PLAN FOR MEDICAL SERVICES TO BE SUBMITTED TO MUNICIPAL COUNCILS

1. That the Municipal Councils in the area of York County north of the southern boundary of Whitchurch and King Townships be canvassed by a representative body of the medical profession and an effort made to arrange a more just and reasonable basis for payment by the respective municipalities for medical services to indigents.

The Plan was as follows:

- (a) Fifty per cent of regular ^{minimum} Ontario Medical Association tariff for work done in homes and offices, including fractures, obstetrics and anesthetics, and assistants when needed.
- (b) Twenty-five per cent of regular ^{minimum} Ontario Medical Association tariff for surgery and obstetrics done in hospitals, and assistants when necessary.
- (c) This to apply to all patients coming under the definition of indigent, as shown by their declared statement. ^{also}
- (d) All statements and applications for medical services must ^{certified in sec (D)} be signed by the Relief Officer or the Clerk of each municipality, as well as the applicant or patient.

Definition of "Indigency" for medical services

"All patients on relief, pensioners, mothers' allowance families, old age pensioners and those who have no assets and would ordinarily be considered a municipal responsibility for charity."
