The Doctor also asked that the Grant to the Athletic Association be increased by \$50.00 so that a part time director could be hired to organize recreational activities amongst the children.

Mr. Burke, Police Constable, presented a brief from York County Police, and stated that he was the lowest paid Constable in York County and also at his present salary of \$25.00 per week, under inflated conditions, he was unable to obtain the necessaries of life.

Council discussed the brief and Mr. Burke's long term of faithful service and also the excellent service given by the Town man - Wm. Harris.

The Rates of North Gwillimbury and Georgina pointed out that they were not well enough acquainted with the wishes of the ratepayers in the suggested area to commit themselves on the question.

Whereas the Sutton Club has operated for several years as a beverage room under authority of the Liquor Control Act of Ontario. And whereas the said Club has

at no time possessed the qualifications of a standard hotel (having been converted from a dwelling house to a beverage room). And whereas the said club is situated in the residential section of the Village and the constant noise and commotion in connection therewith constitutes a nuisance to the residents in that area; Therefore the Council of this Municipality humbly petition the Liquor Control Board of Ontario to cancel the license for the sale of beer at this club. The Council makes this suggestion with the feeling that such a move would be in the best interests of the Village, as there will still be three licensed hotels and a brewer's warehouse to serve as outlets for beer in a Municipality with a normal population of between 8000 and 9000 people.
