in the dollar
St. Lights	3.1	mills in the dollar
General Rates	5.2	mills in the dollar
Relief	1.0	" " " "

Poll Tax 31.0 dollars

2. That the rates imposed by this By-Law shall be paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation in Bankable funds from time to time during Collection and as may be required by the Corporation. The whole amount collected by the collector shall have been paid over to the Treasurer on or before December 16th. 1935.

3. The tax collector is hereby authorized to receive taxes in two equal installments.

4. The tax Collector is hereby authorized in the event of receiving one or both installments on or before August 15th. 1935 to give to the taxpayer a discount of 4% on the amount so paid, on or before August 15th. 1935.

The discount shall apply to the installment paid on or before August 15th. 1935, and shall not be allowed on any installment not paid by Aug. 15th. 1935.

Taxes not paid by August 15th. 1935 but paid by December 10th. /35 shall be collected at the face amount of the Tax bill.

5. A Penalty of 4% shall be added to all taxes remaining unpaid after December 10th. 1935.

By-Law Number 423

A By-Law to prohibit the parking of automobiles or vehicles of any kind in certain places on High Street in the Village of Sutton.

Whereas it is deemed expedient to prohibit the parking of automobiles or other vehicles on that part of High Street in the Village of Sutton as hereafter named.

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton enacts as follows:

- 1. That it shall be unlawful for any automobile or other vehicle to park on the West Side of High Street between Middle St. and West Street. *(1A) That it shall be unlawful for any Automobile or other Vehicle to Park on the North side of River St. from High St East to the Rear of the Town Hall.*
- 2. That it shall be unlawful for any automobile or other Vehicle to park on the West side of High Street at that part of High Street directly East ~~South~~ ^{North} of the Burrows store to the cement bridge, *and on the East side of High St directly North of Town Hall to the cement bridge.*
- 3. Any person or persons contravening the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding \$10.00 recoverable under the summary Convictions Act of Ontario.

Whereas it is deemed expedient by the Village of Sutton to provide for the Nomination and Election of a Reeve four Councillors one member of the Sutton Hydro Electric Power Commission, and three members of the Sutton School Board.

Be it therefore enacted by the Corporation of the Village of Sutton as follows:

1. That the Town Hall be provided as a place for the holding of the Nomination, and the Council Chamber be provided for the holding of the Election.
2. That the Nomination be held between the hours of 7.30^{PM} and 8.30^{PM} on Monday December 30th. 1935.
3. That the Polling place for the Voters whose names begin with the letter A. up to and including the letter L be held in the Council Chamber and that *H Kaiser* be appointed Deputy Returning Officer and that *R Glater* be appointed Poll Clerk.
4. That the Polling place for the Voters whose names begin with letter M up to and including the letter Z be held in the Council Chamber and that *P.S. Whitney* be appointed Deputy Returning Officer and that ~~*Sam Osborne*~~ *Carl McLaughlin* be appointed Poll Clerk.
5. That *Robert McHenry* be appointed Constable.
6. That each officer shall receive for the due performance of his duty as follows:
