The inaugural meeting of Council for the Municipal Corporation of the village of Sutton for the year 1946 was held in the Council Chamber on Monday Jan. 14. 1946.

All members present.

The Reeve opened the meeting with words of welcome to the new Council and then discussed business unfinished from the previous year e.g. water system, Community Hall. He then suggested some things that might be undertaken this year. mending of streets, building and repair to sidewalks and also employing of a school nurse in conjunction with the neighbouring Townships of Genoue and North Billingham.

Mr. C. Sheridan paid Council a visit regarding the collection of Garbage for 1946. Council discussed the matter at length and finally it was moved by C. W. Scott.

seconded by St. Teyler.

That garbage be collected, starting the first Monday in May 1946 and each Monday during the months of May, June, September and October and each Monday and Friday during the months of July and August at a cost of \$200.00 and that C. Sheridan be appointed Garbage Collector.

on a week the motion was lost.

It was then moved by C. W. Scott.

That tenders be called for the collection of Garbage in the Village of Sutton once a week during the months of May, June, September and October.

and twice a week during the months of July and August 1946.

The motion failed for want of a second.

It was then moved by
F. Culverwell.

That we pay Mr. C. Sheridan \$1,000.00 for Garbage Collection for May and June, July and August, and September and October once a week except July and August and extra for November if needed.

The motion was lost for want of a second.

The original motion of C. W. Keitt was again put and was carried.

Mr. A. B. Anderson visited Council and informed them that the Village carried no public liability or property damage insurance and due to the poor state of repair of roads and sidewalks in the Municipality suggested that the Village would be well advised to obtain coverage. He explained that a coverage for \$5/10 public liability and \$1,000.00 property damage could be had for an annual premium of \$200.00.

Council suggested that Mr. Anderson submit a draft policy outlining the risks covered at the February meeting.

Mr. Larny and Mr. Tuckie visited Council and requested that something should be done to supplement the Sutton Athletic Association as a youth training body in the Village. They pointed out that there were not enough men with sufficient time or skill to develop the youngsters and suggested that a Director of Recreation be

retained by the Council to direct your next activities.

Council suggested a committee be formed to investigate the matter. After discussion it was moved by F. Culverwell.

Seconded by W. Taylor.

That the Revere and Miss Hallam be Council representatives on a committee to be formed to formulate a working plan for youth direction in the Village of Sutton for submission to the Provincial Government and also that Mr. C. Charpentier, Mr. H. Torrens and Mr. J. B. Leary be members of the Committee with power to add and that on completion of the plan it be submitted to the Council.

Carried.

Mr. M. D. Luchter appealed on behalf of the Sutton Athletic Association for a grant and suggested that due to increased activity and expense, the annual grant be increased from \$100.00 to \$125.00.

That the Sutton Athletic Association be given a grant of One Hundred and Twenty Five Dollars.
