A By-Law to appoint Auditors for the Corporation of the Village of Sutton.

1 That *E. M. Pollock* and *J. E. Pollock* be and are hereby appointed Auditors for the Municipality of the Village of Sutton.

2. That the Auditors shall be governed by section 9 of the Municipal Act, and that the audit shall be made for the operations of the Municipality during the year 1940.

3. That each Auditor shall receive for the due performance of his duty the sum of \$ *30⁰⁰*

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MUNICIPAL BORROWING BY-LAW FOR
ORDINARY EXPENDITURE—ONTARIO }

Copy of **BY-LAW No. 467**

**TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO MEET CURRENT
EXPENDITURES FOR THE YEAR**

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of
the Village of Sutton to borrow an
amount not at any time to exceed the sum of

Ten thousand dollars

to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Corporation
for the year, including the amounts for sinking fund, principal and interest falling due
within the year upon the debts of the Corporation, school purposes, special rates pur-
poses and for meeting the requirements of any Board, Commission or body and other
purposes for which the Corporation is required by law to provide.

AND WHEREAS the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and
outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to
be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Section
339 of the Municipal Act, Chapter 266, Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1937.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED as a By-law by the said Council as follows:

1. That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized
to borrow from The Bank of Nova Scotia an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of
Ten Thousand dollars
until such time as the taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.

2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time
as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and
Treasurer and the said Bank.

3. That as security for the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-law the
Head and Treasurer are hereby authorized to give to the said Bank the promissory notes, and/or
other forms of agreement of the Corporation signed by the Head and Treasurer and sealed with the
seal of the Corporation as may be required by the said Bank.

4. That all the revenues of the said Corporation of whatsoever nature and kind be and the
same are hereby charged to and in favour of the said Bank for and with the payment of any sum
borrowed under this By-law and the interest thereon as hereinbefore provided.

5. That the Head and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement
or agreements with the said Bank sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Cor-
poration by the Head and Treasurer providing for the borrowing of the sum hereby authorized and
the repayment thereof on or before the last business day of the current year and containing such
other terms relating to such borrowing, repayment and the charge hereby created as may be required
by the said Bank.

A By-Law to appoint certain officers for the Corporation of the Village of Sutton for the year 1941.

Whereas it is deemed expedient to appoint certain officers for the year 1941, for the Corporation of the Village of Sutton.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton as follows:

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1. That *W J Han* be appointed Assessor.
2. That *C G Moffe* be appointed Medical Health Officer.
3. That *H W Tselou* be appointed Collector.
4. That *C J Syber* be appointed building Inspector.
5. That *J Brooks* and *Aura Sedore* be appointed fence viewers.
6. That *W Comer* and *Mrs J King* be appointed pound Keepers.
7. That *R J Sedore* be appointed Member of the Bd. of Health.
8. That *Mrs C J Pearson* be appointed Member of the Public Library Board.
9. That *W Burk* be appointed Weed Inspector.
10. That each Officer shall receive for the due performance of his duty as follows:

The Assessor \$ 126.00
 The Collector \$ 110.00
 The Medical Officer of Health \$ 150.00
 In addition to certain statutory fees.

11. That the Collector shall be bonded to the satisfaction of the Council in the sum of \$2000.00
12. That all By-Laws or parts of By-Laws inconsistent with this By-Law be and are hereby repealed.

By-Law No. 469

A By Law to provide for the levying and Collecting, of County School, debenture, and General Rates for the Village of Sutton for the year 1941.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton, that the following rates be levied and Collected as hereafter set forth upon all the rateable property within the limits of the said Corporation for the year 1941.

- 1. County rate 4-2 mills in the dollar
- Library .4 mills in the dollar
- St. Lights 3-3 mills in the dollar
- Fire Protection/ . mills in the dollar
- School Rate 14.7 mills in the dollar
- Direct Relief 1.5 Mills in the dollar
- St. Paving .5 mills in the dollar
- General rate 6.4 mills in the dollar

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2. That the rates imposed by this By-Law shall be paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation in Bankable funds from time to time during the collection, by the Collector, and as may be required by the Corporation.

The whole amount collected by the collector shall have been paid over to the Treasurer by the Collector, on or before December 15th. 1941.

3. The tax collector is hereby authorized to receive taxes in two equal installments.

4. The Tax Collector is hereby authorized in the event of receiving one or both installments on or before Aug. 18th. 1941 to give the Tax payer a discount of 2% on the amount so paid on or before Aug. 18th. 1941

The discount shall apply to the installment paid on or before August 18th. 1941 and shall NOT be allowed on any installment Not paid before Aug. 18th. /41

Taxes not paid by August 18th. /41, but paid by December 15th. 1941 shall be collected at the face amount of the bill Tax Bill.

5. A penalty of 1% shall be added to all taxes remaining unpaid after Dec. 15th. 1941. A penalty of 2% from Jany. 1st. until Feby. 1st. 1942, a penalty of 3% from Feby. 1st. 1942 until March 1st. 1942, and a penalty of 4% thereafter, also INTEREST at a rate of 1/2 of 1% per month after January 1st. 1942.

Note: The 1/2 of 1% interest is in addition to the aforementioned penalty.

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THE CORPORATION OF THE *Village* OF *Sutton Ont.*

BY-LAW NUMBER 470

Repeated

A BY-law to levy an occupancy tax.

The Council of the Corporation of the *Village* of *Sutton* pursuant to section 57a of The Assessment Act, R.S.O. 1937, chapter 272, and amendments thereto, ENACTS as follows:

1. In the year 1941 and every year thereafter every person who, after the rate for the current year on real property has been levied, commences to occupy,-
 - (a) premises which after such rate has been levied cease to be exempt from taxation, or
 - (b) a building which was erected after the return of the assessment roll,
 shall pay to the Corporation an occupancy tax upon the commencement of such occupancy.
2. The amount of the occupancy tax shall be computed by reference to the amount of the taxes, including those on business assessment, which such person would have been required to pay for the then current year in respect of such premises or building if he had been previously assessed and made liable therefor, and shall be the part of the amount of such taxes that is proportionate to the part of the current year then remaining.
3. The amount of the occupancy tax shall be entered on the collector's roll and collected in the same manner as taxes.
4. The collector shall deliver, mail or cause to be mailed to every such person a written or printed notice on which shall appear,-

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- (a) the amount of the occupancy tax payable by such person;
- (b) the method of computation of such amount;
- (c) a demand for payment of such amount; and
- (d) the last day for giving notice of appeal therefrom to the clerk.

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5. Every such notice of appeal shall be given to the clerk within fourteen days after the day upon which the tax notice is delivered by the collector or mailed as aforesaid.

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6. The clerk shall give notice, as in the case of assessment complaints, to every person from whom the clerk receives a notice of appeal as aforesaid and to the collector, of the time when the matter will be tried by the court of revision.

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7. This By-law shall come into force on the day of its passing.

A By-Law to provide for the Nomination and Election of a Reeve and four Councillors for the Village of Sutton for the year 1942 and for one member of the Sutton Hydro Electric Commission for 2 years, and also for three members of the Sutton School Board for 2 years.

Whereas it is deemed expedient by the Corporation of the Village of Sutton to provide for the Nomination and Election of a Reeve and four Councillors and for one member of the Sutton Hydro Electric Power Commission, and for three members of the Sutton School Board.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton as follows:

- 1. That the Town Hall be provided as a place for the holding of the Nomination, and that the Council Chamber be provided for the holding of the Election.
- 2. That the Nomination be held between the hours of 8.30 and 9.30 P.M. on Monday December 29th. 1941 Daylight Savings Time.
- 3. That the Polling place for the Voters whose names begin with the letter A. up to and including the letter L. be held in the Council Chamber and that *G.S. Whitney* be appointed Deputy Returning Officer and that *C. McLaughlin* be appointed Poll Clerk.
- 4. That the Polling place for the Voters whose names begin with the letter M. up to and including the letter Z. be held in the Council Chamber, and that *Aubrey Sedore* be appointed Deputy Returning Officer, and that *J. Critchfield* be appointed Poll Clerk.
- 5. That *Donald MacLennan* be appointed constable.
- 6. That the Polls shall be open from 9 A.M. until 6 P.M. Daylight Savings Time.
- 7. That each Officer shall receive for the due performance of his duty as follows:

Deputy Returning Officer	\$ 5 ⁰⁰	plus meal
Poll Clerk	\$ 4 ⁰⁰	plus meal
Constable	\$ 4 ⁰⁰	plus meal
- 8 That all By-Laws or parts of By-Laws inconsistent with this By-Law be and are hereby repealed.
