 4. That *O. J. Selver* be appointed Building Inspector.
 5. That *Aubrey Sedue* and *Wm Abbott* be appointed Fence Viewers.
 6. That *Wm Sellus* and *Bruce Glover* be appointed Pound Keepers.
 7. That *R. J. Sedue* be appointed Member of the Bd. of Health.
 8. That *Ja. Yalk* be appointed Member of the Public Library Board.
 9. That *Wm Burke* be appointed Weed Inspector.
 10. That each Officer shall receive for the due performance of his duty as follows:

The Assessor \$ 125⁰⁰
 The Collector \$ 125⁰⁰
 The Medical Officer of Health \$ 150⁰⁰
 In addition to certain statutory fees.

11. That the Collector shall be bonded to the satisfaction of the Council in the sum of \$2000.00

MUNICIPAL BORROWING BY-LAW FOR
ORDINARY EXPENDITURE—ONTARIO }

BY-LAW No. 479

TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO MEET CURRENT
EXPENDITURES FOR THE YEAR

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of
the Village of Stanton to borrow an
amount not at any time to exceed the sum of Ten Thousand
dollars
to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Corporation
for the year, including the amounts for sinking fund, principal and interest falling due
within the year upon the debts of the Corporation, school purposes, special rates pur-
poses and for meeting the requirements of any Board, Commission or body and other
purposes for which the Corporation is required by law to provide.

AND WHEREAS the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and
outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to
be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Section
339 of the Municipal Act, Chapter 266, Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1937.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED as a By-law by the said Council as follows:

- 1. That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized
to borrow from The Bank of Nova Scotia an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of
Ten Thousand dollars
until such time as the taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.
- 2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time
as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and
Treasurer and the said Bank.
- 3. That as security for the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-law the
Head and Treasurer are hereby authorized to give to the said Bank the promissory notes, and/or
other forms of agreement of the Corporation, signed by the Head and Treasurer and sealed with the
seal of the Corporation as may be required by the said Bank.
- 4. That all the revenues of the said Corporation of whatsoever nature and kind be and the
same are hereby charged to and in favour of the said Bank for and with the payment of any sum
borrowed under this By-law and interest thereon as hereinbefore provided.
- 5. That the Head and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement
or agreements with the said Bank sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Cor-
poration by the Head and Treasurer providing for the borrowing of the sum hereby authorized and
the repayment thereof on or before the last business day of the current year and containing such
other terms relating to such borrowing, repayment and the charge hereby created as may be required
by the said Bank.

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By-Law No. 480

A By-Law to provide for the levying and collecting of County, School, Debenture and General Rates for the Village of Sutton for the year 1943.

BE IT THEREFORE enacted by the Municipal Council of the Village of Sutton, that the following rates be levied and collected as hereafter set forth upon all the ratable property within the limits of the said Corporation for the year 1943.

1. County rate	3.3	mills in the dollar
Library rate	.4	mills in the dollar
St. Lights	2.9	mills in the dollar
Fire Protection	2.	mills in the dollar
School Rate	15.1	mills in the dollar
Direct Relief and Hospitalization	2.5	mills in the dollar
St. Paving	.5	mills in the dollar
General Rate	6.3	mills in the dollar

2. That the rates imposed by this By-Law shall be paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation in bankable funds from time to time during the collection, by the Collector, and as they may be required by the Corporation. The whole amount collected by the Collector shall have been paid over to the Treasurer by the Collector on or before Dec. 15th. /43

3. The Tax collector is hereby authorized to receive taxes in two equal installments.

4. The Tax collector is hereby authorized in the event of receiving one or both installment on or before August 17th. 1943 to give the tax payer a discount of 1% on the amount paid on or before Aug. 17th. /43. The discount shall apply to the installment paid on or before Aug. 17/43 and shall not be allowed on any installment not paid before Aug. 17/43. Taxes not paid by Aug. 17/43 but paid by Dec. 15/43 shall be collected at the face amount of the bill.

5. A penalty of 1% shall be added to all taxes remaining unpaid after Dec. 15th/43. A penalty of 2% from Jany. 1st./44 until Feb. 1st/44, A Penalty of 3% from Feb. 1/44 until March 1/44 and a penalty of 4% thereafter, ALSO INTEREST at a rate of 1/2 of 1% per month after January 1st/44. Note: The 1/2 of 1% interest is in addition to the aforementioned penalty.

A By-Law to provide for the Nomination and Election of a Reeve and four Councillors for the Village of Sutton for the year 1944, and for one Member of the Sutton Hydro Electric Commission for 2 years and for three Members of the Sutton School Board for 2 years.

Whereas it is deemed expedient by the Corporation of the Village of Sutton to provide for the Nomination and Election of a Reeve and four Councillors and ~~for one~~ Member of the Sutton Hydro Electric Power Commission, and for three Members of the Sutton School Board.

Be it therefore enacted by the Corporation of the Village of Sutton, as follows:

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1. That the Town Hall be provided as a place for the holding of the Nomination, and that the Council Chamber be provided for the holding of the Election.
2. That the Nomination be held between the hours of 7.30 and 8.30 P.M. on Monday December 27th. 1943 Daylight Saving Time.
3. That the Polling place for the Voters whose names begin with the letter A up to and including the letter L. be held in the Council Chamber, and that *G.S. Whitney* be appointed Deputy Returning Officer and that *Mrs. Picken* be appointed Poll Clerk.
4. That the Polling place for the Voters whose names begin with the letters M up to and including the letter Z. be held in the Council Chamber, and that *N. Sellers* be appointed Deputy Returning Officer, and that *Aubrey Sedore* be appointed Poll Clerk.
5. That ~~F. Chabert~~ *J. Brill* be appointed Constable.
6. That the Polls shall be open from 9.A.M. until 6 P.M. Daylight savings time.
7. That each officer shall receive for the due performance of his duty as follows:

Deputy Returning Officer	\$ 5.00	plus meal
Poll Clerk	\$ 4.00	do.
Constable	\$ 4.00	do.
8. That all By-Laws or parts of By-Laws inconsistent with this By-Law be and are hereby repealed.
