The Inaugural Meeting of the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Sutton was held on Monday, Jan'y 10th at 8 P.M.

The following gentlemen after subscribing to the necessary declaration of Office, took their seats:-

The Reeve made a brief inaugural address in which he stated that he was sure that the Council and himself would all get along well together. He further stated that if any of the Council had anything to say, that the Council Chamber was the place to bring it up. In that way it could be threshed out (he hoped) to every body's satisfaction. He touched on doing more to beautify the Parks, the sidewalks & Roads should have some repair. He spoke of Restaurant accomodation in the Village which despite of our hotels seemed to be lacking. He also said that the Board of Health & School Board would look into the Dental Clinic for Schools.

Mr. Jarrena the Secy. of Volunteer Fire Brigade read a letter from Mr. Park, in which Mr. Park resigned as Fire Chief and also as caretaker of fire equipment.

The Council discussed Mr. Park's successor of Fire fighting equipment caretaker, and Mr. L. Tomlinson's name was proposed. Mr. Jarrena offers to see if he could call Mr. Tomlinson into this meeting.

The Council discusses the proposed repairs to the Fire Hall.

Mr. E. M. Pollock was present with a drawing of the different levels of the Fire Hall, with regard to the street level.

The Council were of the opinion that a test hole should be sunk near the North West corner of the Fire Hall, in order to find out how a foundation if any could be put in.

Mr. Pugsley was going to see that a test hole be sunk.

The Council decided to let the matter go until the information regarding the foundation was obtained.

A letter was received from the Pres. of Volunteer Fire Brigade asking that the Council give written instructions to the Fire Chief to the effect that the Fire Equipment was to be used only for fighting fires or for Fire drill.

The Clerk was instructed to write the Fire Chief telling him that there was a resolution on the books at present, prohibiting the filling of cisterns, pumping out cellars, or using the Fire fighting equipment other than what it is intended to be used for.

A letter was received from Crozier & Crozier regarding the collection of taxes on a property, on which the taxes were returned unpaid.

Mr. Pugsley was going to take the matter up with the County Solicitor J. D. Lucas.

Mr. Pallack the Auditor presented his report for the 1943 Audit.

The Council went over the report very thoroughly with Mr. Pallack. Among other problems, were discussed the growing amount of unpaid taxes.

The Auditor reported that some properties in arrears of taxes, were so burdened that the property might not bring in the amount of taxes against it. He suggested that the Municipality should have a tax sale and clean up the properties over 3 years in arrears.

Mr. Pugsley - Mr. Sibbald being members of the County Council told of some of the activities which the County provides and which includes, Police, Roads, Education, Children Aid, Hospitalization, Old Mans Home, Mothers Allowance, Old Age Pension, Repatriation etc.

The members of the Council again discuss the cost of Electrical energy and how the high rate in this Municipality might work to the detriment of factories coming to locate here.

After some discussion it was

Whereas this Council is desirous of attracting, and inducing industries to locate in this Village,

and whereas industries are retarded from locating in this Municipality & other Rural Municipalities because of the High Cost of Electric Power, as compared by the cost of Electric Power in other Districts.

Be it therefore resolved by this Municipality that a resolution be sent to the Ontario Hydro Electric Power Commission, asking that the cost of Electric Power in the Rural Municipalities be so equalized as to compare with the cost of Electric Power in the larger centres, in order that every Rural Municipality shall be given the same opportunity to attract industry, in the same way as those municipalities who now enjoy much lower Electric Power costs, and also that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Hon. Geo. Drew Prime Minister of Ont.

The applications (which the Village had advertised in the local press for 1 month) for position of Tax collector & Treasurer were now opened.

There was one application only ^{thing} from the present tax collector D. W. Trelow for the positions at a salary of \$400.00 per annum.

That D. W. Trelow be appointed Tax Collector & Treasurer for the Municipality at a salary to include both positions of \$400.00 per annum.

That this Council urge the Provincial Government to maintain the present system involving the Toronto & York Roads Commission, as it is felt that the share Toronto contributes to the maintenance of the roads operated by the Commission is only fair, having regard to the benefits Toronto receives from the good roads leading to that City, and to the further fact that these roads are largely used by Toronto citizens and by business firms in Toronto to secure business in the surrounding territory.

Members all present

The Council discussed the Vacancy which had occurred in the Board of Health, and its By-Law appointing Dr. C. J. Noble Medical Officer of Health for the Corporation was read the first time. The Council appointed the Council a Committee as a whole Mr. Culverwell in the Chair.

The By-Law was read a second and third time and was finally declared carried & numbered 488.

The Council discussed the proposed renovations to the Fire Hall.

Mr. Culverwell asked if any plans had been drawn up for the same.

Mr. Scott stated that he was in favor of building a new Fire Hall.

Mr. Pugsley stated that at the present time our Fire Hall was adequate for our needs with a little repair.

Mr. Robertson stated that the present time was an expensive time to build, and that the present Hall was only used to house the trucks; also that it would serve ^{our} needs, and that after the war, when materials were more plentiful and less expensive would be the logical time to build.

He also said that after the war when ex-service men would be in need of employment and municipalities were ^{now} urged ~~to~~ to lay plans for post war construction, should be the proper time to do this work.

Mr. Culverwell stated that he would like the Council to have a price on raising the Hall and putting in a cement floor & repairing it generally.

Mr. Burrows suggested a cement floor 8 inches thick so that the Hall would not heave.

After some discussion it was moved by Mr. Robertson seconded by Mr. Culverwell

That a price be obtained to repair the Fire Hall as follows:-

Raise Hall 2 feet above present wall

Put - new 10 inch wall inside present wall 30" below present ground level.

Tile on well to reach surface of floor.

Fill floor 2 feet with stone and cement reinforced and 8 inch floor.

Repairs doors & front.
