The Council left the matter to Mr. Burrows to interview H. Cameron about the amount of wages H. Cameron expected, for this duty.

A letter from Lucas + Lawson re case of Francis vs. Village of Sutton was received.

The Reeve stated that he was going to interview Messrs Lucas + Lawson when in Toronto.

The Council discussed the advisability of obtaining a lot on which to construct a water tank to be used for fire fighting purposes, in the west portion of the Village. Mr. Pugsley Reeve, and Mr. Robertson were appointed by the Council to arrange the matter.
