The Council discussed night Constable situation and decided that Mr. Burke could be better able to look after the various duties of the Village in the day time, and therefore the Council decided to advertising for applications for position of night Constable.

The Council also discussed the salary of Mr. Burke and it was moved by Mr. Mitchell

seconded by Mr. Scott

That Mr. Burke be paid a salary of \$25.00 per week, retroactive from January 1/45, also that he be given 2 weeks holidays with pay.

The Assessor was present and reported
that he had not searched the property as yet
at the Registry Office, but he had a letter

Mr. Scott stated that a motion had been passed, authorizing the search on Dec. 4th last, & now it was Feb 5/45 & wondered why Mr. Kay had not made the search of the property.

The assessor stated that he would go down to Newmarket forthwith.

The Council discussed the Saturday night dances put on in the Town Hall by Aris Leitch.

Mr. Burke the Chief of Police was present and reported that the dance was of a rough character. He further stated that he had to prevent fights, and that there was damage being done to Municipal property, also that he had found EMPTY beer bottles in the Hall.

After some discussion, it was moved by Mr. Scott

That acting on reports from the Chief of Police, Mr. Leitch be notified that the Municipality have decided not to rent the Town Hall to him for Saturday evening dances carried.

Mr. Pugsley brought up a matter re one of J. Honeyson's twins.

He stated that the Dentist at the head of the Mothers Allowance Board had advised him (Mr. Pugsley) that it would cost \$600.00 to fix the child's jaw. & the Dentist had further stated that if the Village would pay an amount \$100.00 the work would go on.

as to their desirability & character, and also to ascertaining the Selective Service would have to pass the applicants, as appointees.

Three applications for position of Village Clerk were received & read.

That J. Crozier be appointed Clerk & Relief Officer for the Municipality at a salary of \$500.00 per annum effective as of Feb. 1 - 1945.

Feb. 16, 1945

A special meeting of the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Sutton was held in the Council Chambers Feb. 16, 1945.

There were present Reeve Pugsley and Councillors Culverwell, Mitchell, Scott and Taylor.

The meeting was called by the Reeve to clear up certain misunderstandings and controversies that had arisen as a result of a motion passed by Council at its Feb. 5th meeting, denying Mr. Paul Leach the right to rent the Town Hall for dances. The motion had been passed on the report of the Chief of Police as to the conduct at the dances.

Mr. Joseph Holburn appeared on behalf of the young people and was heard.

It was pointed out to Mr. Holburn by the Council the said motion affected Mr. Leach only and that anyone else was permitted to rent the Hall at any time on payment of the required fee.

A petition signed by a number residents was tabled requesting that dances be permitted "for the benefit of the young people and the Field Comforts Club." The petition was discussed. Mr. Scott pointed out that no attempt had been made to stop the young people from having dances on any other person with the exception of Mr. Leach and it was.

Moved by Mr. Scott.
Seconded by Mr. Taylor.

That the petition be received and filed.

Carried.

The Council then discussed the feasibility of allowing Mr. Leach to resume conducting the dances.

The Chief of Police Mr. Burke gave his report and pointed out that the dances were of a rough character. That there had been drinking, fighting and property damage.

Mr. Leach was then called on and maintained that the dances had been conducted in an orderly manner but did admit that there had been drinking and some property damage for which he had paid.

Mr. Woberly Math appearing on behalf of Mr. Leach was then heard. He reported the conduct in the hall orderly that he never saw any of the fights referred to by Mr. Burke but admitted there had been some drinking although in his opinion there were no signs of intoxication.

Mrs. Taylor and Mitchell inquired of Mr. Leach if he had gotten permission from the Field Comfort Club to use their name.

Mr. Leach replied in the negative. He then stated that the Field Comfort Club had always accepted 25% of the receipts.

Mr. Culmenwell reported that he had received a phone call from Mrs. L. Lemlin President of the Field Comfort Club to the effect that although the Field Comfort Club did not wish to become involved in any controversy, it would be quite willing to accept a percentage of the receipts if the dances were allowed to continue.

Mr. Mitchell then raised the question as to whether the Town Hall was in a fit state of repair to warrant holding public functions in it and the lack of proper escape facilities in the event of a fire.

After discussion it was moved by
Mrs. Scott.

Seconded by Mr. Culverwell.

That the clerk confer with the Fire Chief as to the general safety of the Hall as a fire hazard and if necessary have the proper alterations made and to contact firm to ascertain if a fire escape can be purchased and its estimated cost.

Carried.

Mr. Mitchell then suggested that Mr. Leach be given another chance.

It was moved by.

Mr. Culverwell.

Seconded by Mr. Scott.

That Mr. Fred Seitch be given permission to carry on dances in the Hall - Saturday nights as before, provided they are conducted in a proper manner.

Carried.

The Council suggested that the Clerk be in charge of the renting of the Town Hall.

On motion Council adjourned.

The matter of the assessment of Parcels 7 Lots 36-37, Plan 99 Sutton was discussed. The Assessor Mr. Kay and the Treasurer Mr. Sedore were present. The Council instructed them to get

together and reach a decision on the matter.

The Council discussed ^{the} matter of paying Mr. N. Robertson a fee of \$5.00 per month for performing the duties of Rating Administrator. The matter was finally dropped.

Mr. Millen, Village Auditor, presented his audit. The Council suggested that the audit be left over until the April meeting and at that time the Auditor could present his report which was not yet prepared in full.

The Council discussed the allocation of fines imposed under the Highway Traffic Act and other acts for offences committed within the limits of the Municipality. Mr. Pugsley volunteered to inquire from the County Solicitor as to their proper distribution.

A. By Law to appoint a clerk was read for the first time.

The Council appointed the Council a Committee as a whole with Mr. Mitchell in the Chair. The By Law was given its second and third reading and was declared carried as No. 497.

The Council discussed the matter of the appointment of a night Constable. Letters from Mr. J. Welsh, Mr. V. P. Carpenter, Mr. A. Macmillan and Mr. F. Claye were received and read. The Chief of Police Mr. Burke presented his report as to the character of the respective applicants. After much discussion

It was moved by Mr. Mitchell
seconded by Mr. Ford.

That the matter of appointing a night Constable

involves too great an expenditure to warrant such an appointment, and that the applicants for the position be advised accordingly.

Carried.

A By law to regulate and control the construction of buildings in Municipality was received and read and was approved by all members present except Mr. Mitchell, who wished further time to investigate the matter before coming to a decision. The matter was left over until Mr. Mitchell had an opportunity to conduct his investigation.

The Council discussed the appointment of a Building Inspector and Mr. Scott volunteered to interview some of the builders with a view to getting one of them to act.

The Council discussed the purchase of some office equipment for the clerk and treasurer.

It was moved by

Mr. Scott.

Seconded by Mr. Mitchell.

That the clerk be authorized to purchase a filing cabinet for himself and the treasurer.

Carried.

The Council discussed an order of Business to be followed at future meetings.

A Special meeting of the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Sutton was held in the Council Chambers on Wednesday March 14th 1945.

Present: Reeve Purplesy, Councillors Taylor, Scott and Culverwell.

A By Law to appoint a Medical Officer of Health was read for the first time.

The Reeve appointed the Council a Committee as a whole with Mr. Taylor in the Chair. The By Law was given its second and third readings and was declared carried as no. 499.

A By Law to appoint a Building Inspector was read for the first time.

The Reeve appointed the Council a Committee as a whole with Mr. Culverwell in the Chair. The By Law was given its second and third readings and was declared carried as no. 498.

The Council decided a fee of £2.00 be charged by the Building Inspector for each permit issued by him.

The clerk was instructed to advise Mr. C. T. Noble of the termination of his duties as M. O. H. and to enclose a cheque in payment of his salary to date.

A By Law to Regulate and Control the Construction of Buildings in the Village of Sutton was given its first Reading.

The Reeve appointed the Council a Committee as a whole with Mr. Taylor in the Chair. The By Law

was given its second and third readings and declared carried as No. 500.

The Council discussed the arrangement regarding sending fire equipment to fight fires in the neighbouring municipalities of Georgia and North Guilford.

It was moved by Mr. Leach.

Seconded by Mr. Culverwell.

That the Clerk be instructed to write the Clerk of the Townships of Georgia and North Guilford as to what steps they have taken to comply with suggestion put forward to them re fire protection at a meeting held on _____ day of October 1945 as Council desires an immediate answer.

Council then met with the Ministers of the Churches represented by Mr. Pritchard, Rev. Powell and Rev. Sherry. Representatives of the Red Cross and the Field Comforts Club with a view to making plans for a form of service at the termination of hostilities in Europe.

Mr. Pritchard and Rev. Powell presented a suggested form of service compiled by the Canadian Council of Churches for such occasions.

The meeting discussed the appointment of a committee to take charge of arrangements.

It was moved by Mrs. Larrens.

Seconded by Mr. Pritchard.

That the President of the Red Cross and the President of the Field Comforts Club be members of the committee with power to add one additional member from each organization.

Carried.

It was moved by Mr. Pugsley.

Seconded by Mr. Scott.

That Mr. Culverwell represent the Council on the Committee.

Carried.

It was moved by Mr. Scott.

Seconded by Mr. Pugsley.

That Mr. Leary be asked to serve on the Committee as a representative of the Board of Education.

Carried.

It was moved by Mr. Culverwell.

Seconded by Mrs. Tomlinson.

That the ministers namely Rev. Powell, Rev. Shertz, Mr. Pritchard, Father Troney and the Minister of the Presbyterian Church be members of the Committee.

Carried.

Seconded by Mr. Pugsley.

That Mr. Torrens represent the business men on the Committee.

Carried.

April 2, 1945

A meeting of the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Sutton was held in the Council Chambers on Monday April 2nd, 1945

Present: Rev. Pugsley. Councillors:- Scott, Taylor, Mitchell and Culverwell.

Minutes of two previous special meetings read and confirmed.

The Rev. reported on the distribution of fines in Highway traffic cases and explained that when the information was laid by a County Constable the fines went to the County and when made by a Provincial officer they went to the Province. The Municipality shared in the fines only when the information was laid by the local Police officer.

The Council instructed Constable Burke to patrol Shelton St. with a view to apprehending persons exceeding the speed limit.

Mr. C. Brooks visited Council and was heard. He expressed the desire to build a drain along Market end north side in the Village of Sutton opposite Lot 1, Block 2, Plan 69 Sutton and also wished to ascertain what proportion of the cost the Municipality would bear.

After discussion

It was moved by Mr. Culverwell.

Seconded by Mr. Scott.

That the Council pay Mr. C. Brooks \$30⁰⁰/₁₀₀ for fill on ditch, on north end Market St. 12" tile to be used on Market St. and 10" tile to be

used on North St. The works to be under the supervision of the Chief of Police.

The Reeve presented a ^{motion} passed by the Council of the neighbouring Municipality of the Township of North Guilford containing a proposal regarding pay for the use of fire equipment. The copy was dated April 2nd, 1945 and reads as follows:-

That the Council of the Village of Sutton be advised that in the opinion of this Council the amount asked as a retainer for their fire protection service is too high.

This Council submits for their consideration the following proposition.

That the Village of Sutton be paid the sum of \$22.00 per annum as a retainer.

For use of the heavy pumper when called \$40.00 for the first hour and \$10.00 for each ensuing hour.

For use of the Chemical equipment in fighting a fire \$25.00.

When the brigade are called and no fire is fought the payment to be \$25.00.

Reeve. Pass a McMillan

Council unanimously adopted this proposal and instructed the Clerk to write the Council of North Guilford to send the retainer forthwith.

A letter from the Fire Chief Mr. J. Tomlinson was read describing the disgraceful condition of the street in front of the Fire Hall.

The Clerk was instructed to hand the letter to
The Chief of Police.

The Council discussed getting estimates from an engineer on the costs of a water system for the municipality.

MAY 3RD. 1945

A meeting of the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Sutton was held in the Council Chambers on Thursday the 3rd day of May 1945

Present: - Reene Pugsley, Councillors Culverwell, Taylor, Scott.

Minutes of the last meeting read and approved.

The question of animals running at large was discussed at some length. It appeared that a horse and cow owned by Mr. J. Cain were habitual offenders. Council instructed Mr. Burke, Chief of Police to advise Mr. J. Cain to keep his animals confined or penalties of being prosecuted.

Correspondence was read and was received and filed.

A letter from Mrs. H. Taylor was read stating that she did not wish to accept the appointment to the Library Board. After discussion it was decided that no appointment be made at the present time.

Council set the date for Court of Revision on Tuesday the 5th day of June next at the hour of 8.0 o'clock P.M. at the Council Chambers in the Town Hall, Sutton.
