MUNICIPAL BORROWING BY-LAW  
FOR ORDINARY EXPENDITURE—ONTARIO }

BY-LAW No. 443

TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO MEET CURRENT  
EXPENDITURES FOR THE YEAR

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of  
the Village of Sutton to borrow an  
amount not at any time to exceed the sum of 10 000<sup>00</sup>

ten thousand dollars  
to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Corporation  
for the year, including the amounts for sinking fund, principal and interest falling due  
within the year upon the debts of the Corporation, school purposes, special rates pur-  
poses and for meeting the requirements of any Board, Commission or body and other  
purposes for which the Corporation is required by law to provide.

AND WHEREAS the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and  
outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to  
be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Section  
334 of the Municipal Act, Chapter 233, Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1927 as amended  
by the Municipal Amendment Act, 1933.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED as a By-law by the said Council as follows:

- 1. That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from The Bank of Nova Scotia an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of \_\_\_\_\_ dollars until such time as the taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.
- 2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and Treasurer and the said Bank.
- 3. That as security for the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-law the Head and Treasurer are hereby authorized to give to the said Bank the promissory notes, and/or other forms of agreement of the Corporation signed by the Head and Treasurer and sealed with the seal of the Corporation as may be required by the said Bank.
- 4. That all the revenues of the said Corporation of whatsoever nature and kind be and the same are hereby charged to and in favour of the said Bank for and with the payment of any sum borrowed under this By-law and the interest thereon as hereinbefore provided.
- 5. That the Head and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement or agreements with the said Bank sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and Treasurer providing for the borrowing of the sum hereby authorized and the repayment thereof on or before the last business day of the current year and containing such other terms relating to such borrowing, repayment and the charge hereby created as may be required by the said Bank.

H.E.B. A by Law to regulate and License Vending Machines in the Municipality of the Village of Sutton.

H.E.B. Whereas under section 439 Chapter 266 of the Revised Statutes of Ontario 1937 Municipalities are authorized to regulate and License places of amusement.

H.E.B. Therefore be it hereby enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Sutton as follows:

H.E.B. 1. That it shall be unlawful for any persons or persons to operate without or cause to be operated any vending Machine ~~with~~ first having obtained a license so to do.

H.E.B. 2. That the fee for <sup>the</sup> aforesaid License shall be \$ 500.<sup>00</sup> ~~per each~~ Machine ~~so operated or installed in any premises.~~

H.E.B. 3. That any person contravening the provisions of this By-Law shall be dealt with under the summary Convictions Act of Ontario.

## By-Law Number 445

A By-Law to provide for the levying and collecting of County, School, Debenture, and General Rates for the Village of Sutton for the year 1938.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton, that the following rates be levied and collected, as hereafter set forth upon all the rateable property within the limits of the said Corporation for the year 1938.

2. That the rates imposed by this By-Law shall be paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation in Bankable funds from time to time, during the collection, and as may be required by the Corporation. The whole amount collected by the collector shall have been paid over to the Treasurer, by the collector on or before December 15th. 1938.

3. The tax Collector is hereby authorized to receive taxes in two equal installments.

4. The Tax Collector is hereby authorized in the event of receiving one or both installments on or before Aug. 16th. 1938, to give to the Tax Payer a discount of 25% on the amount so paid on or before August 16th. 1938.

The discount shall apply to the installment paid on or before August 16th. 1938 and shall Not be allowed on any installment not paid before August 16th. 1938

Taxes not paid by August 16th. 1938, but paid by December 10th. /38 shall be collected at the face amount of the tax bill.

5. A Penalty of 4% shall be added to all taxes remaining unpaid after December 10th. 1938.

## By-Law Number 446

A By-Law to amend By-Law Number 445 imposing a tax rate of 32 mills for the year 1938.

Whereas an Act has been passed known as the Municipal Subsidy Act 1937,

and Whereas under the Municipal Subsidy Act 1937 (which Act is to be carried out in 1938) Municipalities are entitled to receive from the Provincial Government one Mill subsidy on the General Rate.

By-Law Number 447

A By -Law to prohibit vehicles of any kind running on certain streets with lugs on wheels.

Whereas it is deemed expedient to prohibit vehicles such as tractors and threshing machines to run on certain tar and grit streets in the Municipality of the Village of Sutton.

Therefore be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton as follows:

That it shall be unlawful for any tractor Threshing Machine or Vehicle of any kind <sup>equipped with lugs on wheels</sup> to pass over or run upon the streets as hereinafter named:

River Street            That part of Lorne St. from Lake Shore Rd.  
North Street            to entrance to Public Park.

That part of Dalton St, sometimes known as Town Line, from Base Line Corner, to South to the C.N.R. crossing on the Road shown as "Road to Holland Landing".

That any person or persons contravening the provisions of this by-law will be dealt with according to the Summary Convictions Act of Ontario.
