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MUNICIPAL BORROWING BY-LAW
FOR ORDINARY EXPENDITURE—ONTARIO }

BY-LAW No. 434

TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO MEET CURRENT EXPENDITURES FOR THE YEAR

J.E.B.

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton to borrow an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of \$10,000.00

dollars to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Corporation for the year, including the amounts for sinking fund, principal and interest falling due within the year upon the debts of the Corporation, school purposes, special rates purposes and for meeting the requirements of any Board, Commission or body and other purposes for which the Corporation is required by law to provide.

AND WHEREAS the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Section 334 of the Municipal Act, Chapter 233, Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1927 as amended by the Municipal Amendment Act, 1932 (22 George V. Chapter 29, Section 12.)

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED as a By-law by the said Council as follows:

1. That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from The Bank of Nova Scotia an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of \$10,000.00 dollars until such time as the taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.

2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and Treasurer and the said Bank.

3. That as security for the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-law the Head and Treasurer are hereby authorized to give to the said Bank the promissory notes, and/or other forms of agreement of the Corporation signed by the Head and Treasurer and sealed with the seal of the Corporation as may be required by the said Bank.

4. That all the revenues of the said Corporation of whatsoever nature and kind be and the same are hereby charged to and in favour of the said Bank for and with the payment of any sum borrowed under this By-law and the interest thereon as hereinbefore provided.

That the Head and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement or agreements with the said Bank sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and Treasurer providing for the borrowing of the sum hereby authorized and the repayment thereof on or before the last business day of the current year and containing such other terms relating to such borrowing, repayment and the charge hereby created as may be required by the said Bank.

BY-LAW NO. 436

79B Entitled "A By-Law to provide for the Corporation's consent to the Bell Telephone Company of Canada constructing its lines upon the highways, streets, bridges and other public places of the Corporation, and to authorize the *Reeve* to supervise and approve the construction of such lines".

79B WHEREAS the Bell Telephone Company of Canada is empowered by its Special Act of Incorporation, 43 Victoria, Chapter 67 (Dom.) to construct, erect and maintain its line or lines of telephone along the sides of and across or under any public highways, streets, bridges, water-courses, or other such places, or across or under any navigable waters either wholly in Canada or dividing Canada from any other country, subject to the terms therein set forth; and

79B WHEREAS sub-section 2 of Section 373 of the Railway Act, R.S.C. 1927, Chapter 170, provides that no telephone line within the legislative authority of the Parliament of Canada shall, except as therein provided, be constructed upon, along or across any highway, square or public place without the legal consent of the municipality having jurisdiction over such highway, square or public place; and

WHEREAS the Bell Telephone Company of Canada has carried on its business in the *Village of Sutton* for a number of years and has established its lines of telephone upon the public highways, streets, bridges and other public places with the said *Village of Sutton* and continues to do so, and will from time to time hereafter require to construct additional lines upon the public highways, streets, bridges, and other such places within the said *Village of Sutton* for the purpose of its business.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Corporation of the *Village of Sutton* as a By-Law thereof as follows:--

CORPORATION BY THE WAY TO BEARING FOR THE CORPORATION'S CONSENT

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1. That pursuant to the provisions of Section 373 (2) of the Railway Act R.S.C.1927, Chapter 170, the said Corporation hereby consents to the construction of the Bell Telephone Company of Canada of all lines of telephone and telephone plant heretofore constructed upon, along, across or under the highways, squares, bridges and public places within the said *Village of Sutton* over which the said Corporation has jurisdiction in the location and in the manner in which same have been constructed.

2. That pursuant to the provisions of Section 373 (2) of the Railway Act, R.S.C.1927, Chapter 170, the said Corporation hereby consents to the construction by the Bell Telephone Company of Canada from time to time hereafter of all such line or lines of telephone as it requires for the purpose of its business upon, along, across or under any or all of the highways, squares, bridges or public places within the said *Village of Sutton* under the jurisdiction of the Corporation; provided, however, that the construction of all such lines and plant by the Bell Telephone Company of Canada shall be done in accordance with the said Company's standards of construction from time to time in force and effect; and provided further that the location of all such telephone lines and plant hereafter constructed, or of existing lines which may hereafter be replaced, and the opening up of streets, squares, bridges or other such public places for the erection of poles or the carrying of wires underground, shall be subject to the supervision of the *Reeve* of the Corporation from time to time being, whose written approval of locations of lines and whose certificates as to supervision shall be valid and binding upon the Corporation.

3. Upon obtaining the consent of the abutting landowners, the Company may, with the approval and under the supervision of the said *Reeve*, trim all trees growing or standing upon the highways of the Corporation so as to keep its lines and wires free from interference therewith.

4. In the event of the Reeve or other properly qualified body or person deeming it necessary to request the Company to move, alter or re-arrange its line or lines of telephone and/or other plant for the purpose of widening, improving or re-locating a highway of the Corporation, or for any other purpose, the Reeve may give to the said Company an order to do such work as he deems necessary; and he may enter into an agreement with the said Company for the apportionment of the cost of the said work between the Corporation and the Company, and any such agreement entered into by the said Reeve shall be valid and fully binding upon the said Corporation, provided that the share of the cost to be borne by the Corporation under the terms of the said agreement shall not exceed the sum of \$200.00.

5. The Clerk of the said Corporation is hereby authorized and directed to certify from time to time under the Seal of the Corporation to the Bell Telephone Company of Canada the appointment and the name of the Corporation's Reeve authorized to act under this By-Law.

By-Law Number 437

A By-Law to provide for the levying and collecting of County School, Debenture, and General Rates for the Village of Sutton for the year 1937.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton, that the following rates be levied and collected, as hereafter set forth upon all the rateable property within the limits of the said Corporation for the year 1937.

- 1. County Rate 7.6 Mills in the dollar.
- School Rate 10.5 Mills in the dollar
- Fire Appliance 1.8 Mills in the dollar
- Public Library .3 Mills in the dollar
- St. Paving .5 Mills in the dollar
- St. Lights 3.2 Mills in the dollar
- Relief 1.4 Mills in the dollar
- General Rates 6.7 Mills in the dollar

2. That the rates imposed by this By-Law shall be paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation in Bankable funds from time to time, during the collection, and as may be required by the Corporation. The WHOLE amount collected by the Collector shall have been paid over to the Treasurer, by the collector, on or before December 15th. 1937.

3. The Tax Collector is hereby authorized to receive taxes in two equal installments.

4. The Tax collector is hereby authorized in the event of receiving one or both installments on or before August 16th. 1937, to give to the taxpayer a discount of 2% on the amount so paid on or before August 16th. 1937.

The discount shall apply to the installment paid on or before August 16th. 1937 and shall not be allowed on any installment not paid by August 16th. 1937.

Taxes not paid by August 16th. 1937, but paid by December 10th 1937 shall be collected at the face amount of the tax bill.

5. A Penalty of 4% shall be added to all taxes remaining unpaid after December 10th 1937.
