 and British Columbia 28%.

Therefore be it, and it is hereby resolved that this Council respectfully urges the Honourable the Prime Minister of the Province of Ontario to give consideration to increasing the percentage of grants to Education to a basis commensurate with the standing of the Province of Ontario as the first Province in the Dominion, instead of the present scale it being the second lowest as of effecting educational grants, and that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Mr. M. Baker M. L. A. and that the Corporate seal be attached to this resolution.
