A BY-LAW to introduce Daylight Saving time in the Village of Sutton.

The Council of the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Sutton enacts as follows:-

THAT from April 28th to September 29th inclusive , this Municipality shall adopt Daylight Saving Time as its official time.

THAT at clocks shall be advanced one hour at midnight April 27th and shall continue so advanced until midnight September 29th, when all clocks shall be set back one hour.

All by-laws or parts of by-laws that conflict or are inconsistent with this by-law are hereby repealed.

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to amend By Law No. 500, a By Law to regulate and control the Construction of Buildings in the Village of Sutton.

THEREFORE the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Sutton enacts as follows:-

THAT section (1) of By Law 500 be amended by striking out the words "three hundred" in the second and third lines and substituting in lieu thereof the words "six hundred" and by striking out the figure "\$2000.00" in the fourth line and substituting in lieu thereof the figure "\$2500.00" so that the section shall now read as follows:

SECTION (1) "No building shall be erected within the limits of the said Corporation of less size than will cover an area of Six Hundred square feet and the total cost of which exclusive of the value of the land, is less than \$2500.00.

THAT SECTION (2) of By Law 500 be amended by striking out the figure "\$1000.00" in the third line and substituting in lieu thereof the figure "\$1500.00", so that the Section shall now read as follows:

SECTION (2) "Buildings erected and to be used exclusively as Summer homes shall be subject to the foregoing except that their total cost exclusive of the value of the land, shall not be less than \$1500.00.

THAT the said By Law be further amended by adding thereto SECTION (3) which shall read as follows:-

SECTION (3) "No building shall be erected on any lot having a frontage of less than Forty feet".

In the event the provisions of this By Law conflict or are inconsistent with the provisions of any other By Law, then this By Law shall prevail.

This By Law shall come into full force and effect on receiving the approval of THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD.

A By-Law to provide for the levying and collecting of County School Debenture and General Rates for the Village of Sutton for the year 1946

The Council of the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Sutton ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:-

THAT the rates hereinafter set forth be levied and collected upon all the rateable property within the limits of the said Corporation for the year aforesaid:-

(2) THAT the rates imposed under this By-law shall be paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation in Bankable funds.

(3) The Tax Collector is hereby authorized to receive taxes in equal instalments.

(4) The Tax Collector is hereby authorized in the event of receiving one or both instalments on or before August 16, 1946 to give the Tax Payer a discount of 1% on the amount paid.

(5) The discount shall apply to any instalment of instalments paid on or before August 16, 1946 and shall not be allowed on any instalment or instalments paid after that date.

(Taxes not paid on or before August 16, 1946 but paid on or before Dec. 15, 1946 shall be collected at the face amount of the Tax Bill)

(6) A penalty of 1% shall be added to all taxes remaining unpaid from Dec. 15th, 1946 to Dec. 31, 1946 and thereafter a penalty of 2% from Jan. 1, 1947 until Jan. 31, 1947; a penalty of 3% from Feb. 1, 1947 to Feb. 28, 1947 and thereafter from March 31, 1947 a penalty of 4%.

Also interest at the rate of 1/2 of 1% per month will be added after January 1, 1947. This interest being in addition to the aforementioned penalties.

45 Section 4 is hereby amended by adding thereto clause 4 (L) which shall read as follows:-

45 Every applicant who applies for a license to operate a taxi cab, jitney or coaches shall produce at the time of his application an insurance policy covering public liability, property damage and passenger hazard.

45 Section 4 (b) is amended by striking out the words "shall bear the name of the Medical Officer of Health and" in the first and second lines; so that the section shall now read as follows:- Section 4 (b) "Every license issued under this By-law shall be signed by the Clerk of the Village of Sutton".

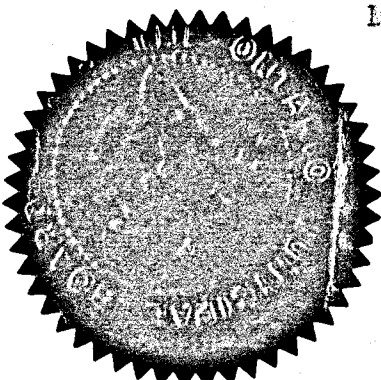

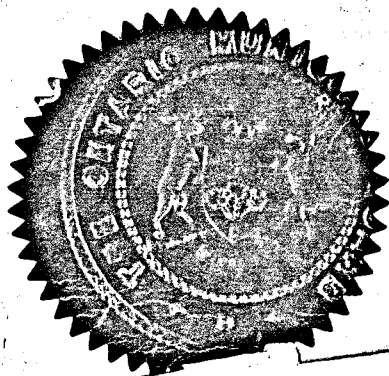

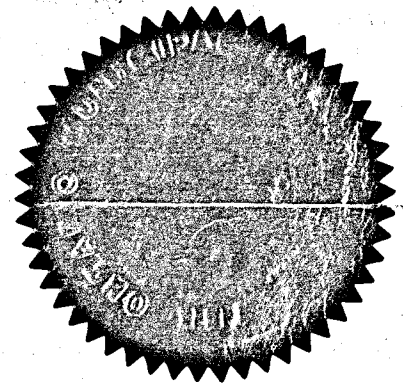

Whereas it is deemed desirable as a health measure and for fire protection to provide an adequate and suitably treated supply of water for the Village of Sutton;

And whereas by By-law Number .5.6. there was on August 24, 1946, submitted to the Electors qualified to vote on money by-laws the following question, namely, -- "Are you in favour of the construction of a Water Supply System to provide treated water and fire protection to Sutton and Jackson's Point at an estimated cost of \$190,000.00?";

And whereas the same carried by a majority vote of the Electors voting on the said question;

And whereas it is deemed advisable to proceed with the construction of such Water Supply System;

THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF SUTTON ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:-

1. That the construction of such Water Supply System be proceeded with in accordance with the preliminary report and estimates of *L.H.* Meadows, Critoph and Company, Professional Engineers, Toronto, Ontario, dated November 5th, 1945;
2. That Meadows, Critoph and Company be employed to make such plans and specifications and furnish such information and reports as may be necessary for the making of a contract or contracts for the construction and completion of such Water Supply System; *L.H.*

That, upon obtaining the approval of the Department of Health for Ontario as required by The Public Health Act and the approval of The Ontario Municipal Board as required by The Ontario Municipal Board Act, the construction of such Water Supply System shall be undertaken in such manner as this Council may, by resolution, determine;

4. That the construction and completion of such Water Supply System shall be carried on and executed under the full supervision and according to the directions and orders of Meadows, Critoph and Company.

BY-LAW No. 519

TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO MEET CURRENT EXPENDITURES FOR THE YEAR

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary by the Council of the Corporation of the VILLAGE of SUTTON to borrow an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of Ten thousand

dollars to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Corporation for the year, including the amounts for sinking fund, principal and interest falling due within the year upon the debts of the Corporation, school purposes, special rates purposes and for meeting the requirements of any Board, Commission or body and other purposes for which the Corporation is required by law to provide.

AND WHEREAS the amount heretofore borrowed by the Corporation and outstanding (if any) for the purposes aforesaid and the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed do not exceed the amount which may be lawfully borrowed under Section 339 of the Municipal Act, Chapter 266, Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1937.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED as a By-law by the said Council as follows:

1. That the Head and Treasurer of the said Corporation be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from The Bank of Nova Scotia an amount not at any time to exceed the sum of Ten thousand dollars until such time as the taxes levied or to be levied shall be collected and applied to repay such advance.

2. That the said sum may be borrowed in one amount or in such sums from time to time as may be found expedient and at such rate of interest as may be agreed on between the Head and Treasurer and the said Bank.

3. That as security for the sum or sums borrowed from time to time under this By-law the Head and Treasurer are hereby authorized to give to the said Bank the promissory notes, and/or other forms of agreement of the Corporation signed by the Head and Treasurer and sealed with the seal of the Corporation as may be required by the said Bank.

4. That all the revenues of the said Corporation of whatsoever nature and kind be and the same are hereby charged to and in favour of the said Bank for and with the payment of any sum borrowed under this By-law and the interest thereon as hereinbefore provided.

5. That the Head and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement or agreements with the said Bank sealed with the corporate seal and signed on behalf of the said Corporation by the Head and Treasurer providing for the borrowing of the sum hereby authorized and the repayment thereof on or before the last business day of the current year and containing such other terms relating to such borrowing, repayment and the charge hereby created as may be required by the said Bank.
