ORDINARY EXPENDITURE—ONTARIO }

BY-LAW No. ~~456~~

TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO MEET CURRENT  
EXPENDITURES FOR THE YEAR

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of  
the Village of Sutton to borrow an  
amount not at any time to exceed the sum of

Ten thousand dollars

to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Corporation  
for the year, including the amounts for sinking fund, principal and interest falling due  
within the year upon the debts of the Corporation, school purposes, special rates pur-  
poses and for meeting the requirements of any Board, Commission or body and other  
purposes for which the Corporation is required by law to provide.

AND WHEREAS the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and  
outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to  
be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Section  
339 of the Municipal Act, Chapter 266, Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1937.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED as a By-law by the said Council as follows:

1. That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized  
to borrow from The Bank of Nova Scotia an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of  
Ten thousand dollars  
until such time as the taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.
2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time  
as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and  
Treasurer and the said Bank.
3. That as security for the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-law the  
Head and Treasurer are hereby authorized to give to the said Bank the promissory notes, and/or  
other forms of agreement of the Corporation, signed by the Head and Treasurer and sealed with the  
seal of the Corporation as may be required by the said Bank.
4. That all the revenues of the said Corporation of whatsoever nature and kind be and the  
same are hereby charged to and in favour of the said Bank for and with the payment of any sum  
borrowed under this By-law and the interest thereon as hereinbefore provided.
5. That the Head and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement  
or agreements with the said Bank sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Cor-  
poration by the Head and Treasurer providing for the borrowing of the sum hereby authorized and  
the repayment thereof on or before the last business day of the current year and containing such  
other terms relating to such borrowing, repayment and the charge hereby created as may be required  
by the said Bank.

A By-Law to enforce "Daylight Saving time"

WHEREAS a petition has been presented by business people and also by ratopayers other than business men, asking that this Municipality adopt Daylight Savings time ,

AND WHEREAS under Chapter 266 section 268 of the Municipal Act, power is given Councils to pass such a By-Law.

Therefore be it hereby enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Sutton as follows:

That commencing on the 2<sup>d</sup> day of June 1940 until the 28th. day of September 1940, this Municipality shall adopt "Daylight Saving time, and that all clocks shall be advanced one hour from June 1<sup>st</sup> 1940 until Sept. 28th. 1940, when the clocks shall be put back one hour.

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By-Law No. 460

A By-Law to provide for the levying and collecting, of County School, Debenture, and General Rates for the Village of Sutton for the year 1940.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton, that the following rates be levied and Collected, as hereafter set forth upon all the rateable property within the limits of the said Corporation for the year 1940.

2. That the rates imposed by this By-Law shall be paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation in Bankable funds from time to time, during the collection, by the Collector, and as may be required by the Corporation The whole amount collected by the Collector shall have been paid over to the Treasurer, by the Collector on or before December 15th./40

3. The Tax Collector is hereby authorized to receive taxes in two equal installments.

4. The Tax Collector is hereby authorized in the event of receiving one or both installments on or before August 17th. 1940 to give the Tax Payer a discount of 2% on the amount so paid on or before August 17th. 1940.

The discount shall apply to the installment paid on or before August 17/40 and shall NOT be allowed on any installment Not paid before August 17th./40.

Taxes not paid by August 17th. 1940, but paid by December 15/40 shall be collected at the face amount of the Tax bill.

5. A penalty of 1% shall be added to all taxes remaining unpaid after ~~Dec. 15th. 1940~~ and also a penalty of  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 1 percent per month after Januray 1st. 1941 until paid. This in addition to the afore said ~~penalty~~ ~~penalty~~ x

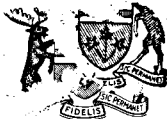

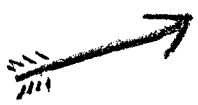

WHEREAS the right is now conferred on Municipalities to fix the closing hour of Hotels in the Municipality authorized by the Liquor Control Board of Ontario to sell Beer and Wine.

AND WHEREAS the Municipal Council of this Corporation of the Village of Sutton are convinced that it is in the best interest of the Municipality that Hotels selling beer and wine under authority of the Liquor Control Board of Ontario close at a time earlier than at present which is 12 midnight.

THEREFORE be it hereby enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton as follows:

That all Hotels in the Municipality authorized to sell Beer and Wine by the Liquor Control Board of Ontario shall close at 11.30 P.M. each night, from June 15th. to Sept. 15th (both ~~the~~ days inclusive) in each year, and that they shall ~~also~~ be closed at 10.30 P.M. each night during the rest of the year.

Whereas the right is now conferred on Municipalities to fix the closing hour of Hotels in the Municipality authorized by the Liquor Control Board of Ontario to sell Beer and Wine.

AND WHEREAS The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton are convinced that it is <sup>in</sup> the best interest of the Municipality that the Hotels selling beer and wine under authority of the Liquor Control Board of Ontario close at a time earlier than at present which is 12 midnight.

Therefore be it hereby enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton as follows:

That all Hotels in the Municipality authorized to sell Beer and Wine by the Liquor Control Board of Ontario shall close at 11:30 P.M. each night, with the exception of Saturday night

A By-Law to prohibit the parking of automobiles or vehicles of places any kind in certain places on High and River Sts. in the Village of Sutton.

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to prohibit the parking of automobiles and River St. or other vehicles on that part of High St. in the Village of Sutton as hereafter named:

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton enacts as follows:

NR

1. That it shall be unlawful for any automobile or other vehicle to park on the West Side of High St. between Middle St. and West St

NR

2. That it shall be unlawful for any Automobile or other vehicle to Park on the North Side of River St. from High St. East to the Rear of the Town Hall.

NR

3. That it shall be unlawful for any automobile or other vehicle to Park on the West Side of High St. at that part of High St. directly North of the Burrows store, to the cement bridge, and on the East Side of High Street directly North of the Town Hall to the Cement Bridge.

NR

4. That this By-Law shall not become effective until suitable signs have been erected in sufficient numbers to clearly indicate the Parking Restrictions.

5. Any person or persons contravening the provisions of this By/Law shall be liable to fine not exceeding \$10.00 recoverable under the summary Convictions Act of Ontario.

A By-Law to prohibit the parking of automobiles or vehicles of any kind on Simcoe Street in the Municipality of the Village of Sutton.

Whereas Simcoe Street in the Village of Sutton is an approach to a Fire Wharf, AND WHEREAS if Automobiles or any other Vehicles are allowed to park on this street serious damage to life and property might result,

AND WHEREAS prohibiting the parking of automobiles or other vehicles will not work any hardship on any of the Residents in the immediate vicinity, as all property fronting the street have ample parking space.

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton enacts as follows:

- 1. That it shall be unlawful for any automobile or any other vehicle to park on Simcoe St. in the said Village of Sutton.
  - 2. That this By-Law shall not become effective until suitable signs have been erected in sufficient quantities- numbers to clearly indicate the parking restrictions.
- Any person or persons contravening the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding \$10.00 recoverable under the summary convictions Act of Ontario.

- 2. That the Nomination be held between the hours of 8.30 and 9.30 P.M. on Monday Dec. 30th. 1940 Daylight Savings Time.
- 3. That the polling place for the Voters whose names begin with the letter A, up to and including the letter L. be held in the Council Chamber, and that be appointed Deputy Returning Officer, and that be appointed Poll Clerk.

4. That the Polling Place for the Voters whose names begin with the letter M. up to and including the letter Z. be held in the Council Chamber and that *S. S. Whitney* be appointed Deputy Returning Officer, and that *V. H. Sheppard* be appointed Poll Clerk.

5. That *H. A. MacKenzie* be appointed constable.  
*S.A. That the Polls shall be open from 9. A.M. until 6. P.M. S.T.*

6. That each officer shall receive for the due performance of his duty as follows:
