MUNICIPAL BORROWING BY-LAW
FOR ORDINARY EXPENDITURE—ONTARIO }

BY-LAW No. 451

TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO MEET CURRENT
EXPENDITURES FOR THE YEAR

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of
the Village of Sutton to borrow an
amount not at any time to exceed the sum of Ten thousand-----

----- dollars
to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Corporation
for the year, including the amounts for sinking fund, principal and interest falling due
within the year upon the debts of the Corporation, school purposes, special rates pur-
poses and for meeting the requirements of any Board, Commission or body and other
purposes for which the Corporation is required by law to provide.

AND WHEREAS the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and
outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to
be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Section
334 of the Municipal Act, Chapter 233, Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1927 as amended
by the Municipal Amendment Act, 1933,

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED as a By-law by the said Council as follows:

1. That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from The Bank of Nova Scotia an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of Ten thousand ----- dollars until such time as the taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.
2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and Treasurer and the said Bank.
3. That as security for the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-law the Head and Treasurer are hereby authorized to give to the said Bank the promissory notes, and/or other forms of agreement of the Corporation signed by the Head and Treasurer and sealed with the seal of the Corporation as may be required by the said Bank.
4. That all the revenues of the said Corporation of whatsoever nature and kind be and the same are hereby charged to and in favour of the said Bank for and with the payment of any sum borrowed under this By-law and the interest thereon as hereinbefore provided.
5. That the Head and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement or agreements with the said Bank sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and Treasurer providing for the borrowing of the sum hereby authorized and the repayment thereof on or before the last business day of the current year and containing such other terms relating to such borrowing, repayment and the charge hereby created as may be required by the said Bank.

By-Law Number 5 452

A By-Law to provide for the levying and collecting, of County, School, Debenture, and General Rates for the Village of Sutton for the year 1939.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton, that the following rates be levied and Collected, as hereafter set forth upon all the rateable property within the limits of the said Corporation for the year 1939.

1. County Rate	4.5 Mills in the dollar
School rate	15.2 Mills in the dollar
St. Paving	.5 Mills in the dollar
Public Library	.4 Mills in the dollar
Fire Protection	1.0 Mills in the dollar
St. Lights	3.2 Mills in the dollar
Direct Relief	2.0 Mills in the dollar
General Rate	6.7 Mills in the dollar
	<u>33.5</u>

2. That the rates imposed by this By-Law shall be paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation in Bankable funds from time to time, during the collection, and as may be required by the Corporation.

The whole amount collected by the Collector shall have been paid over to the Treasurer, by the Collector on or before December 15th/39.

3. The tax Collector is hereby authorized to receive taxes in two equal installments.

4. The tax Collector is hereby authorized in the event of receiving one or both installments on or before August 16th. 1939 to give the Tax payer a discount of 2% on the amount so paid on or before August 16/39. The discount shall apply to the installment paid on or before August 16th. 1939, and shall NOT be allowed on any installment ~~paid~~ NOT paid before August 16th. 1939.

Taxes not paid by August 16th. 1939, but paid by December 15th. 1939 shall be collected at the face amount of the bill.

5. A penalty of 4% shall be added to all taxes remaining unpaid after December 15th. 1939. and also $\frac{1}{2}$ of 1 per cent per month after January 1st. 1940 until paid. This in addition to the aforesaid 4%.

By-Law 453

A By-Law to amend By-Law Number 452 imposing a tax rate of 33.5 Mills in the dollar upon all the rateable property of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton.

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Whereas an Act has been passed known as the Municipal Subsidy Act 1937,

AND Whereas under the Municipal Subsidy Act (and amendments thereto) Municipalities are entitled to receive from the Provincial Government One and a half mills subsidy on the General Rate.

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Therefore be it hereby enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton that By-Law Number 5 452 passed on the First Day of May 1939, be hereby amended by reducing the General Rate one and a half mills, and making the General Rate 5.2 Mills in the dollar instead of 6.7 Mills in the dollar as set forth under By-Law Number 5 452.

By/Law Number 454

WAS

A By-Law to prohibit the obstruction of any drain or water course, and for permitting and regulating the size and mode of construction of culverts and bridges which cross any drain or watercourse situate on a public Highway.

Whereas under Section 405 paragraph 61 of Chapter 266 R.S.O. Local Municipalities may pass by-laws to prohibit the obstruction of any drain or water course and to permit and regulate the size and mode of construction of culverts and bridges which cross any drain or watercourse, situate on a Public Highway, AND WHEREAS under section 514 paragraphs 4 and 5 chapter 266 R.S.O. By-Laws may be passed for prohibiting the throwing placing or depositing on any Highway or Bridge any dirt, filth, glass, handbills, paper, or other rubbish or refuse, or the carcass of any animal, and for prohibiting the obstruction of ditches or culverts upon Highways.

WAS

Therefore be it hereby enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Sutton as follows:

WAS

1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to obstruct any drain or watercourse, or to construct any bridge, culvert or approach, over any ditch or watercourse upon any Highway, without first obtaining permission from the Municipality so to do.

WAS

2. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to throw place or deposit on any Highway or bridge, any dirt, filth, glass, handbills, paper, or any rubbish or refuse or the carcass of any animal.

WAS

3. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to obstruct ditches or culverts upon any Highway or Highways.

4. That any person or persons contravening the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Fifty dollars, recoverable under the Summary Convictions Act of Ontario.
